SUBJECT: Reply to your letter
TO : CO, Combat Co.

1. I received your letter dated January 8th. I regret indeed to learn from you that my soldiers commit anomalies in your sector. In view of this, therefore, I request your command to furnish me specific and concrete evidences to establish the charge. Hearsay evidences will not be sufficient to put our soldiers on trial. Rest assured that proper and just action will immediately follow as soon as you furnish me the following data:

- a. Name of the soldiers who misbehaved.
- b. When and where they misbehaved.
- c. Nature of misbehaviour.
- d. Loyal civilians affected.
- e. Evidences and proofs.

2. Please be informed that I have never sent even a single patrol outside of my sector any time this month except that one who went to the Bn. CP to get our share of the new weapons as per order of the Bn. Commander. I have only two men outpost in Bacnor and three men along the Magat River. I suppose this handful of men will not be a burden on you. They eat with their own families. The three in Magat are on pass.

3. Partner, your paragraph 3 is too strong. I think this statement is in order only as soon as the charge of anomaly is proven and only by a Higher Headquarters at that.

4. Please explain clearly what you meant by the words "sharp shares" and "gold or diamond". Be frank, don't hide anything for the interest of the service. I will see to it that no stone is left unturned. I wish I shall have a chance to talk with you on a very confidential matter in the near future.

5. Prompt and immediate reply will be highly appreciated.

1. Please ascertain for us if Callang, Bacnor and Dalig Viejo belong to our sector. According to General Order No. 3, 1st Bn Hq. dated Dec. 30, 1944, they are included to our sector. We regret to state that the Combat Company has more than once protested against our getting supplies in those places.

2. Please inform us further if the organization of Mr. Sotero Nuesa (34th Infantry) has been given recognition by the Higher Headquarters. Mr. Nuesa, according to the barrio lieutenants of Bacnor and Dalig Viejo, has ordered them not to honor our requisition for food supplies for reasons unknown to this Headquarters. If the Higher Headquarters have neither authorized him nor recognized his unit, I believe that his act is a gross violation of the provisions of the letter dated Dec. 2, 1944 of the Regimental Headquarters re-Organization of Independent Military Volunteer Units.

3. In connection with controversies over sectorship and jurisdiction, please furnish us with an official copy of the map of Isabela showing the different sectors prepared in the Bn. Hq.

4. An early reply to these queries will be highly appreciated by this Command.

Subject: Explanation
To: CO, 1st Bn, 14th Infantry

1. I received yesterday Special Orders No. 2 dated 5 Jan. from Regimental Headquarters relative to change of command in this Company.
2. Almost at the same time I received a letter from the CO of Combat Co., a copy of which is attached hereto for your perusal. For the purpose of this explanation, I am enclosing copy of a letter I received previously from the Executive Officer of the same company and my reply thereto.
3. It was only after reading the letter of the Combat Commander that I began to form a suspicion (but I hope I am wrong) that some civilians, and F. Acio in particular, have been using my company as an instrument to gain the favor of the Combat Co. I have learned from a reliable source that Acio, in most cases, have been capitalizing individual acts of my soldiers, and insignificant at that, to misrepresent us to our brother companies. If, as claimed, any or some of my soldiers trespassed in other companies' sectors and thereby committed some acts unbecoming a soldier, it is clear in my reply 10 Jan. that I was and am with said Commander in the strict compliance with orders of the Higher Headquarters and in the subsequent punishment of whoever would be the culprit or culprits.
4. It is with deep regret that the CO of the Combat Co. did not give this Command a fair chance to demonstrate its spirit of cooperation with other companies, especially with her neighbor, the Combat Co., in any matter that would redound to the good of the service before he took up matters with the Higher Headquarters. I feel the unfairness of it all more so now that Special Orders No. 2 is issued which, I believe, is no coincidence at all. Save this, but which we consider a closed book to us, we have no particular grudge against said company for we know pretty well that the CO was doing only what he thought best and proper to be done for the protection of those within his sector.
5. I hope I will have a chance to talk confidentially with you regarding Acio's machinations to put this Co. in hot water. Surely, any one who takes his talk at its face value will no doubt raise hell against the person or persons concerned and I am afraid this happened to the Combat Commander, who has just known Acio in but a short time. In passing, I wish to mention here the fact that a big number of the members of Company "D" are Cabatuan boys and the interests and welfare of the barrio people are unquestionably in their hearts, not only in Acio's. Hence, Acio cannot fully justify his accusations and charges without committing perjury and injustice to himself, especially the boys in this Co. against whom he may have personal grudges and ill-feelings.
6. A large number of the boys in this Company fought with me in Bataan. Some of them were those whom I brought to the CP, while the remaining few are Urmaneta's men. Volunteers as they are, they are now trained and well trimmed to fight. I am proud to say that I have gained their full confidence and on my part I have learned their ways and whims. Because of this, if, in the opinion of the Bn. Commander and in spite of Special Orders No. 2 dated Jan., something could still be done to keep the chief command of this Company in its status quo to give me a chance to prove my worth and to finish the tasks I am in, I would be very grateful beyond telling.
7. This is now M-Day for us. We are concerned more with the tasks assigned us than mending fences. But it is only my sincere wish and desire that things are placed in their proper lights and where they ought to be. With regards to these apparent misunderstandings, I consider this matter closed, as what is done is done. I believe myself to be a good soldier and, as such, I am duty bound to obey. We have a cause to defend and all soldiers, regardless of rank and creed, must fight and fight hard.



