1. It is the desire of the CO that the gathering of enemy intelligence be intensified to the utmost. Emphasis on the desired informations is hereby made and every intelligence personnel MUST take every effort to gather IMPORTANT S-2 items. Every intelligence personnel of this command should get conscious of the fact that on the degree of success of enemy intelligence collection depends the success of the Liberation Forces.

2. Your attention is called on the following:

a. Par. 5 & 6 d, 1st Indorsement, this HQ to G. O. No. 12, HQ-1122. All intelligence personnel--agents, informers, paid informers and field agents should be thoroughly instructed and drilled on the desired informations and the means and ways of obtaining same. Assigned areas of units, this command, agents and field agents MUST be thoroughly covered. (The 3rd Bn should employ every effort and intensify its agents to gather intelligence informations in (1) Nueva Scija as far south as San Jose (2) Baler area and (3) Casiguran area.

b. Letter, HQ-1122(G-2), dated 16 August 1944, Subject-Hints and Suggestions re G.O. No.12, HQ-1122 to all District COs indorsed to All Bn COs by this HQ. "Bn Comdrs are urged that if they have additional ideas to fit in their respective areas, they must do so without restraint and put them into effect. HQ, USAFIP, NL and this HQ do not care how you do it; all we want are RESULTS."

c. Letter, HQ-1122-G2(1113), dated 23 August 44, Subject-Instruction; To All District COs, indorsed to All Bn COs by this HQ.

d. Msg No. 441, HQ, USAFIP, NL, dated 24 October 1944, Subject-Instructions Re Bombing Targets, To All District COs, indorsed to All Bn COs by this HQ.

e. Instruction from Higher HQ which is hereunder quoted:

1. It has come to the attention of this HQ that information reported in your S-2 reports are getting unimportant and too general, missing the desired information. Your latest reports received are considered by the CO, of no account.

2. You will redouble your efforts in the collection of enemy intelligence. Higher HQ calls for daily S-2 reports on troop movements, large troops concentrations, air watch report, and supply and installations. It is expected that you send in daily fragmentary S-2 Reports of the above stating strength, composition, organization, origin, destination, and transportation used in troop movements which are now VERY Important if you are keeping up events. Reports of large troops concentrations or garrisons of 100 or over and supply installations should be accompanied with detailed sketches.

