Supplementary Report of Daily Activities

8 April '45

A platoon of 20 enlisted men was attached to the 57th Division, 148th Infantry, 2nd. Battalion, Headquarters Company, U.S. Army, to help in the general operations.

9 April '45

The men took part in mopping up operations in Burgos, La Union. Result: Killed 2 Japanese snipers, captured 2 Japanese rifles and handgrenades which were turned over to the officer of the above mentioned American unit.

10 to 13 April '45

A platoon of 35 men under Sgt. Feliciano Paje, aided the American Forces in the mopping up operations in the vicinity of Zablan, Mt. Province. They helped in the transport and delivery of supplies and ammunitions for the American units operating in the area. They also helped in the evacuation of wounded soldiers from the firing line to places of safety behind the line.

14 to 18 April '45

The same assignments were performed as of 10 to 13 April '45 in the vicinity of Erisan, Yagyagan, Mt. Province. Result: Killed 2 Japanese snipers in anti-sniping operations.

19 April to 1 May '45

The same men took part in the general mopping up operations in the vicinity of Baguio. Other assignments as on the previous days were further performed.

30 April '45

Report of Daily Activities

12 February '45

Major Emilio Garcia, commander, 3rd. Battalion, reports that on this day he attached five (5) men of his battalion to the 1st. Cavalry Division, spearhead of the 8th Army, under 2nd. Lt. Cauer, These five men were under the command of 2nd. Lt. Domingo Badoo of Co. "I", with instruction to serve ~~unnoticed~~ the American troops carefully and faithfully, showing the Japanese foxholes, planted mines, etc.

13 February '45

These men participated in mopping up operations with the American troops in barrio Rosario, Bagumbayan, Olong, unto within the vicinity of the town of Pasig. These men, after five days of satisfactory service, were given leave to return to this headquarters.

22 February '45

On their way back to this headquarters, they attacked and killed a Japanese sniper and caught three (3) Makapilis. The latter were taken to our headquarters for investigation. Result: Two of these men were Japanese allies and the other man was innocent. We turned them over to the officer ~~of~~ the Military Police for custody.

30 April '45

Report of Daily Activities

9 February '45

Major Emilio Garcia reports that he had on this day attached two squads of 14 men under Supply Sgt. Ruperto Deacon to the 8th Cavalry, 1st. and 2nd. squadrons, under the direct command of S/1st. Lt. Wayne, USA. This was the first officer and his men to cross the Pasig river and later quartered themselves in Sta. Ana Cabaret for sometime.

10 to 15 February '45

The above mentioned men did invaluable services to the American Forces to which they were attached by guiding them, engaging in anti-sniping operations, pointing out planted mines and enemy foxholes, etc. These men stayed with the Americans for five days.

16 to 24 February '45

On their way back to the headquarters, the men engaged in mopping up operation from town to town. Result: Killed four (4) Japanese snipers and captured one machine gun, one Japanese rifle, and two American rifles (Bridstone and Remington, respectively) and five handgrenades. These firearms were in our possession but had reported the same to the CIC then stationed in our place under 1st. Lt. R. L. Harrison.

REPORT OF DAILY ACTIVITIES

4 February '45

All officers and enlisted men of this battalion (1st. Bn., Kelly Regiment) reported for duty at battalion headquarters then located in Sampaloc, Manila, early 4 February '45. Orders were given to assist the American armed forces operating North of the Pasig river. In that afternoon 15 Japanese were captured by armed men of this battalion on Lepanto street. The captives resisted, and were killed in the struggle that ensued.

5 February '45

Early Sunday morning, a Japanese civilian was captured by men of the 1st. Battalion. He was taken to Sto. Tomas University for custody by the American forces then quartered there. The man was killed on the way as he tried to escape from his captors.

On this date, 5 February '45, 1st. Battalion patrol captured seven rifles from the so-called Peace Army with headquarters at Juan Luna Elementary School, Sampaloc, Manila. Late in the afternoon of this same day, the same patrol captured the following:

- 1 Machine gun Cal. 30,
- 1 Box of ammunition with cartridges,
- 1 Box of films, and
- 1 Photographic equipment

The gun and equipment above mentioned were turned over to Mr. Tuthill of the CIC whose quarters was then located at Sto. Tomas University Building.

