SUBJECT: REPORT ON THE PRESENCE OF JAPS  
IN THE VICINITY OF NATUNUAN

To Major Schommer:-

1. Five of my men just arrived from Malaking Pooc and reported that last night Jap soldiers numbering not less than 200 men passed thru the barrier of San Mariano, Municipality of Bauan, and by now these Japs are concentrated in the barrier of Natunuan, San Jose, in a site indicated in the sketch herewith attached. They passed thru San Mariano moving eastward at about 3:00 A. M. today.

2. Majority of said Japs are armed with rifles and the rest armed with bamboo made spears. No exact estimate as to the number of arms can be given. Likewise no description as to the kind of arms the rest of the Japs have can be given because the man was hiding in a place where trees grow in between the point where he was and the road through which the Japs passed.

SUBJECT: Report on Peaceful Surrender of the Japanese  
soldiers in Mt. Macolot Area, Cuenca.

TO : Capt. Lawrence  
S-2, Base "R", Batangas, Batangas

1. On September 5, 1945, the Mayor of Cuenca wrote a letter to the Hon., the Provincial Governor of Batangas requesting for his intervention towards effecting the peaceful surrender of Japanese soldiers in Mt. Macolot. Your office has been furnished a copy of said letter. On Sept. 6, 1945, the Governor wrote a letter to the Commanding Officer, 11th Airborne Division, APO 468, regarding the matter. The Mayor of Cuenca brought the letters to the headquarters of XIV Coprs, Mataasnakahoy. Said letters were transmitted to the Commanding General in Manila.

2. On September 12, 1945, a group of soldiers from the 38th Division came to Cuenca and had a conference with the Mayor. The Mayor led the group to Dita, Cuenca, and there the Commanding Officer, who is a 1st Lieutenant told the Mayor that in a few days they would let loose two Japanese prisoners in the Mt. Macolot to invite the Jap remnants to surrender. On the morning of September 15, 1945, a Japanese Navy Captain with a private were sent to the mountain. The surrender was effected on September 19, 1945, at about 10:00 am.

3. A total of two hundred forty-two (242) Japanese had surrendered. The booty consisted of; 2 heavy machineguns; 4 light machineguns; 4 knee mortars; 126 rifles; and 26 pistols. This booty includes 32 swords or sabers.

4. On September 19 (afternoon after the surrender) & 20, 1945 soldiers of my outfit were sent to the mountain. My men reported that the Japanese burned all their personal belongings such as flags, blankets and clothings, They found women's dresses female hairs sticking to the grounds. These hairs give mute evidence of their taking along with them women but apparently were latter killed. An artillery piece, probably 75 mm. or 31 mm., was left on the top of the mountain.

5. On the night of September 19, 1945, gun reports were heard from the mountain. Evidently, a few Japanese are still left in the mountain, they not having been notified by their comrades who had surrendered in view of the limited time and the continuous rain in those days.

6. Authority is hereby requested for permission to letting the

civilians constituting almost 75% of the population of this town to enter the Mt. Macolot Area. Many of these civilians have their permanent homes on the slopes of said mountain.

7. The surrender of the Japanese in this municipality gave relief to the people here because only then, this town could be said to have been liberated.

1. This Office has no objection to the rehabilitation of Mt. Macolot by civilians from Cuenca and neighboring districts.

2. Investigation of Mt. Macolot by a bomb disposal squad and members of this Office has shown that numerous live hand grenades, rifle grenades, and fuzed knee mortar ammunition were left in the area by the Japanese. A large amount of this ammunition has been rendered unsafe by the Japanese by having pins pulled. Some of this dangerous ammunition also has been so placed that it is a menace to persons wantonly searching caves and similar Japanese positions. In view of this threat coupled with the additional danger brought on by explosives made sensitive through deterioration, it is especially requested that all persons going to the mountain be warned concerning the danger of handling this ammunition.

Note: TRAINING PROGRAM Military Drills

Remarks- Upon receiving orders from the Gen. HQ., to report for military training, all my men went to the Gen. HQ. to begin training on Infantry Drills. After said instructions, we return to our HQ. and as usual continued the job of night guards. No particular incident occurred during the night. May 24, 1945  
May 25, 1945- Instead of going to the Gen. HQ. for the daily drill exercises, permission was granted this unit to continue doing so at our HQ.. Under an R. O. T. C. instructor my men received daily instructions two times a day. During this day my unit in Balagtasin, comprising eight men received their first instruction on Infantry Drills. All were posted as night guards on different post outside the Barrio. Private Gerardo Pérez was sick, not on duty. Signs of enemy presence noted in the vicinity by means of flares and pack-bombs. No encounter so far during the night.

25 May 1945- Fourteen men received instructions on military drills in the morning and fifteen in the afternoon. This afternoon the undersigned received order from Col. Pasia at Pinarungulan to go immediately said place with six men. This night four of my men were detailed in Dita as per order by the Col. No sign of enemy activity observed during the night.

May 26.- All my detachment went to the Gen. HQ. as ordered by the Ex. O. on the morning. Nine men from Balagtasin also went. Stayed the whole day and received further instructions on Infantry Drills. All returned to the HQ. except six from Balagtasin.

SUBJECT: REPORT ON DAILY ACTIVITIES

Ibabao, 26, 1945

May 20-

Scouting and patrolling

To: Putol, Gulod and Bigain

From- 9:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M.