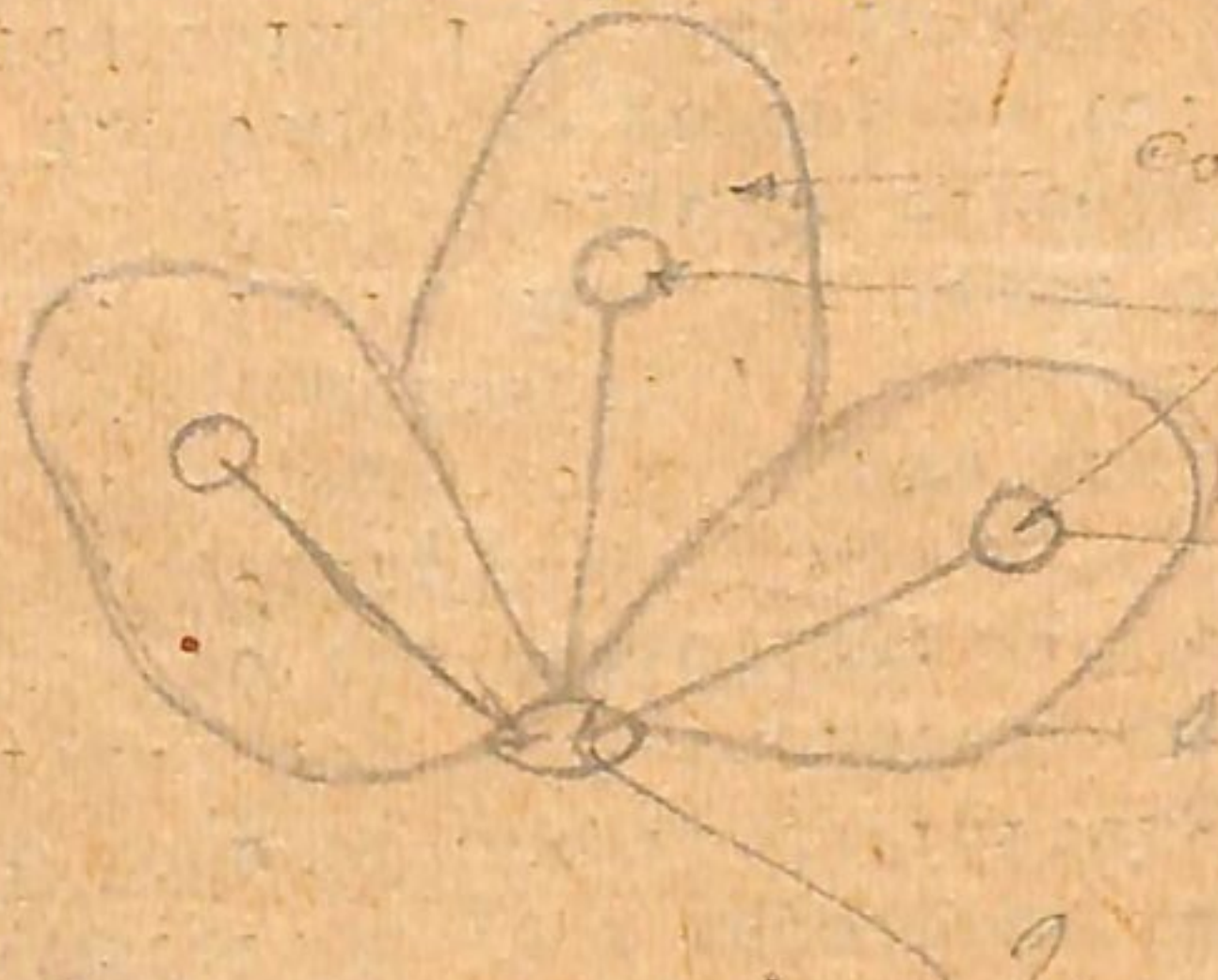





Subject: Fire Discipline During Combat
To : All Battalion Commanders, this Regiment.

1. It has come to the knowledge of this HQ that ammunition has been unnecessarily wasted by our men in our past operations against the enemy, though results obtained have been satisfying to the command insofar as casualty on our side is concerned.

2. This waste is indicative to the following factors:

- (1) that leaders of combat units do not have fire control over their men,
- (2) that men do not know what is fire discipline,
- (3) that the men have not been thoroughly instructed of the technique of fire and its application to appropriate targets, and
- (4) that men are excited in the firing line instead of remaining cool and assume confidence.

3. It has also been noted that officers instead of supervising, controlling the fire, and observing the effect of the fire of their men during combat, are firing at the enemy themselves, thereby losing the fire discipline and control of their unit which is of prime importance during combat.

4. Bn Commanders should realize that the supply of ammunition allotted to their own units has been calculated to last them in the accomplishment of their D and M-Day missions, inasmuch as this HQ is not sure as to whether our request for more arms and ammunition will be acted favorably by GHQ or not. This HQ, therefore, advises all Bn Commanders that unless they exercise proper fire discipline during combat, they will suffer in the future inasmuch as this HQ will continue to assign combat mission to its subordinate units regardless as to whether they have ammunitions or not.

5. All Bn Commanders are directed to take immediate steps to remedy the defects mentioned above.

1. Your latest reports received to date were good. Carry on the good work and keep on improving the contents and form of same. In the words of Lt. Sofronio Z. Concepcion, Asst A/C of S, G-2, "Intelligence reports from General Headquarters, USAFIP, NL, and from regiments comprising the USAFIP, NL, have been very much appreciated.....Sketches.....gave the latest dope on enemy installations.....they were sent "as they were because they were very good sketches"..... enemy documents, identification tags, papers, books, etc., has surprised Major Auriel of the ATIS Section who remarked, "where and how do you get so many".... A recent report which reached Headquarters Sixth Army re-Battle of Bataan, from this headquarters, was adjudged to be an "Excellent report". The undersigned was requested to convey to the Commanding Officer, USAFIP, NL the appreciation of the Officer in Charge of the ATIS, and his special request to have more of that "brand" of report." Let us join hands to hold high the good reports expected of us to maintain.

2. Periodic S-2 Reports are now to be rendered weekly every Thursday so as to arrive at this Hq every Saturday. It is expected that in spite of the short period said report is intended to cover, the contents should be as detailed and full of desired enemy intelligence as your previous reports or better. Your fragmentary reports are to be rendered daily. Renew efforts as regards sending daily fragmentary reports and make it a point that you give up-to-the-minute desired information. Numerous instructions were given you and it is desired that you have to keep track with these new instructions religiously.

1. It has come to the attention of this Headquarters that enemy papers and personnel forwarded by subordinate units of this command are not always accompanied with the information as to How, Where, When, and Why such papers or personnel were captured. While some units have always complied with those specifications, others seem to have considered them insignificant.

2. For your information, the Headquarters, Sixth Army and the GHO, SWPA have been using much of the information of these nature from this command in making estimates of enemy movements and intentions.

3. The practice of forwarding enemy papers and prisoners with the statement "information as to How, Where, When and Why captured will be furnished later, etc. etc.", must be stopped. It will be the duty of the Intelligence personnel of your Staff to furnish this Headquarters an idea as to the How's, Where's, When's and Why's of such captures in cases when your field agents cannot promptly give the circumstances of the captures. Inquiries made on the messengers bringing such papers or prisoners is suggested. All agents under your command should be advised accordingly.