I wish to inform you that the supplies (except the salt which is my own private property and sent by my wife) were voluntarily offered to us by the loyal good friends in Cabatuan who are relatives of the soldiers in my company. We did not ask for them. We have plenty in our sector, but I thought it would be improper and disrespectful to refuse the offer.

2. We are in bad need of salt, which is scarce in this sector. The only place of source, we know of, is Cabatuan. I referred the matter of securing the commodity to the En. Commander and he told me to get it where it is available.

3. If, as you mentioned to one of my men, I will be demoted for accepting the generous but unsolicited offer of the civilian friends and my getting at home for the use of this Company, I will gladly accept what is due me, knowing that my act is nothing but sustaining the breadline of my men.

4. I am more than willing to meet you, as per your suggestion, for a conference but I am sorry to say that there are many pressing problems of the Company which require my personal and immediate attention. I hope you can postpone it for a later date.

5. Hope for more cooperation and coordination.

SUBJECT: Re Information
TO : CO, 1st Bn. 14th Infantry


1. I wish to submit for your perusal and information the attached copy of a letter I received from the Commanding Officer of the Combat Co. and my reply thereto.

2. The supplies in question, ^{stored at Camuto pending their transit to this Hq.} such as, 2 hogs, more than 20 chickens, about 5 gantas of salt, some eggs and vegetables (camotes, gabi and others which we intended to send to the Bn. CP together with the mongos and beans requested of us) were intercepted by the Combat Co. The accusation that we are getting food supplies in Cabatuan is unfounded. This is our first time to receive food supplies and unrequisioned at that.

3. Attention is requested to Par. 3 of my reply. I consider a Commander's telling an enlisted man of what happened or what is to happen to a brother officer unethical and very unbecoming. It appears the more ugly in that the officer concerned in this particular case happens to be the Commanding Officer of the enlisted man to whom such information, degrading and insulting under the circumstances, was given.

4. I should like to make myself understood with regards to this case. I do not have the least grudge or ill-feeling against Lt. Gapasin. Nevertheless, it is my belief that little and insignificant the matter might seem, yet, if not brought to the attention of proper authorities, a more serious misunderstanding on his part may ensue; hence, this letter.