On that same day, 5 February '45, men of the 3rd. Battalion reported for duty at the Battalion Headquarters then located near Nielson Airfield, and organized themselves into companies. Major Emilio Garcia, battalion commander, ordered five of his officers to go around the place to find a suitable point for lookout, and posted men around the headquarters.

6 February '45

On this date, two (2) Japanese soldiers, wearing a typical Filipino mestiza dress, were shot and killed by men of the 1st. Battalion as they tried to escape from their custody.

On this same date, men of the 3rd. Battalion engaged in mopping up operations in the vicinity of San Pedro Makati, captured two Filipinos of suspicious character. On close investigation they were found to be

spies under the employ of the Japanese Imperial Forces. They were confined in the battalion headquarters, and as they set fire to the building that they might escape in the ensuing commotion, they were fired upon and killed by the sentry on duty.

On the evening of this same date, Intramuros was destroyed by fire. Report received from the 4th Battalion headquarters informed the Regimental Commander of the Kelly Regiment that all records of its activities were burned to ashes.

7 February '45

Elements of the 1st. Battalion arrested five (5) Taiwanese members of the Japanese Labor Battalion, at the corner of Sobriedad and General Geronimo Streets, Sampaloc, Manila. They were turned over to the CIC for questioning. On the same day, the following officers and enlisted men of this same unit, attached themselves temporarily to the 672nd Amphibian Tractor Battalion for action on the South side of the Pasig river, particularly in the districts of Pandacan, Paco, Malate and Ermita. The American contingent was under the command of Capt. Bullard. They are:

To these men of the 1st. Battalion, goes some credit for the liberation of more than 2,200 internees at Los Baños Internment Camp, since some of these men were with the liberation forces that rescued them.

Early this morning, (7 Feb. '45), we observed four Japanese snipers passed our place. We attacked and killed all of them.

8 February '45

A patrol from the 1st. Battalion visited the residence of a certain Einosuke Taniguchi on Azcarraga, Pasaje Lichauco, where they seized two big envelopes containing valuable documents which later were turned over to the CIC for translation. This was acknowledged by the CIC with receipts signed by Mr. Willis J. Clemens, S.A.CIC, 308th CIC Det. 6th Army.

Late in the afternoon of this same day, the men from the 672nd Amphibian Tractor Battalion arrived at the headquarters of this battalion and requested for new assignment. Major Garcia ordered them to report back to Capt. Bullard of the Amphibious Tractor Battalion and continue to assist them as guides and interpreters and to stay with them as long as they need their services as such guides and interpreters.

On the other hand, Major Emilio Garcia, Battalion Commander of the 3rd. Bn., reported late this day that, that a Japanese sniper struggling along the Paco railroad track was shot and killed by a sentry. And that about 4 o'clock that afternoon the same sentry shot and killed two more snipers who were armed with

rifles and handgranades as they passed near the battalion headquarters unaware of the presence of our men.

At 5:00 p.m. of 8 February '45 report from the 4th Battalion headquarters informed us to the effect that Major Gervasio J. Figueroa, commander of the said battalion, was taken to Fort Santiago along with approximately 1,500 other civilians (all men), where they were machine gunned and burned. Major Figueroa, however, was able to escape from his cell, jumped and swam across the Pasig river towards the North bank where he was picked up by Chinese guerillas.

9 February '45

Unit from the 1st. Battalion again seized more documents from the residence of E. Taniguchi, which Major Garcia (Sotero) turned over to the CIC with the request that they be examined for what ever information they might yield. This was acknowledged by the CIC with appropriate receipt signed by Mr. Willis J. Clemeens, S.A. CIC, 306th Det. 6th Army.

Knowing that the American forces were already at the other side of the Pasig river, particularly on Sta. Ana Bridge, and were then shelling the Sta. Ana Race Club, Nielson Airfield and Fort Mckinley, Major Emilio Garcia, commander of 3rd Battalion, with some of his men, crossed the Pasig river. On the South bank of the Pasig river they met the American soldiers and immediately looked for the commanding officer to whom they volunteered. They (the American) declined their offer of assistance but asked for some men to act as guides. Major Garcia turned over to them one platoon of his men under Supply Sgt. Ruperto Deanon.