4. Henceforth, it shall be sufficient cause for an "Official Reprimand" to commanders concerned for failure to comply with the above instructions.

1. For your information, guidance, and thorough study.
2. The following pointers are hereunder indicated for your immediate observation and compliances:

a. Have your companies organize at once their combat patrols to go into no-man's land and into gaps between portions of the enemy lines to gather information. In any case, where they are of aid in making the info clearer, sketches should invariably be submitted along with the report. All enemy installations, concentrations of troops, artillery, armored vehicles, parks, gun emplacements, etc indicated on the sketches should be tied to prominent landmarks such as church, school, road junction, cemetery, market etc.; i.e. giving the distance and direction, in azimuth if possible.

b. Establish observation posts at such places as are convenient to insure observation and securing the necessary info re movements and other activities of the enemy.

c. Give training in scouting and patrolling immediately. The material for this purpose may be obtained from pertinent chapters of the Basic Manual Field Manual and other similar books.

d. General execution and application is desired on paragraphs 2-a, 6, 3, and 5. Submit hourly S-2 reports by radio. If for one reason or another, it is impossible to report by radio, send S-2 reports by rush mail at least three times daily. Grill and instruct all intelligence personnel to the gathering of up-to-the minute and accurate reports regarding friendly and enemy dispositions. Unit commanders are encouraged to believe that it is impossible to obtain the desired information and such information is necessary to your operation.

e. S-2 reports by radio should be brief but complete. It should follow in sequence as outlined in the information required below:

- (1) Town
- (2) Kind, like garrison, dumps, gun emplacements, etc.
- (3) Place, giving distance and direction from a prominent reference point such as church, a school, road junction, market, etc.
- (4) Nature of installation; like caliber of guns, quantity of ammunitions in buildings or dugouts, number of troops in houses or bivouacked under trees, etc.
- (5) Date: Good as of 8 March 45.

3. Attention is invited to paragraph 1-d of the inclosed Training Directive No. 3 with regards to the reports and records to be submitted and/or kept by your S-3 section.

4. You will immediately stop sending copies of your S-3 Journal to this HQ. However, your S-3 Journal should always be kept up-to-date and in accordance with par d(2) Training Directive No. 3.

5. In lieu of the S-3 Journal you are submitting to this HQ you will submit your compliance with radiogram from GHQ quoted for your information and compliance in a radiogram this HQ dated 1 March 45. (See incl. 2)

6. Bn Comdrs are directed to supervise more closely their respective S-3 sections and should see to it that the S-3 reports are complied with and sent to this HQ with the least possible delay.

Subject: Training Directive No. 3
To : All Regimental Commanders, USAFIP, NL

1. In order that the S-3 Sections may function properly the following is published for the information and guidance of all concerned. It is directed that Battalion and Regimental S-3 sections be organized as soon as possible in order to acquaint the personnel of those sections with their respective duties so that they will be thoroughly prepared to meet the increasing volume of work as our forces are more and more actively engaged against the enemy.

a. Organization of Regimental and Battalion S-3 Sections.
(This is believed to be in accordance with the T/O PA).

(1) Regimental S-3 Section

- 1- 1st Lieutenant or Captain
- 1- Sergeant (Typist and Clerk)
- 1- Sergeant (Draftsman)

(2) Battalion S-3 Section

- 1- 1st or 2nd Lieutenant
- 1- Corporal (Clerk, Typist and Draftsman)

b. Duties:

(1) Duties of the Regimental S-3:

(a) As radio, written or verbal messages, reports or orders are issued or received, he will see that they are numbered serially, briefed and entered in briefed form on the S-3 journal. Numbering is based not on the date the message, order or report is written but on the hour and date it is received or sent. This method of numbering enables higher headquarters to fix responsibility in cases when timely action is not taken. The messages, reports or orders, received or sent, already numbered as above, are then turned over to the sergeant (Typist and Clerk) for file.

(b) He prepares the periodic report at least once every seven days or oftener.

(c) He prepares field orders under the supervision of the Regimental Commander.

(d) He prepares instructions of an S-3 nature for subordinate units.

(e) He prepares an operations map (or sketch or overlay) showing locations, dispositions, boundaries and sectors of our units. In cases where our units are engaged in harassing and road blocking activities or in the future when units may be engaged on similar missions, the operations map will be supplemented with notes and symbols showing information as necessary to give a clear picture of the operations. The operations map with notes and symbols and legend should be complete in itself and should give a clear picture of the operations. The operations map with notes and symbols and legend should be complete in itself and should give a clear picture of the operations and dispositions of our units during the period covered without reference to additional written material.

(f) He prepares S-3 reports as may be directed by the Regimental Commander.

(2) Duties of the Sergeant (Typist and Clerk):

(a) He keeps the files and prepares the "score board" showing (aa) our own losses and (bb) our booty.