SUBJECT: Re Activities in our sector
TO : CO, 1st Bn. 14th Infantry

1. The following detailed reports on the second raid at the Gamu Japanese Garrison are hereby submitted for your information and record:

a. At 2:00 p.m. Friday, Jan. 26th, a patrol consisting of 30 rifle men under Lt. Damaso A. Acosta went to Gamu and raid the Japanese Garrison for the second time this month. The patrol reached Gamu at 2:00 a.m. the next day and later deployed on the south side 50 meters away from the garrison. Two and a half hours later the patrol leader was informed of the presence of the Combat Company and immediately an arrangement was made for them to occupy the left flank.

b. The first shot was fired at 5:30 a.m. by the Combat Company followed by successive trench mortar fire. Both patrols mercilessly battered the garrison and the kitchen where our patrol killed 4 Japs. Two or three others were believed killed by the Combat Company under the garrison. There was a lull and again both patrols returned the firing by the Japs. After this time, however, all the returning Japs (about 9 or 10) had sought cover the their fox holes.

c. The exchange of fire between the two patrols and the very much awed defenders continued until 10:00 o'clock in the morning. Believing that the Japs were very much secure in their hiding places as was experienced in the first raid, the two patrol leaders withdrew their respective forces and left Gamu without any casualty.

d. The absence of a machine gun used by the defenders was noticeable. Only one trench mortar and a few rifles are the only arms, but in view of the terrain the attackers could not advance without sacrificing their lives.

2. Another attack is being contemplated in the near future and new and different tactics may be employed.

3. The blasting of bridges along Highway No. 5 will soon be undertaken if the weather permits.

3. News have reached this Hqs that 35 Japs from Naguilian as a reinforcement of the Gamu Japs Garrison arrived at Gamu last night. They are heard to have said that they may go out on patrol. At this time of writing a patrol of this company was dispatched to intercept them just in case.

SUBJECT: Reports, Miscellaneous
TO : CO., 1st Bn. 14th Inf.

1. This is to inform you of the joint occupation of Gamu by the Combat Co. and the "D" Co. At 1:00 p.m. Tuesday, Jan. 30th, the American flag was hoisted at the Municipal building by members of this company and followed by the proclamation by the undersigned of the liberation of the town and the people from the clutches of the Japs and and Cataluna. A short ceremony followed this proclamation in which the Combat Co. and this Co. jointly participated. Both units of both companies played also important roles.

2. The Japanese, (30 in all) sensing another raid from this company or having learned of our (intention to raid them in the afternoon of the 30th), took a French leave at early dawn or about that time. According to our information, the Japs, earlier in the afternoon of the 29th told some civilians that they were going out on patrol. Upon learning of this, we made ready and posted patrols at strategic points to meet them. No Japs patrol came in view so our patrols proceeded to Gamu and found them gone to Ilagan. Cataluna, his family and henchmen also left.


3. The garrison and trenches in Gamu were destroyed and the fox holes filled up. All valuable supplies were confiscated and divided between the two companies. The Japanese war notes found in the safes of the Treasurer, Post Office and the Gumai were turned over to the Treasurer of Gamu with instruction that employees and teachers be paid accordingly.

4. All the cavans of palay in the Gumai storeroom were taken by the Combat Co. Those we got and in transit to this Camp were intercepted by them in spite of our agreement with the patrol leader that supplies and palay be divided on the 50-50 basis. Of course, this is no complaint but only an information, knowing that the supply is for the Army just the same. I feel, however, that my company must be entitled as much as the Combat is to any of the spoils since it was my Co. that pestered and drove the Japs and Cataluna out of town and cleaned the place of its bad eggs.

5. Many prisoners, suspected ganaps, were taken. In this connection, please furnish us with a list of those who are to be executed for our guidance now and in the future.

6. Our daily patrols are concerned with ambushing Japanese trucks and foot troops. A special patrol is also in Ilagan now specifically instructed to watch every move of Cataluna and henchmen and to finish them if there is a chance.

7. Final report on our second raid: 4 Japs killed, 3 seriously wounded but later died. Total dead= 7. (As of Jan. 27th in compliance with Combat orders dated January 14, 1945, re attacking small garrisons).

1. We moved our armed men to Sta. Isabel this morning (before the receipt of this order) with the S-2 personnel with the instructions to make reconnaissance for ambushing along the Provincial Road. Patrol leader Lt. Acosta.

2. Yesterday afternoon the patrol which I sent to ambush enemies passing thru the Cagayan River (Pilar) arrived. They found that the Japs no longer use the river for movement of troops. Patrol leader Lt. Cadiente.