On this same day, Major Gervasio J. Figueroa presented himself, with the help of some Chinese Guerillas, to the G-2 of the advance forces in Grace Park, under Col. Hollman, giving the G-2 the whereabouts of the Japanese soldiers in Intramuros. He worked for two days with them. He drew the map of Intramuros defenses with their corresponding tunnels where the Japanese snipers hid themselves.

10 February '45

As a result of a mopping up operation in which some men of the 1st. Battalion were engaged, 12 snipers were attacked and killed in Pandacan, Paco and Malate.

11 February '45

Today, Major Sotero Garcia turned over to the CIC, at the old Bilibid Prison Compound a Makapili follower named Ignacio Sandicho alias Landicho, 38 years of age, and a resident at 2031 Misericordia street. This man was a watchman for the Susi Suyo, a Japanese warehouse. During the Japanese administration he worked and cooperated with the Japanese Imperial Forces. He caused to be taken to Fort Santiago several Filipinos whom he charged with being pro-American.

12 February '45

Some men of the 1st. Battalion visited the residence of a certain M. Matsumoto where they seized various documents written in Japanese characters. These documents were turned over to the CIC for examination for whatever valuable information they might yield. They were:

- 4 Japanese maps
- 1 Roll of papers written in Japanese characters
- Several pictures and other Japanese papers

An automobile, belonging to this unit, was placed under the care of Mr. D. R. Tuthill of the CIC, with headquarters at Sto. Tomas University building, for his personal use.

12 February '45 at five o'clock in the morning, Major Emilio Garcia, commander of the 3rd. Battalion, sent 26 of his men on mopping up operation in Nielson Airfield, under Capt. Blas Teodoro. Result: The men returned with the report that they killed a sniper inside a dugout.

In the afternoon of this same day, a company of the 3rd. Bn. was sent to barrio Ogong where Japanese snipers and Makapilis were ~~was~~ encamped. The battle that ensued lasted till dusk when our men had to withdraw owing to lack of ammunition.

the following

On this day/report was received from Major Figueroa of the 4th Battalion:

"On 12 February '45, I met Major Manuel F. Cordero, executive officer of the Kelly Regiment, GFCP. He told me, together with all the men to help the liberating forces in the South of the Pasig river. Even before that time, my men were already active operating North of the Pasig river. Captains Romaguera and Varela with their men killed two snipers. I was then brought to Lt. Colonel Paulino L. Briones who gave me orders to help the 145th Infantry Military Police in the anti-sniping operations in Ermita, Malate and Intramuros. We also helped in the maintenance of peace and order and prevent looters from looting enemy properties in those places."

### 13 February '45

The following report was received from the 1st. Battalion Headquarters:

"Upon receipt of a copy of the Provost Marshal's order to surrender all firearms, the following guns were immediately handed over to the Military Police, through Sgt. Rose:

**3rd. Battalion Commander:**

"On this date, I attached five (5) men under 2nd. Lt. Domingo Badeo to the 1st. Cavalry Division, under 2nd. Lt. Gauker"

Another report from the same battalion commander, dated 13 February '45 states as follows:

"I sent out a platoon of 41 men under Capt. Emilio Aberin to do some mopping up operation around Nielson Field. In the afternoon the group reported that they killed two Japanese snipers who were hiding in a deserted house."

In another report the same commander informed this headquarters, (Kelly Regiment's Headquarters) that, after a plan had been agreed upon, the men were drilled for some sort of a bold and surprise raid, after which they marched back to barrio Ogong. Result: Captured two Makapilis and killed 3 Japanese snipers.