(b) He copies the periodic reports and all S-3 correspondence.

(c) He is custodian of the S-3 Journal, S-3 files and S-3 Operations Map.

(3) Duties of the Sergeant (Draftsman):

(a) He prepares the map or overlays or sketches to accompany the periodic reports, fragmentary reports and field orders.

(b) He plots on the S-3 operations map the data mentioned in Paragraph 1. b. (1) (e) above as directed by the Regimental S-3.

(4) The Battalion S-3's duties are the same as those listed for the Regimental S-3 except that they will pertain mainly to his Battalion.

(5) The Corporal (clerk, Typist and Draftsman) has the same duties as listed above for the Sergeant (Typist and Clerk) and the Sergeant (Draftsman) except those duties will pertain mainly to his Battalion.

c. Relationship of S-3 Sections to other sections of the staff.

(1) At each Regimental or Battalion Headquarters the S-3 and S-2 should coordinate and have only one operations map. The S-2 will plot on the map using conventional signs and dispositions and strength and location of the enemy in his own area or sector. The S-3 will plot the boundaries, locations of CPs and other data of an S-3 nature on his units on the operations map. Thus when the Regimental or Battalion Commander wants to know the situation, he can readily be informed of same by looking at the situation map and the "score board".

(2) The relationship between S-2 and S-3 sections must be one of cordiality because their work is so closely knitted together. The plan of attack that an S-3 may recommend to his commander depends on the enemy situation and capability data furnished him by the S-2.

d. Reports and Records.

(1) Fragmentary S-3 Reports.

(a) These reports are written and/or radio reports submitted daily or oftener and cover the operations, dispositions, locations, actions, orders and accomplishments of the units since the last report.

(b) They are supplemented by an operations map (or overlay or sketch) whenever necessary to clarify the situation.

(c) These reports are forwarded by Regiment to the next Higher Headquarters.

(2) The S-3 Journal

(a) It is in a book form and can be made by binding together about 50 to 100 sheets of typewriting paper. Papers are ruled if entries are made in long hand. (Refer to sample which was a part of Training Directive No. 1, this HQ, dated 14 Jan 1945). A Bureau of Education notebook may be used in lieu of the typewriting paper.

(b) The Journal may be compared to a Record of Events, It is a valuable record of the organization. From the Journal, with the S-3 file, one can trace the history of the organization from the beginning to the day of demobilization. It is not necessary to make copies of the Journal and forward them to this HQ. However, it should be available for inspection at any time. (See d(1) for reports in lieu of the Journal.)

(3) Periodic Reports (See form attached)

(a) The periodic report is a summary of the work accomplished by the Regiment or Battalion during the period covered by the report.

(b) To whom sent: The Regimental S-3 sends copies to the next higher HQ, the Regimental S-1, S-2, S-4, and S-5, each Battalion of the Regiment, and file. The Battalion S-3 sends one copy to each Company of the Battalion, the Battalion S-1, S-2, and S-4, Regimental Headquarters, to the Headquarters next higher than Regiment and file.

(4) S-3 File.

It is a file of all letters, messages, reports and orders received and sent daily. Its contents are numbered serially from 1 to infinity.

(5) Maps.

Subject: Message and Instructions
To : All Bn Comdrs, 14th Infantry

1. I have just arrived from GHQ, USAFIP, NL this morning via cub plane. The following instructions and message from the Commanding Officer and members of the General Staff are hereby transmitted for your information, guidance, and immediate action.
2. The USAFIP, NL forces will soon get their official induction and reinduction from the GHQ, SWPA, being the only guerrilla force in Luzon so far recognized by Gen. MacArthur, for it was organized as a military unit, not as an independent armed group that exists for some personal ambition to avenge individual ends as some guerrilla units are or had been.
3. In view of the above, the CO, USAFIP, NL directed the regimental commanders to submit at once all rosters of officers and troops for transmittal to GHQ, SWPA.
4. Summary action or court martial action will be instituted against individual officer concerned who will unduly delay submission of this report. I desire that upon receipt of this letter, you will submit AT ONCE all your rosters of officers and troops without any more further instruction and delay.
5. Notwithstanding our D-Day and M-Day mission, the gathering of continuous and up-to-date accurate (A-1) intelligence information is still the most important mission of USAFIP, NL forces in our coordinating effort with the 6th Army. GHQ, USAFIP, NL desires that daily S-2 reports be submitted to the GHQ, USAFIP, NL, not later than three (3) days from the date information is reported good. This cannot be too strongly emphasized as effectiveness of air strikes is most dependent on accurate and prompt S-2 information.
6. I direct you that this desire of GHQ, USAFIP, NL be carried out to the letter. I will hold you responsible that compliance with this order be continuous. It is imperative that your radio communication be kept functioning and open twenty-four (24) hours daily. In the event your transmitter or this HQ's set is out of order, efforts must be exerted that S-2 information shall keep rolling in at the fastest available means of communication to the nearest sub-station in the regiment or direct to GNL stating the reason for such an action.
7. All ways and means of getting accurate, first hand and up-to-date information must be devised and tried. The sending of continuous combat-reconnaissance patrol to the interior of the enemy line even at the risk of greater casualties on our side will be done, because the apparent greater casualty we may sustain in this operation to get an important information in an enemy defense position, command post, etc. will be greatly compensated by the result our Allied air strikes may obtain later on. It is important, therefore, that our men should be thoroughly trained and rehearsed