3. Only a few unarmed men and the Hq. are now at Camp Romulo. The rest of the unarmed were sent out to convoy the arms as per your Memo. dated 21 Jan. 45. Convoy leader Lt. Peragas. Lt. Santos is now recovering. Dr. Lora and Mr. Gabriel are attending him. Lt. Cadiente is sick in quarters.

4. Result of operations as per Field Order # 3 will follow as soon as report of the patrol arrive.

1. Upon receipt of your order to strike camp, we moved to sta. Isabel. This delayed the immediate sending of our patrol out.
2. We confiscated all bancas passing along the Cagayan River bank of sta. Isabel. We were able to confiscate ~~200~~ *250* kilos of iron (bolts, steel rods, G.I. pipes, etc) and lumber intended for the construction and repair of bridges in Tumauni.
3. B.Cs' from Ilagan arrived in waves to surrender to this command. One of them surrendered with a rifle and 16 rounds of ammunition. We also got the sister of Mayor Cataluna in sta. Isabel. Cataluna may surrender here in a few days with his policemen.
4. I sent a patrol to Calamagui 8 Feb. 45, P.M. No report on contact with enemy has as yet arrived.
5. According to S-2 Agents, Japs eyes are directed to sta. Isabel due to people evacuating from Ilagan to sta. Isabel & neighboring barrios.
6. Information is received here from our Bolo Unit that 300 Japs from Ilagan and Echague will raid sta. Isabel and Paragu (see attached ~~true copy~~ of report). Because of this, I am recalling back my patrol in order to put them on the alert.
7. I am sending five (5) men to get our share of the ammunitions.

1. In compliance with Field Order No. 15 and your Confidential Memo re-Prisoners and because of the report of our intelligence that about 200 Japs from Ilagan and Tumauni are preparing to cross the Cagayan River to raid our Camp, we are today recalling our patrol which was dispatched yesterday to ambush the enemy on the other side of the Cagayan River.

2. Sta. Isabel is surrounded by three rivers: the Cagayan, Siffu and Mallig, so that the Japs could penetrate us from many points. However, in order to cope with the situation altho we have but few arms, we have to assign our men to guard the many possible approaches of the enemy within our sector. We need also to post some guards along the Cagayan River to confiscate materials being transported by barangay to be used by the Japs in the repair and construction of bridges.

3. Upon arrival of our patrol, all prisoners who are in our custody will be sent there immediately.

4. soon after everything is cleared up, we will send again another patrol on the other side of the Cagayan River (National Highway No. 5) for the purpose of ambushing the enemy.



SUBJECT: bridges destroyed
TO : CO., 1st bn. 14th Inf.

1. Curilao bridge twenty (20) meters long made of wood and 300 yards away from Origao garrison was blasted by our patrol under Lt. Acosta on 25 Feb. 45. This bridge has now been rendered impassable by foot troops and Motor vehicles. There is no detour in this place. The Japs never attempted to approach the scene of the blasting.



1. several American planes sighted our pannel placed in the vicinity of our Camp and it is now 2 days that they have been flying low over Camp Romulo, Sta. Isabel.


2. It is regretted, however, that at about 5:30 o'clock this morning, a Lockheed plane strafed the northern bank of the Cagayan River just opposite Ilagan and dropped a bomb which almost killed our men deployed on said area.

3. We request, therefore, that the necessary information be relayed to the proper authority to the effect that the bank of the Cagayan River from Barrio Cabanuangan 2, Ilagan to Barrio Paragu, Tumauni guarded by officers and enlisted men of "D" Co. be not molested or subjected to air attack.

4. The Japs now encamped on the other side of the Cagayan River (in Ilagan, Calamague, Bangag, Manaring, San Juan up to Tumauni) are exerting all efforts to cross the river. In 3 days we were able to confiscate 15 bancas of different capacities and 7 big rafts intended to be used by the invading troops, thus foiling their attempt.

5. It is now more than a week that the Japs in Calamague, Paculud (Ilagan), Bangag and Manaring are maintaining river-bank patrols. Outposts are numerous and assigned to duty night and day. Occasionally there is an exchange of fire between our patrols and theirs.