On this same date, 13 February '45, the following report was received from the commanding officer, 4th Battalion:

"Our Malacañan boys under 1st. Lt. Benjamin G. Miranda and 2nd. Lt. Benjamin Ibuna, both of whom are college students and R.O.T.C. cadets before the outbreak of the Pacific War, with the aid of Corporals Maximo Castillo and Manuel Maceda and Privates Blanco, Borromeo and several others, under my orders were designated to spy all Japanese and pro-Japanese activities in the Malacañan Compound and its vicinity. These men have been employed in Malacañan Palace even before the war and have voluntarily become members of our battalion after the occupation of Manila by the Japanese Forces in January, 1942. They helped much during the entry of the spearhead of the 1st. Cavalry Division of the 6th Army in Malacañan on February 3, 1945. Lieutenants Miranda and Ibuna played the role of observers at the Palace Tower together with a guerilla member from Cavite, Lt. Mascardo, who is now attached to the 1st. Cavalry Division, to inform the American soldiers while some of the men helped in the procurement of water and food supplies for the liberating forces. While on duty, one of Lt. Miranda's men, Pvt. Rafael Villadelgado, who enlisted in the Philippine Army on the arrival of the Americans, was killed in action. The rest of the men remained at their post for 15 days until they were relieved by enlisted men of the Philippine Army. Unfortunately, however, all the records and other papers relating to the activities of these men were burned in Lt. Miranda's office at the Malacañan garage, including the list of enlisted men under his command."

14 February '45

On the morning of 14 February '45, the 1st. Battalion commander also surrendered to Sgt. Jacob Johnson of the 37th MP Bn., the following rifles:

On this same date, the same commander surrendered to 2nd. Lt. Fred Hailihe, Ordnance Depot, XIV Corps, U.S. Army

one Chevrolet Truck, 1938 model.

On this date, men of 2nd. Battalion, under Major Felizardo Medina, operated with elements of U.S. Infantry under Lt. Kesay. At about noon the men killed two Japanese snipers on their way back to the battalion headquarters.

Report received from the commanding officer of the 3rd. Bn. states that some patrols operating in barrio Bagumbayan killed a total of 21 Japanese snipers in the morning, and 4 Japanese snipers in the afternoon. Two of these men, reports the commander, were lost in this campaign.

15 February '45

Men from the 1st. Battalion, were sent out this morning to look for the Makapilis, Sakdals and other pro-Japanese elements who were known to them even before the arrival of the American Armed Forces.

The following report was received this morning from the commanding officer of the 4th Battalion:

"We operated in Manila with American forces. we led the Americans to the hideout of Japanese snipers and their ammunition dumps. Our work consisted mostly of espionage. We advised looters not to linger around for fear they might be mistaken for Makapilis or Japanese snipers. Capt. Centeno, aided by Sgt. Angel Natividad and their men, killed two Japanese snipers. We also helped in subduing the Japs in Quezon Institute."

16 February '45

On this date, men of the 2nd. Battalion ambushed and killed two Japanese soldiers who were walking along the railroad track in Singalong Subdivision.

During a campaign which took them to barrio Palatiao and barrio Calawaan, men under Major ~~Max~~ Emilio Garcia killed one Japanese sniper.

17 February '45

Sgt. C. Romero, with his anti-snipers squad, headed some elements of the 1st. Cavalry Division Spearhead on anti-snipers operation in areas South of the Pasig river, at the request of Major Shian. This operation lasted about four days. In appreciation of their services, Major Shian presented them with a carbine with several rounds of munition.

On this same day, unit of the 1st. Battalion under Capt. S. Garcia, was sent out on mopping up operation in Pandacan, Paco, Malate and Ermita and succeeded in killing 3 Japanese snipers near the Manila Gas Company. Late in the afternoon, the same unit encountered 2 Japanese snipers in a zacate field

near Beata street, Pandacan. The pair fired as they saw our unit approaching. The men fired back killing the two snipers.

18 February '45

Report received this morning from the commanding officer of 2nd. Battalion, states as follows:

"The anti-sniping squad under Sgt. Armando ~~Kingx~~ Linsangan killed this morning 3 Japanese snipers in the vicinity of San Andrés street."

19 February '45

Received report from the commander of the 4th Battalion to the effect that his men, aside from helping the American forces in the mopping up operations in areas South of the Pasig river, they continued helping them in procuring water and food supplies.