in scouting and patrolling, and sketching. In view of the fact that the enemy has increased his stringent measure to deny from us information we most desire as to their set up, resulting in his indiscriminate and wanton killing of our civilian agents and civilians in the belief that they are all our S-2 agents, combat intelligence by our men now has to be resorted to in great intensity to keep the demand of higher headquarters for this vital S-2 information.

8. I am now directing my staff that, henceforth, all S-2 information must indicate the unit or units or personnel which gathered every item of S-2 information to add another internal element of gauging the efficiency of each and every unit or office for citation, decoration and promotion. Battalion S-2 report will so indicate this item beginning upon receipt of this letter.

9. There has been a tendency of officers or units that instructions from higher headquarters, once read, are left aside on the table or shelved in file and ultimately forgotten. All instructions from the G-2 and this HQ S-2 must be re-read and re-read so that important and emphasized items be kept fresh in mind, and continued efforts carried on. One of these instructions is the thorough search of enemy documents however unimportant an item may appear to the man, and the continued effort to capture enemy officer with the end in view to securing more information which we would not possibly get out of inanimate enemy objects. This prisoner in turn will be sent to this HQ for further questioning.

10. All air targets and other important enemy installations must be pin-pointed. Overlays of air photos will be sent and targets or enemy strength and disposition will be clearly shown.

11. The Commanding Officer, USAFIP, NL wants to emphasize the relation between our units and the landing forces in making contacts. No units of the USAFIP, NL forces will be attached to the landing forces without the knowledge of the GHQ, USAFIP, NL. Our forces will cooperate actively with the landing forces in S-2 information; and even if they will be so attached, our units must always stay in our area and continue to send S-2 reports to this HQ furnishing S-2 information and complying with instructions. The CO, USAFIP, NL wishes to make it clear that it is our responsibility to keep S-2 activities and reports in our area; even if our landing forces occupy our area, our forces must always stay BEHIND the enemy. In other words the enemy must be sandwiched between our forces. These instructions must be followed, and unit commanders who fail to carry out this instructions in violation of GHQ, USAFIP, NL previous instructions (in regard to the conduct of our contact unit with the landing forces) will be dealt with disciplinarily.

12. This is to transmit to you instructions from the CO, USAFIP, NL that any unit leader who becomes incapable of discharging the duties expected of his position and rank will be replaced by another capable leader. Any officer who fails to show qualities of a leader will be recommended immediately for reduction to an enlisted grade and his position be replaced by a NCO who displays leadership. This EM in turn will be recommended for commission. He cited an example that in the 121st Inf there are only

three officers that he knows who are originally commissioned officers, while the rest of the officer personnel came from the rank. This instruction will be put into effect in this organization.

13. The CO desires that all routinary reports like Consolidated Monthly Strength and Arms Report, S-4 and Ordnance Report (weekly), Weekly S-2 and S-3 Reports, etc. be submitted regularly and promptly.

14. Attention of CO, 1st and 2nd Bn is invited to the order that Highway No. 5 from Bagabag and up be totally demolished and blocked so as to become untenable to the enemy. All kinds of harassment, destruction, and impediments be undertaken to cripple the enemy's line of communication. In this connection, enemy troop movement must be kept track of twenty four (24) hours daily. This HQ has run into difficulties of knowing where most of the enemy troop movements are going and coming from, because only one or two road census stations are making reports and nothing has been noted or reported by succeeding road census stations. Enemy intention and disposition can be detected if their movements are thoroughly checked up.

15. The G-2 section of GHQ, USAFIP, NL is sometimes in quandary to the big discrepancy in figures we reported in enemy's strength in Vizcaya and Isabela because our figures are twice the number of the 6th Army records. In other words, the 6th Army is doubting the creditability of our reports, or it undermines our capability in our works. This calls for our accurate, first hand S-2 information.

16. Attention of CO, 3rd Bn is invited to the progress of enemy's road construction works in Pingkian and Pampang. The G-2 section desires that enemy field work - - road construction, defenses, etc. -- be closely followed and progress report be kept up.

17. The 14th Inf internal land communication is most inefficient compared to other regiments. Some important communications have been lost, delayed, mutilated or destroyed. Though this is directly under the battalion communication officer, Battalion Commanders are the only officers responsible to this HQ in the prompt and efficient functioning of their land as well as their radio communication system.

