




Subject: Special Report Re-Capture of Ammunitions  
To: Bn Cndr., 1st Bn, 14th Infantry

1. More than 400 rounds of cal. 30 ammunitions with machine gun belt had been captured by our S-2 Agents from Cagayan BC soldier at Barrio Marabonac, Tuguegarao. The BC soldier says that these bullets were dropped by an American plane while making its acrobatic dive to bomb Tuguegarao. It is suspected therefore that these bullets were dropped accidentally as the airplane was making its dive.

2. The bullets are of 1942 & 1945 made as indicated in it. There are also plenty of tracer bullets.



1. Enclosed herewith are documents and papers obtained from the Japs which were killed on the 25th instant. These papers were taken from the patrol leader of the group who was shot to death later. 2 Jap rifles were also taken from the Japs.

2. Information is requested as to whether these arms captured or taken from the enemy should be submitted to Higher HQ for proper accounting. We badly need these arms because we are not yet fully equipped. Information is also requested for a list of equipments and supplies which are listed under "C" Co., and which are not yet submitted so that we could comply strictly with communication re-submission of equipments and supplies to higher HQ.

1. We are sending herewith two helmets and three Jap rifles, which are part of the booties which were captured by this command.
2. Urgent request is hereby made that the clothes which were captured from Jap soldiers be retained in this company in view of the dire need of our soldiers for clothing. Information is hereby given that some EM are dressed like Kalingas now in G-Strings because we severely lack sufficient clothing. Civilians in this sector are much more poorer in clothes than in other places.
3. All these booties will be submitted as soon as the clothing allowance from the Army will be received here.
4. Request is made for a list of all booties which are not yet submitted to that HQ so that we can comply strictly to the letter.

1. The following encounter report is hereby submitted to that Headquarters.

- (1) Date and time of encounter: 0800-0830, 10 June 45
- (2) Place of encounter: Lanna, Cabagan, Isabela
- (3) Number of enemy encountered: 20
- (4) Number of our men involved: 2
- (5) Number of enemy casualties: Killed - 12

- (11) Detailed description of the encounter - A bout 0800, 10 June 45, Pvt. Mamasag, Domingo and Pvt. Malana, Conrado, reconnaissance patrol of the Special Weapons Platoon, attacked 20 Japs digging fox-holes in the vicinity of Lanna, Cabagan. The Japs were taken by surprise from the simultaneous firing of our boys who retreated after killing 12 out of the 20. No casualty on our side.
- (12) Comments and Criticism in general re the conduct of our men during the encounter - Our boys in spite of the fact that they were only two acted admirably, in the face of superior number.
- (13) Comment and criticism re the conduct of each individual man or men during the encounter - Admirable, highly spirited.
- (14) Men Participating in the encounter - Pvt. Malana, Conrado and Pvt. Mamasag, Domingo
- (15) How enemy casualties were determined - They were only 50 meters away from the Japs; their firings were simultaneous giving them no chance to return fire.

(11) Detailed description of the encounter - About 0600, present instant Lt. F. A. Paragas, with 12 EM attacked 80 Japs who were digging their fox-holes under big trees around the Cabagan Farm School. Under cover our men moved silently to cross at the enemy at three different points and opened fire simultaneously at the enemy who had no chance to return fire.

The enemy after they had taken their position return fire with their MG and tummy guns. Enemy reinforcements of about 200 arrived and tried to encircle our men thus forcing our men to retreat. 35 of the enemy were accounted for and 5 wounded. No casualty on our side.

(12) Comments and criticisms re the conduct of our boys during the fight - Very aggressive.

(13) Comments and criticisms re the conduct of each individual man or men during the encounter - Aggressive and highly spirited.

(14) Men participating in the encounter - Lt. F. A. Paragas, Pvt. Sgt. Bayao, S; Pfc. Lazatin, M; Pvt. Caviso, R; Pvt. Alejo, R; Pvt. Asuncion, A; Pvt. Benjamin, A; Pvt. Dias, A; Pfc. Flores, S; Pfc. Magbalita, A; and Pvt. Pascua, P.

(15) How enemy was determined - The patrol was able to reach scene where the enemy was digging fox-holes but retreated upon hearing the rushing reinforcements.

Subjects: Intelligence Personnel  
To : All Bn Comdrs, this Regiment

1. It is noted that in spite of previous instructions, you have not rendered your Roster of S-2 Agents and that many had been dropped as shown in your last roster. "You are warned that duly inducted and enlisted men could be discharged only by higher headquarters." Should some of the members therefore fall under the category of enlisted men, it is suggested that they be transferred to other units of your command. . . . Your attention is called for purposes of precaution as it will only increase your administrative problems should you deviate from the present operating procedures, especially in the payment of services rendered prior to 9 January 1945."

2. Desire that you submit your final roster attaching a full explanation of how you disposed of those agents dropped in your June Roster of S-2 Agents. Also submit in duplicate oath of inductions and enlistments of all your S-2 Agents whose names appeared in your rosters rendered to this headquarters. If any duly inducted or enlisted agent had been transferred to your companies, true extract copies of the special orders in duplicate covering their transfer should be submitted.

3. A list of all non-inducted or enlisted civilian intelligence personnel (informers, civilian employees, SS agents, etc) should be submitted with remarks for what dates they have been paid or not, indicated opposite their names.

4. Expedite.