20 February '45

Report from the 1st. Battalion Headquarters states:

"Our unit went out on mopping up operation in Paco, Pandacan, Malate and Ermita."

Report from the 2nd. Battalion Headquarters states:

"The people around the vicinity of our headquarters responded to our appeal for subsistence. They cooperated with us, and reported to us the presence of snipers anywhere they find them."

21 February '45

Sgt. C. Romero of the Hq. & Hq. shot and killed 3 Japanese snipers in the vicinity of Paco Cemetery, and another group of 6 Japanese snipers near the corner of General Luna and Taft Avenue.

Report from the 1st. Battalion Headquarters states:

"Men of this organization were sent out early this morning on anti-sniping operation in Paco, Pandacan, Malate and Ermita."

Report from the 2nd. Battalion Headquarters states:

"At about 9:00 a.m., Capt. Regino Manuel of Co. "G", killed one Japanese sniper near Vito Cruz. At 2 p.m., a squad under the command of the same captain ambushed and killed 3 Japanese snipers."

22 February '45

The anti-snipers squad under Lt. J. Ramos, fought and killed 9 Japanese snipers in the vicinity of Padre Faura street and Taft Avenue. This unit belongs to the Hq. & Hq. Battalion, under Major Francisco Mabesa.

- 8 -

Report from the 1st. Battalion Headquarters states:

"Members of the anti-snipers unit went on hunting expedition for the purpose of rounding up members of the Makapili, Sakdals and other pro-Japanese elements in Paco, Pandacan, Malate and Ermita."

Report from the 2nd. Battalion Headquarters states:

"We sent out a squad to patrol our place and burned the tall grasses, searched all the shelters and dugouts and demolished them."

Report from the 3rd. Battalion Headquarters states:

"We sent out patrols, as usual, to all nearby barrios around San Pedro Makati."

23 February '45

In the morning, the anti-snipers squad of this headquarters, (Hq. & Hq.) under Lt. J. Ramos, attacked and killed a total of 8 Japanese snipers in a dugout on Perez street.

Private Bernardo Caballes, Co. "G", 2nd. Bn., was wounded through the right leg in an encounter with Japanese snipers in the vicinity of Vito Rk Cruz.

Major Garcia, commander, 1st. Bn. gave specific instructions to his men to cooperate closely with the American forces found in the field during mopping up operation.

Report from the 2nd. Bn. Hq. states:

"at about 8 a.m. our guards led by Pvt. Bernardo Caballes, attacked and killed 2 snipers, one Japanese and the other a Makapili on Aviadores street. We captured the following:

- 1 Star pin
- 6 Handgrenades and
- 1 Hunting knife

At about 10 a.m., Pvt. Caballes was wounded on the leg by Japanese machine gun fire."

24 February '45

A Japanese sniper was shot and killed at 6 a.m. today by Pvt. M. Mabulay near this headquarters, (Kelly Regiment Hq.)

Report from the 1st. Bn. Hq. states:

"On this day, our unit went to the districts of Paco, Malate, Ermita and Pandacan. This unit attacked and killed 2 Japanese snipers as they came out of their dugout near the South bank of the Pasig river in Pandacan.

At about 9 a.m. today, while Major Felizardo Medina, commander, 2nd. Battalion, was on his way to Co. "G" headquarters, he was

attacked by a sniper. He returned the fire of his assailant killing him on the spot.

Report from the 3rd. Bn. Hq. states:

"A platoon of 41 men went on mopping up operation which took them up to Antipolo, Rizal, where they chased a Japanese sniper. From here, they proceeded to Teresa. Here they attacked and killed 5 Japanese snipers."

Report from the 4th Bn. Hq. states:

"On the evening of 24 February '45, about 8 p.m., Capt. Varela and Capt. Romaguera, together with some men, caught two Japanese snipers passing the the headquarters. They found in their possession a piece of paper about 2 inches in diameter with red edges. Certain message in Japanese characters was written on its face with the number 196 ~~XXXX~~ written in the center. MAGEMA, a word unknown to us, was written on the back.