18. This HQ has requisitioned all necessary supplies, clothing, medicines and arms and ammunitions. Arms and ammunitions have been the priority, and the GHQ has been airdropping arms and ammunitions in great quantities for reserve. In a very short time the 14th Inf will be in full formal attack twenty hours daily like the 121st Inf. The great quantities of ammunitions we are receiving must be stored in strategic places so units of this command will have on hand ready supplies. Attention of Regimental S-4 and Bn S-4 is invited to this phase of their responsibilities. Battalion Commanders should check this up in their commands. They will direct all company commanders under their commands to establish ammunition dumps in secure places in their respective areas so that they can easily get replenishment of ammunition in case of emergency without making any further requisition from the Battalion S-4.


19. From unconfirmed reports, SWPA forces in Luzon are disarming bands of guerrillas on account of the fact that these guerrillas are fighting each other and that there has been no semblance of military organization. Only units of USAFIP, NL forces are given full arms, ammunitions, clothings and other supplies. They are coming in great bulk.

20. G-5 USAFIP, NL expresses satisfaction on the 14th and 11th Infantry in the way they are dealing with civilians. Officers in other units of the USAFIP, NL forces responsible for the series of execution of civilians because of personal and political differences will be dealt with individually. All our executions of real spies are sanctioned by higher headquarters as the only lawful means to meet our critical situation. Execution other than conviction of espionage is being investigated against the individual responsible officer. Again, this HQ wishes to remind its officers and men of the instructions released by this command in regard to our relation with the civilians and how to deal with them.

21. The 14th Inf is fast catching up in casualty record inflicted on the enemy with the first two leading regiments.

22. I wish every officer and man in the 14th Infantry to keep up our name, record and standing. I pray for your success and safety. We will soon be enjoying with our loved ones once and forever.

Subject: Thorough Intelligence Coverage
To: All Bn Comdrs, this regiment
Attention S-2

1. Of late this Hq has been getting but little of inadequate information from the Field. This is unfortunate in view of the present demand by higher Headquarters for more and accurate information. It is our belief that with your valuable help, we can cope with such a demand.

2. One cause of the poverty of our S-2 info seems to be the lack of extensive intelligence coverage of your areas. It is noted that most info received to date are almost exclusively on Bagabag and Santiago. How about the other places, the other towns, the other barrios in your areas?

3. Here is where administrative discretion may be exercised provided it is consistent with reason and military regulations. If your agents do not turn in good info, reshift them, or revert them to the class of the inactive, and such like to make them active. Or you may increase the number of your agents, or give them periodic lectures and instructions, or send them letters of admonition like the one hereto attached.

4. To be of use and value, information must be timely. Hence of prime importance is the speed with which S-2 info should be relayed to this Hq. Take full advantage of your radio set so as to have all info reach this Hq sizzling hot with timeliness.

5. Very important are road census reports. Submit them daily in brief but complete phrases. - For example:

" 1225 Inf in 60 trucks, 2000 foot troops, 10 trucks with milk load, 335 bull carts from south went north and 528 Inf in 14 trucks, 200 foot troops, 25 in horse wagons from north went south passed San Juan, Ilagan from midnight 20 to midnight 21 April."

Then submit your weekly tabulated road census as usual so as to arrive at this Hq every Wednesday.

6. For obvious reasons, road watcher stations should be established and maintained between the following places in your respective areas:

a. Sta Fe and Aritao b. Aritao and Pingkian

My dear Cabaguis;

Cabaguis, although you have not written me yet since I wrote you in your new CP, near the "H" Company, I am again stealing part of your time and little attention about giving me the following informations:

1. I was inducted to the Service of the 14th Infantry on Aug. 26, 1944.

1. This HQ has noticed from your reports that units of your command are reported as having killed a very large number of Japs, usually in the hundreds, in many actions in which they have been forced to withdraw, leaving ~~in which they have been forced to withdraw, leaving~~ the field and hands of the enemy. On the other hand, in other type of actions, the number of Japs reported killed is usually ~~usually~~ quite small. It is also noted that the ratio of your casualties to enemy casualties is 1 to 63, while the ratio of the next lower unit is 1 to 32.

2. In view of the above, it is believed that your estimates of enemy casualties are being considerably over-estimated.

3. It is desired that you check thoroughly the method of counting enemy casualties inflicted by your units and make report to this HQ regarding same including any revision of previous estimates of enemy casualties that you may feel are necessary as a result of your findings.

Only in cases in which specialized knowledge is needed and which cannot be efficiently handled by any enlisted man when civilians who have such specialized knowledge may be employed, with the authority of this and higher Headquarters.

(b) Company R: Sector between South Boundary Company 2nd Bn and all pieces of same latitude of and to DONGAYOP exclusive.

