GENERAL ORDER
No. 2

1. It is with deep regret that this Headquarters announces the death of Captain Amado D. Castro, Jr., Commanding Officer of the Headquarters Company, Service Troops, Bulacan Military District, on 16th January 1945.

2. Captain Castro, Jr., was born in Kakarong, Bigaa, Bulacan, on April 8, 1921. He was a third year electrical engineering student at Mapua Institute of Technology at the time of the outbreak of World War II and was a Cadet Major in the ROTC Unit of the said school.

3. He first saw service with the Guerrilla Forces when he joined the Fil-Americans in Laguna under Colonel Straughn with the rank of Captain on Nov. 16, 1942. He was captured and concentrated by the Japanese at Sta. Cruz, Laguna, in July and August, 1943. He joined the Bulacan Military District in August, 1944 and was assigned to the Inspector General Staff with the rank of 2nd Lieutenant. He was promoted to Captain on Nov. 1, 1944 and assigned Commanding Officer of the Headquarters Company, Service Troops, which position he held up to the time of his death.

4. While his passing is to be regretted, we should all draw inspiration from his noble example in giving his all to the organization and for the common cause for which we have all been fighting as far back as Bataan and Corregidor.

GENERAL ORDER:
NO: 3

1. It is desired that officers make it clear to their subordinates as well as to the civilian population that any enemy property captured or confiscated by our units automatically become the property of the Government of the United States, so that any person or persons who during raids conducted by our forces loot or take for their own use captured arms, supplies or ammunitions is chargeable for violating the 95th Article of War, and shall be charged accordingly and punished as a courts martial may direct.

2. The Commander of the Combat Troops, as well as other officers assigned to lead raids are responsible that enemy property captured is turned over to the District Commander who will make, at his discretion, proper disposal.

3. Civilians may be allowed to have all rice, and enough clothing material or other articles, not of military nature, enough only for their personal use, and not for purposes of commercializing them.

4. It is desired that all unit Commanders notify all persons concerned to turn over to the District G-4 all military equipment and supplies they have in their possession which they got during the raid in the town of Meycawayan staged on the night of the 20th

5. All military properties now in the possession of troops which participated in the raid will remain in their possession. However, in subsequent raids everything without exception captured from the enemy will be turned over to District Headquarters for disposal.

6. Failure to comply with these orders will be strictly dealt with.



GENERAL ORDER:
NO. 9

1. It is with deep regret that this Headquarters announces the death of 1st Lieutenant Olimpio Abacan, (GPOP), on duty with the G-2 Section, Headquarters, Bulacan Military District, EAST CENTRAL HONON GUERRILLA AREA, at Perez, Meycauayan, Bulacan during an encounter against the Japanese threat on 16 February '45.

2. Lt. Abacan was born on August 15, 1921. He graduated as salutatorian in the Meycauayan Institute, Class of 1939. At the outbreak of World War II, he was a plebe in the Philippine Military Academy. He was a second year pre-law student before he entered the Academy.

3. He saw service with the Guerrilla Forces way back in 1942 when he registered with the late Captain Bayani Villarino, MC, USAFFE. He was appointed Acting Chief of Police of Meycauayan, Bulacan in August, 1944. During his incumbency, he has saved his townspeople from the frequent Japanese threats of soulifying Meycauayan. He joined the Bulacan Military District on November 16, 1944. As an operative of the G-2 Section, he furnished complete and reliable information regarding the enemy troops movements.

4. Lt. Abacan symbolizes the true "guerrillero". With no thought of self, he has given his utmost for our cause. He fought valiantly and died gloriously, in the field of battle. We regret that one so true and loyal should die from enemy fire just when complete victory is almost ours, but we should be proud that there are men in our unit like Lt. Abacan who are always ready to fight and if need be, die for the cause of liberation. May his soul rest in peace!