#### 25 February '45

The anti-snipers squad under Lt. J. Ramos of the Hq. & Hq. Bn., operating with some elements of the 145th Infantry MP Bn., attacked and killed 15 Japanese snipers this morning ~~near the~~ *on* New Tanque street and in the afternoon 6 other snipers were similarly attacked and killed by the same squad in the vicinity of Oregon street.

Report from the 1st. Bn. Hq. states:

"A squad of 8 men went out on mopping up operation in Paco, Malate and Ermita. The men combed all areas covered by tall grasses, and searched all shelters and ~~du~~ dugouts as well as vacant houses in those districts."

Report from the 2nd. Bn. Hq. states:

"At about 5 p.m. Adolfo Feliciano, a resident of Singalong subdivision near Vito Cruz, was apprehended by ~~Sgt.~~ *Sgt.* ~~by~~ ~~xxxx~~ Augusto de Guzman on the act of rolling telephone ~~wire~~ wires used by the American army, at the corner of V. Esguerra and Topacio streets. Upon investigation it was ascertained that the man was innocent and on the personal guarantee of Major Mascardo of Malacañan, he was released."

#### 26 February '45

This morning, the anti-snipers squad, under Lt. J. Ramos, attacked and killed 34 Japanese snipers in the vicinity of Sison street, in cooperation with the American Forces. Private Bienvenido Indaluz was wounded during this operation. He was taken to the U.S. Army hospital in Sta. Ana where he died a few hours after his arrival. A casualty report to this effect was forwarded to the D.C., Naker Division, on the same day for his information and guidance.

- 10 -

Lt. J. Ramos and his men were attacked by Japanese snipers near the bank of the Pasig river in the vicinity of New Tanque street, at 9:30 a.m. today. In this encounter six (6) Japanese snipers were killed. Among the articles captured, included the following:

- 2 Rifles, a Garand and Springfield,
- 1 Japanese seal,
- 1 Picture of an officer killed, eyeglasses,
- 1 Saber belt, and
- 1 Carpenter ruler, and several rounds of ammunition.

Report from the 1st. Battalion Headquarters states:

"We posted men of this battalion near the railroad station in Pandacan, where we previously found handgrenades and bullets in a big bag near that railroad station. Our men searched every passerby at the vicinity."

27 February '45

This afternoon, a Japanese officer and 27 of his men were attacked and killed near Oregon street by men under Lt. J. Ramos. All the sabers and pistols captured in this operation were taken by the Military Police. On the other hand some of the captured articles taken from a Japanese officer were brought to this headquarters (Kelly Regiment Hq.). The dumpy and stinky belongings were ordered burnt.

Report from the 1st. Battalion Headquarters states:

"All men of this Battalion were given instructions by this command, in Military Science and Tactics. Guards were posted in and around the immediate vicinity of our Battalion Headquarters."

28 February '45

Lt. J. Ramos and his anti-snipers squad were assigned to patrol Ermita near the Peralta building on M. H. del Pilar street. There they found five snipers hiding in a toilet of a demolished building. Lt. Ramos was attacked but miraculously escaped injury. He and his men returned the fire killing the snipers. Among the articles captured and taken to this headquarters included the following:

- 1 German lugger,
- 1 Japanese flag,
- 1 Picture of a dead officer, insignia of the dead officer, and some papers in Japanese characters.

1 March '45

This morning, Sgt. Manuel Danao was sent on special detail to contact Private Bernardo Caballes in order to ascertain his condition. Private Caballes is still confined in the U.S. Army hospital suffering from a bullet wound.

Lt. J. Ramos and his men, cooperating with the American Forces in a mopping up operation combed the entire vicinity of the Bay

View Hotel for Japanese snipers. Nothing of any importance occurred during this operation.

Report from the 3rd. Battalion Headquarters states:

"A platoon of 41 men under Capt Emilio Aberin went out on mopping up operation on the North side of Pasig river. Result: Killed two (2) Makapilis armed with bolos and ~~knives~~ knives when they resisted custody and attempted to escape."

2 March '45

A casualty report, Re: wounding and hospitalization of Private Bernarado Caballes, was sent today to the D.C., Nakar Division, for his information and guidance.