(c) Company I: Sector between the parallels of latitude of DONGAYOP and SOLANO inclusive.

(d) Company M: Sector between the parallels of SOLANO exclusive and BATU FERRY inclusive.

(2) Will destroy and block immediately points on HWY #4 between NAYON (Payambugan) and BAGABAG inclusive.

(3) Will exert maximum harassing tactics in its area of operation against the enemy, special attention to enemy supply and troop movements on HWY #4 and HWY #5.

(4) Will clear Japs in NAYON and general area along HWY #4 TO LANUT.

(5) Will prevent enemy reinforcement coming from BAGABAG towards KIANGAN via HWY #4 by the installation of booby traps, road blocks, by demolitions of critical areas and by successive defenses.

d. Combat Company and other units attached: Regimental reserve.

(1) Explosive will be used to destroy important defiles, side hill cuts, culverts and bridges.

(2) Maximum use will be made of local materials for obstacles such as trees felled across the road, large boulders rolled on the road, etc.

(3) Hostile forces will be vigorously denied opportunity for repair of destroyed sections.


(4) Report will be made, giving date of completion of demolitions, their location and nature.

4. Class I supplies, ammunition, and explosives and other demolition materials and tool will be dropped on all respective airdrop and airstrip bases in operation. Prompt report of any bases that may be threatened or compromised will be radioced without delay.

Subject : Estimated Enemy Casualties
To : CO, 1st Bn, this regiment

1. It has been noticed from your reports on encounters with the enemy that units of your command reported large number of Japs killed and wounded, in many actions where they were forced to withdraw, leaving the field in the hands of the enemy. On the other hand, in some actions, enemy casualties reported are quite small even if our troops were superior in number. It has also noted that in most cases where the fighting takes place only for a short time, the enemy casualties reported, usually, are considerably more than what they can possibly inflict within that short period.

2. In view of the above, it is believed that the casualties inflicted on the enemy in following encounters are considerably over-estimated and were reduced in our S-3 periodic reports submitted to higher Headquarters;

a. 10 EM under Sgt. Reyno of C company encountered 120 J Japs at Kansan B ridge, Cabagan on 28 April at 1150. Results: 78 Japs killed and 35 wounded. Reported 26 killed and 12 wounded in our periodic report No. 14.

b. 9 EM under Cpl. BUado of C company encountered 18 Japs at Catabayungan, Cabagan, on 28 April 45 at 0400 to 0630. Result: 12 Japs killed and 3 wounded. Reported 6 Japs killed in our periodic No. 14.

c. 22 D boys engaged 43 Japs along Cagayan River on 12 and 13 April 45 at 1600 and 1500 respectively. Total casualty: 21 Japs killed and 12 wounded. Reduced to 10 killed and 6 wounded in our periodic report No. 13.

d. 15 EM of C company ambushed 6 trucks along National Highway No. 5 on 13 April at 1930. Result: 100 Japs killed and 23 wounded. Reduced to 50 Japs killed and 12 wounded in our periodic report No. 13.

e. One squad of C company posted as guards at Barrio B agutari intercepted and repulsed 100 Japs who attempted to cross the Cagayan River by swimming on April 1, 1945. Casualty: 18 Japs killed. Reduced to 9 Japs killed in our periodic report No. 13.

f. 4 EM of C company attacked Ugad garrison where there were 32 Japs. 9 Japs killed and 2 wounded. Reduced to 4 Japs killed in our periodic report No. 13.

g. Two squads first platoon attacked enemy attempting to cross Cagayan River in 2 instances on 13 and 14 April 45. Casualty: 21 Japs killed. Reduced to 10 Japs killed in our periodic report No. 13.

h. Two S-2 agents attacked 20 Japs at barrio Ugad on 12 April 45. Casualty: 4 Japs killed and 2 wounded. Reduced to 2 killed and 1 wounded in our periodic report No. 13.

i. Same agents attacked 40 Japs at Bona Bangodan on 13 April 45, killing 12 Japs. Reduced to 6 Japs in our periodic report No. 13.

j. A squad of Company D led by Sgt. Sanchez while on patrol at Calanagui, Ilagan, Isabela encountered 30 Japs at 1215 30 March 45. Result: 12 Japs killed. Reduced to 6 in our periodic report No. 13.

k. The CO, B company, reported that 16 of his boys under Sgt. Maluddy on 29 March 45 at 0900 encountered 30 Japs at Caliwag, Aurora Isabela. 15 Japs killed. Reduced to 7 in our periodic report No. 12.

l. One platoon of Company B boys under Lt. Benito raided 700 Japs at Callang, Aurora, Isabela at 2330 on 20 March 45. 46 Japs killed and 15 wounded. Reduced to 23 killed and 7 wounded in our periodic report No. 12.

