Subject: Report of enemies.

To : 2-1113.

1. The following activities of enemy is hereby reported.

a. Cl. A, 5-17-44. It is actually observed by reliable agents of this Company that Capt. Higami w/ 6 Japs Inf. and Lts. Villamar and A. Logan had patrol all barrios of Cordon and some barrios of Santiago maltreated civilians peddlers as suspected murderers of the missing Ganaps and Pro-Japs spies.

b. Cl. B, 5-19-44. A Jap officer told to the Ganap Chieftain at Santiago that they (Ganap) will evacuate from the barrios to the town center for safety precautions.

c. Cl. B, 5-20-44. A Jap officer told to all Ganaps that they Japs will not aid and protect them (Ganaps) if they will maltreat civilians without making any investigations before punishing the civilians.

d. Cl. B, 5-21-44. Capt. Higami told to all town Mayors in his district to census all men from the age of 18 to 30 for BC enlistment.

e. Cl. B, 5-22-44. A Jap NCO told to civilians in Cordon that they Japs will not maltreat civilians if there is no report from the town Mayor that they are aiding the hiding elements and PC maltreating civilians without making investigations prior to their punishment will will be reported to the Japs or to the Garrison Commander at Santiago.

f. Cl. C, 5-24-44. Japs Inf. concentrated at Ilagan during the last week of May estimated at 35 to have gone via truck to Tuguegarao.

g. Cl. A, 5-25-44. It is reported by reliable agents of this Co. that they Japs are confiscating Bab-wires for Aparri shipment.

h. Cl. A, 5-26-44. It is reported by reliable agents of this Co. by their actual observation that they Japs are commandeering civilians to work at the constructing of the landing field situated in the vicinity of Santiago estimated to 5 hectares.

i. Cl. B, 5-27-44. A PC officer told to civilians in Cordon that they will fight to the hiding element to their last bullet.

j. Cl. A, 5-28-44. It is reported by reliable civilians at Geyon, Segat, Biling, Cordon that they were maltreated by Lt. A. Logan w/ 20 men targeting the civilians as the one supporting the hiding elements.

k. Cl. A, 5-30-44. It is actually observed by reliable agents of this Company that they Japs are widening the landing field at Uppi, Gamu.

Subject : Weekly Intell. report.

To : 2-1113.

1. The following activities of enemy is hereby reported.

a. Cl. B. 6-1-44. Capt. Higami garrison commander at Santiago told to a public meeting at the Cine Building in Santiago that they Japs are not suppose to patrol in the barrios if not by a request of the Gensans and PC.

b. Cl. B. 6-2-44. The Garrison Commander at Santiago told to all town Mayors in his district that they Japs will confiscate 4 tons of Bobb-wires of every town.

c. Cl. B. 6-3-44. A Jap NCO told to civilians at Ozcaris during the barrio fiesta that they Japs will give up the war this 1944.

d. Cl. C. 6-4-44. Japs MT. concentrated at Echague estimated at 10 to have gone to the North loaded with lumbers,

e. Cl. B. 6-5-44. A Jap MT. driver told to a laborer at the Naric Bodega in Santiago that submarines had been seen at buguey dry, that is why sound of big guns had been heard during the last week of May.

4. Note: Misc. info of enemy garrisons:

a. Gordon Lt. Laurentino Villanueva wf. 25 enlisted men. Occupying the former Hondo Economic School Building. No Japs station.

b. Santiago Capt. Higami wf. 10 Japs Inf. Occupying a private house along the National High way estimated 300 yards West of the Catholic Church. Lt. Beste wf. enlisted men. Occupying the former School building.

c. Esguejor 30 Japs Inf. Occupying the former USAFFE Cadre.

d. Ricardo Pengeniban wf. 25 soldiers.

e. Yoshizawa Capt. Mieta wf. 6 Japs Inf. Occupying the former School Building. PC NCO Binarcos wf. 8 enlisted men.