The anti-snipers squad under Lt. J. Ramos was on patrol duty in the vicinity of Padre Faura and Taft Avenue the whole day today. No encounter had ever occurred between our men and the Japanese snipers.

3 March '45

As usual, our anti-snipers squad has been in the field the whole day today. However, no encounter ever occurred during the day.

4 March '45

This morning, we drilled 30 of our men for one hour, reports Major Medina from his Battalion Headquarters. The investigation of Mr. Lerma, distributor of PCAU-27, DP-2, for certain anomaly ~~committed~~ committed in the distribution of foodstuffs, was resumed at 11 a.m. today with Lt. R. Manuel and Lt. D. Daclag attending. The case was settled amicably after a brief conference.

An alarm was given at 4 p.m. today to the effect that Japanese snipers were seen at Esguerra and Raymundo streets. Men of the Hq. & Hq. answered the call. Three (3) snipers were accounted for after half an hour battle. One Japanese rifle and two hand-granades were captured. The rifle was surrendered to the Military Police.

5 March '45

Men of this regiment, under Lt. J. Ramos, were assigned to aid the American Forces in mopping up operation in the entire sector South of the Pasig river. No event of any importance occurred today.

Major Ponciano C. Brillante, commander, 1st. battalion of this regiment, was ordered today to establish the battalion headquarters within Intramuros, or in any convenient point in its immediate environ, with specific instructions to cooperate closely with the American Forces operating in that sector.

6 March '45

Today, the anti-snipers squad under Lt. J. Ramos, was ordered

to clear the Intramuros sector of Japanese snipers, in conjunction with the American Forces assigned in that sector. However, no snipers were found in any dugout they had visited.

Report from the 2nd. Battalion Headquarters states:

"An alarm was received in this headquarters to the effect that 8 Japanese soldiers were crossing Vito Cruz street. A platoon was sent to the place. The Japanese were caught in surprise, and in the battle that ensued all were killed. The men captured:

- 1 Japanese machine gun,
- 1 Japanese rifle, and
- several handgrenades

7 March '45

Men of the Hq. & Hq., under Lt. J. Ramos, were assigned to aid the American Forces in mopping up operation in the entire sector South of the Pasig river.

8 March '45

The anti-snipers squad of the Hq. & Hq. under Lt. J. Ramos, in cooperation with the American Forces, combed the entire area around the Bay View Hotel, in a mopping up operation against the Japanese snipers. No Japanese snipers, however, ever attempted to give battle to this contingent.

Report from the 3rd. Battalion Headquarters states:

"On 8 March '45, while many of our men were busy with the American troops in mopping up operations all over the City, some of our officers and sector commanders reported at the Regimental Headquarters in Pao to confer with Lt. Colonel Paulino L. Etienne. We received order for the general mobilization of our men. At this time we turned over to him our papers of enlisted men and out of service. After this was accomplished, we received another order to establish the battalion headquarters on Domingo, Pasay.

9 March '45

Lt. J. Ramos and the Hq. & Hq. anti-snipers squad were today ordered to patrol the immediate vicinity of Intramuros. No events of any importance, however, occurred in that sector during the day.

Report from the 3rd. Battalion Headquarters states:

"On 9 March '45, Major Emilio Garcia, commander, 3rd. Battalion, established his headquarters on Domingo street, Pasay, and immediately started operation in accordance with the following orders:

- (a) To cooperate with the American Forces for the liquidation of Japanese snipers, and
- (b) To organize squads of patrols to maintain peace and order in the locality.

10 March '45

Report was received at this headquarters (Regtl. Hq.) to the effect that Private Amado Hernandez was shot and seriously wounded by Japanese snipers on February 28, while ~~working~~ on patrol duty on "15 de Agosto" street, Pasay. Pvt. Hernandez died on 7 March '45 in a U.S. Army hospital.

Report from the 2nd. Battalion Headquarters states:

"Alarmed that snipers were hiding in thick grasses around the locality where the headquarters of this battalion is located, we sent our men to search and burn the grasses. We caught 3 Japanese snipers near V. Esquerre and Onix streets digging camotes."