m. 28 EM of B company under Lt. Tintero on 9 April 45 at 0400 raided 50 Japs occupying Gamu Elementary School building. 25 Japs killed and 15 wounded. Reported 10 killed and 7 wounded in our periodic report No. 10.

n. 24 April 45, at 2100, Lt. Arellano with 22 C company EM ambushed 3 trucks at Bagutari, completely wrecking one of the trucks and killing 90 Japs. Reduced to 60 in our periodic report No. 13.

o. A squad of Company C under a NCO, raided 40 Japs in Ugad at 2130 on 26 March 45. 18 Japs killed and 7 wounded. Reduced to 10 in our periodic report No. 14.

p. EM of Company A led by Lt. Fernando intercepted 200 Japs at Barambang, Gamu on 27 April 45 at 0300. 45 Japs killed. Reduced to 22 in our periodic report N. 14.

1. It has been noticed from your reports on encounters with the enemy that units of your command reported large number of Japs killed and wounded, in many actions where they were forced to withdraw, leaving the field in the hands of the enemy. On the other hand, in some actions, enemy casualties reported are quite small even if our troops were superior in number. It was also noted that in most cases where the fighting takes place only for a short time, the enemy casualty reported, usually, are considerably more than what they can possibly inflict within that short period.

2. In view of the above, it is believed that the casualties inflicted on the enemy in following encounters are considerably overestimated and were reduced in our 3-3 periodic reports submitted to Higher Headquarters:

a. 10 EM under Sgt. Reyno of C Company encountered with 120 Japs at KANDAN Bridge, Cabagan on 28 April at 1150. Result: 78 Japs killed and 36 wounded. Reported 26 killed and 12 wounded in our periodic report No. 14.

b. 9 EM under Cpl. Busio of C Co encountered 18 Japs at CATABAYUNGAN, Cabagan, on 28 April 45 at 0400 to 0630. Result: 12 Japs killed and 3 wounded. Reported 6 Japs killed in our periodic report No. 14.

c. 22 D boys engaged 43 Japs along Cagsyan River on 12 and 13 April 45 at 1600 and 1500 respectively. Total casualty: 21 Japs killed and 12 wounded. Reduced to 10 killed and 6 wounded in our periodic report No. 13.

d. 15 EM of C Company ambushed 6 trucks along National Highway No. 5 on 13 April at 1930. Result: 100 Japs killed and 23 wounded. Reduced to 50 Japs killed and 12 wounded in our periodic report No. 13.

e. One squad of C Company posted as guards at barrio BAGUTARI intercepted and repulsed 100 Japs who attempted to cross the Cagsyan River by swimming on 1 April. Casualty: 18 Japs killed. Reduced to 9 Japs killed in our period report No. 13.

f. 4 EM of C Company attacked UGAD garrison where there were 30 Japs. 9 Japs killed and 2 wounded. Reduced to 4 Japs killed in our periodic report No. 13.

g. Two squads first platoon attacked enemy attempting to cross Cagsyan River in 2 instances on 13 and 14 April 45. Casualty: 21 Japs killed. Reduced to 10 Japs killed in our periodic report No. 13.

h. Two B-2 agents attacked 20 Japs at barrio UGAD on 12 April 45. Casualty: 4 Japs killed and 2 wounded. Reduced to 2 killed and 1 wounded in our periodic report No. 13.

i. Same agents attacked 40 Japs at BONA BANGODAN on 13 April 45, killing 12 Japs. Reduced to 6 Japs in our periodic report No. 13.

j. A squad of Company D led by Sgt. Sanchez while on patrol at CALAMAGUI, Ilagan, Isabela encountered 30 Japs at 1215 30 March 45. Result: 12 Japs killed. Reduced to 6 in our periodic report No. 12.

k. The CO, B Company, reported that 16 of his boys under Sgt. Maludoy on 29 March 45 at 0900 encountered 30 Japs at CALIWAO, Aurora, Isabela. 15 Japs killed. Reduced to 7 in our periodic report No. 12.

l. One platoon of Company B boys under Lt. Benite raided 700 Japs at CALLANG, Aurora, Isabela at 2330 on 20 March 45. 46 Japs killed and 15 wounded. Reduced to 23 killed and 7 wounded in our periodic report No. 12.

m. 28 EM of Company B under Lt. Tintero on 9 April 45 at 0400 raided 50 Japs occupying GAMU Elementary School building. 25 Japs killed and 15 wounded. Reported 10 killed and 7 wounded in our periodic report No. 10.

n. 24 April 45, at 2100, Lt. Arellano with 22 C Company EM ambushed 3 trucks at BAGUTARI, completely wrecking one of the trucks and killing 90 Japs. Reduced to 60 in our periodic report No. 13.

o. A squad of Company C under a NCO, raided 40 Japs in UGAD at 2130 on 26 March 45. 18 Japs killed and 7 wounded. Reduced to 10 in our periodic report No. 14.
