SUBJECT: Instructions.

TO: All Units furnishing Information to USFIP, North Luzon.

1 Considerable difficulty has been encountered by this Section in making the best possible use of the intelligence reports sent in by the various units. Just enough inaccurate information has been found in most of the reports to make it impossible to rely completely on any reports. We have been unable to include many items of information because we had no way of knowing whether they were carefully observed and recorded information or just "Cochoero Talk". In order to eliminate this trouble, the following instructions are issued for the guidance of all concerned:

- A. The source of all items of information will be given, likewise the circumstances under which it was obtained. Do not give names. Make use of such phrases as: "One of our men observed" "One of our men talked to a native who said he saw (or heard)" "It is widely rumored that", "A houseboy of a Jap officer, told me that he saw (or heard)." Do not neglect to send in information just because it is rumor, but be sure to label it as such.
- B. State the date as of which the information is known to be true. What is true today is not always true tomorrow. Always give dates of troop movements, etc.
- C. Make information as complete as possible. Ask yourself what things Gen. MacArthur would like to know about an item, and include these in your report. There is no such thing as giving too much detail. Do not say there are many Japs in Barrio Fernando. We want to know how many Japs, what buildings do they occupy, what sort of arms they have, what transportation, what larger command are they a part of, is it a new garrison, do they send out patrols, where to, what is their purpose and lastly where is Barrio Fernando? If there are items of information that you know are wanted but that you cannot get, state in your report that they are unknown or cannot be obtained. (However, every leader should consider such items a challenge to himself) Remember much of your information may be used in guiding bombers, so send in sketches whenever possible--particularly on large garrisons, fuel, food, and ammunition dumps, artillery emplacements, etc. Give numbers whenever possible, but if number is the result of an estimate, place the word "estimated" before the number. If you do not place this word, we assume that you counted them or got information from a documentary source.
- D. Report changes. These are often more important than original dispositions. If first report on an item is of a change, give the old status too, as "The garrison at Dinabat has been increased from ten to fifty men".
- E. Where information of a certain area is complete (or incomplete) say so. Thus if you say, "Garrisons are located at the following places in Pangasinan", we want to know if you mean or just the ones you know about.

1. Make full use of ALL sources of information. Loyal officials, workers in Jap bases, camps and warehouses, etc. should be utilized as sources of information. Lastly, make use of the Japs themselves as sources of information. Have all persons who have an opportunity to talk to Jap officers and soldiers try to get the following information: (1) How long has the Jap been in the Philippines?, (2) Where was he stationed before coming to P.I. (get him to brag about what battles he has fought in), (3) When did he leave Japan (Ask him when he said good bye to his family), (4) Have many of his comrades been sent to fight elsewhere, where? (5) Does he think Japan will win the war? (as morale item), (6) How were conditions in Japan when he left? (ask him how they compare with conditions in P.I.) (7) Similar information. Try to get this type of information from many Japs, everywhere, all the time and report it completely.

2. All information will be submitted in duplicate-one copy for the C.O., USFIP, NL and one for this section. Where you have separate line of communication with each, send each copy along its proper line of communication.

SUBJECT: Request for check of Intelligence Information
TO:

1. The enclosed information sheets represent all the information possessed by this section at this date in regard to certain areas with which you should be familiar. A copy of the latest G-2 Report prepared by this section is also enclosed. For your information, the key to the various items is as follows:

Class A--Information actually observed by reliable agents.

Class B--Information reported to our agents as actually observed by person making report.

Class C-- Third hand information and reasonable rumors.

Class D-- Information obtained from unreliable persons and unreasonable rumors.

Class E-- Source of information not stated by person making report. May be any of above.

Class F-- Information obtained from Manila Tribune.

The dates after the various items of information indicate the date as of which the information is supposed to be true. Due to the slowness of communication, we have to assume that all items are still in effect until changes are reported.

2. You will examine these enclosures and check them with your intelligence organization and do the following:

A. Report any incorrect items, giving source and date of information upon which correction is based.

B. Report any information not included, giving source and date of information.

C. Report any items which we have stated with a true date over one month old which you know to still be true, giving source and date of information. Thus, if we have a March true date on an item, and it is still true, tell us about it.

D. Report any items that you can confirm with a more reliable class of information than we have, giving source and date of information. Thus, if we have an item in Class C, and you can put it into Class A (actually observed by your agents), tell us about it.

E. In any instances in which you can furnish sketches which would be of aid in establishing the location of large garrisons, food, supply and ammunition dumps, artillery and AA emplacements, send them in if you have not already done so.

3. In checking this information, make use not only of your own men but also of loyal and intelligent civilians who are in a position to observe troop dispositions and movements, but be sure to give source and date of such information.

4. For your information, this information is what the G-2 Reports, set to Hqtrs., USA FE, are prepared from; this information is what you and others units have sent in. As you view its doubtless many errors, contradictions and omissions, resolve to do your best to see that you are not responsible for any such things in the future. Successful accomplishment of this intelligence mission requires constant intelligence and painstaking effort. It is just as important NOW as our offensive will be on "M Day" and should therefore receive as much of your effort and attention.

Co. of the 3rd Battalion.

I am very glad that at last you have fully recovered from your malaria sickness and that you are again ready to resume your command. I will be waiting for your call.

Re your inquiry as to whether Acop and Senot are willing to rejoin, I am sending you a copy of the complete roster of the 3rd Battalion of the 14th Infantry. The roster of the non-commission and enlisted men will be sent later, as Senot is still busy listing the members. I hope that by this time it is ready so that I will take same when I go next week.