11 March '45

Lt. J. Ramos, commanding the anti-snipers squad of the Hq. & Hq., was sent to aid the men of the 145th Infantry MP Bn., to apprehend Japanese snipers reported lurking among the ruins in the ~~vicinity~~ vicinity of Paco Market at 11:30 a.m. During the operation, a Japanese woman, wearing Japanese military uniform, was seriously wounded in the right thigh by one of the Military Police. She was taken to the 145th Infantry Station by a Military Police. The following articles were taken to this headquarters by our men:

- 2 Wallets,
- 1 Pair of eyeglasses,
- 1 Sheet of paper with Japanese characters,
- 1 Metal pin with Japanese characters, and
- 1 Letter signed by Staff Sgt. Vincent Vlenich describing the death of the Japanese woman.

At the request of Mr. John Alley, acting Manager of the Philippine Refining Company and Lt. John V. Mueller of the C.M.P. Provost Marshal, this headquarters assigned two (2) armed guards in the premises of the company for the protection of its property against snipers and looters.

Report from the 3rd. Battalion Headquarters states:

"On 11 March '45, Capt. Jose D. Deanon and 56 of his men came across a Japanese dugout in Culi-Culi near Pasay. After a ~~few minutes~~ brief skirmishes which lasted about an hour, they entered the dugout and found dead bodies riddled with bullets."

12 March '45

Lt. J. Ramos and his anti-snipers squad found 3 snipers in the vicinity of San Marcelino and Colorado streets lurking in a dugout. Lt. Ramos and his men attacked and killed the trio after a brief skirmish, bringing with them to this headquarters the following captured articles:

- 2 Water canteens,
- 1 Identification certificate in Japanese characters

- 12 -

1 Rifle belt,  
1 Cotton belt, and  
1 Japanese cup

A receipt signed by P. Fairchild of Co. "D", 145th Infantry, was turned in by Lt. Ramos to form part of this report.

Pvt. Pablo Andaman was slightly wounded during the operation. A certificate signed by the attending physician was also presented to this headquarters to form part of this report.

13 March '45

Three suspicious individuals from Taguig, Rizal, were held for questioning by order of Major Felizardo Medina, 2nd Bn. commander. They were Salvador Masado, 15, Ramon Garcia, 22, and Agustin Jaranilla. They were released after investigation for lack of evidence.

Report from the 2nd Battalion Headquarters states:

"Major Felizardo Medina and Capt. R. Manuel with three soldiers met a Japanese sniper in civilian clothing. He started shooting at the party the moment he saw them approaching but missed. When we were about to catch him, he shot himself."

14 March '45

Lt. J. Ramos and four men of the anti-snipers squad of the Hq. & Hq. were sent out on patrol duty in San Andres Subdivision at 9 a.m. this morning. This was in compliance with the order of Major Manuel Gordero to clear that ~~subdivision~~ section of Japanese snipers and pro-Japanese elements.

At the request of an American citizen, two (2) armed guards were posted at his residence on Marced street, to protect the family against possible attack by snipers.

Sgt. Catalino Romero and three men of this headquarters held three (3) looters for questioning. On order of Major Baldwin, U.S.A., Sgt. Romero took the men to the Military Police headquarters on Oregon street.

15 March '45

The anti-snipers squad under Lt. J. Ramos today was assigned to do mopping operation in the Philippine General Hospital and its surroundings. No snipers, however, were encountered during the day's operation.

16 March '45

The anti-snipers squad under Lt. J. Ramos was sent on mopping up operation in Intramuros. No enemy was contacted. Two handgrenades were thrown into a dugout. The squad found and brought to this headquarters three (3) belts for infield rifles.

A report received from the 2nd. Battalion Headquarters states:

"A patrol from Co. "F" arrested and detained a certain Laureano de Peralta on a charge of being a Japanese spy. He admitted that he had killed a man named "Pilo", a guerilla member because of a ring. A hunting knife was found in his possession upon his arrest. He also admitted that his brother-in-law possessed a firearm and that the latter is a spy. He said that his brother-in-law is known by the name of Carlos Tamisin. We found him to be innocent of the charges and so he was released."