Remarks-

Early in the morning after breakfast, a detachment of eleven soldiers set forth on patrol under the command of the undersigned to the above places. We proceeded to Putol where the day before a report was received to the effect that shots were heard from Japanese snipers directed and fired at the civilians who happened to be there. Traces revealed that the Japs have gone the other night, so we proceeded to Gulod where they may be in hiding, but still they were not located. It was already 12:00 noon, but we proceeded to Bigain Primero where we took lunch and from there we began climbing the Bigain Hill in search of these Japs. We saw again traces of their presence in the vicinity as indicated by their footprints and the newly digging of gabi roots. Probably our presence being detected possibly by their observer, eluded us again to the thick forest. As it was already late in the afternoon, and to continue following them would be too risky, so we proceeded to our H.Q. and arrived 6:00 P.M.

May 21-

No scouting activities this date. Soldiers stayed in the H.Q.

Subject: REPORT ON NIGHT ENCOUNTERS

Place: IBABAO

Within a period of one week our detachment ~~attached to the~~ under my command assigned to this place, had made already three (3) encounters at night against the enemy.

1st. May 17- My detachment consisting only of twelve men that night we were detailed, when a group of Japanese snipers, after calling our attention by firing flares on all directions, attempted to penetrate this barrier possibly to attack the H.Q. I had assigned my men to keep on guard north and south, divided in groups of five. While the southern group was very busy exchanging fire against the enemy who were answering at random, a rattle of machine rifle fire was heard directed against the H.Q., at a distance of only about a hundred yards. I had assigned one soldier and myself on guard, each of us occupying a foxhole. I at once returned the fire and continued doing so for about twenty minutes each time a burst of machine rifle fire came whistling in front of us. My southern group noticing that the enemy had penetrated and was attacking the H.Q. moved from their position and in a flanking movement began firing crossfire against the Japs. The enemy suspecting that they would be encircled began to cease firing and retreated in the dark. Our reconnaissance patrol early in the morning on the battle area found no casualties on the Japs side as they were entrenched in a very good position. Fortunately not one of my soldiers nor the civilians was hit.

SUBJECT: REPORT ON NIGHT ENCOUNTERS

*May*  
Ibabao, 26, 1946

Place- IBABAO

2nd. ENCOUNTER May 20- On the afternoon of this date our detachment was reinforced by four soldiers from the General HQ. Just as usual I posted them at night on different posts outside the Barrio minus two who were always stationed at the HQ, as guards. The Japs flares and occasional shots were then observed on three directions, south, west, and east. My men stationed at the southern end of the barrio were exchanging fire with the Japs who were using this time machine rifles. We discovered later that this was their usual trick of calling the attention of my men, as at about 10:00 we observed a number of flares so close to the barricade at its western side. All of a sudden two of my men whom I sent to guard that sector, opened fire so rapid to call the attention of my men composing the main force who at once moved from their position to reinforce them occupying the left flank. This time the Japs who approached to about a hundred yards, opened fire against us with machine rifles. I ordered rapid fire in return and the battle began. After an hour the Japs ceased firing on account of the superiority of our arms and deadly firing retreating west among the thick forests at the foot of Mt. Macolot. Extraordinary cooperation was shown by the civilians who risked their lives giving us coffee and cigarettes at the firing line for which we are so grateful and for whose cause we are and still willing to defend. Reconnaissance in the morning determined the enemy force to about 20 as their footprints indicate, majority of whom already barefooted. Again this time no casualties were reported on both sides.

3rd. ENCOUNTER May 23- On this date the General HQ, having observed numerous encounters in my sector sent another detachment headed by Maj. Usali, with five men to reinforce us. That night we numbered 20 and were posted again on different parts of the barrio. The whole night was silent unlike the previous nights. Early in the morning after breakfast, my whole force headed by Maj. Usali, went on patrol to hunting Tubig, and Fabian. Result of the Patrol as reported to the HQ, revealed that the Japs who were making nuisance raids the previous nights had retreated to the mountain fastness of Macolot. In the afternoon, Maj. Usali's men proceeded to Pinagtungulan, where they stayed that night so my force was the original one left behind. Just as usual I posted them on their respective posts. Flares were again observed with occasional pack-bombs so peculiar with their rifles. This time the enemy numbering approximately ten (10) concentrated their attack on the northeastern part of the Barrio, but this time they did not use their machine rifles. My initial men who exchanged fire with the enemy were only three assigned to that place. Immediately my main force upon hearing the encounter, went to the scene, and after a brief period of firing the enemy retreated again. This <sup>possibly</sup> some casualties were inflicted on the enemy, as reports from some civilians indicate that they found traces of blood and plenty of cotton stained with blood not too far from the battle area. No casualty so far on our side.

Drainage----adequate drainage. No stagnant water.  
Toilet-----No toilet.  
Fencing-----Spinny wire with bamboo and wood posts (temporary)  
Personnel---No market cleaner. The municipal treasurer is responsible of the cleaning.

Alitagtag---The public market is a temporary one.  
Building----Iron roofing, wood posts and cement post-footing.  
Floor-----Ordinary ground.  
Tables-----Wood and bamboo tables of the vendors expenses.  
Receptacles--several cans for garbage.  
Cuspideres---No spitting boxes.  
Drainage----adequate drainage. No stagnant water.  
Toilet-----One shed of 2 rooms for both sexes. (antipolo aya)  
Fencing-----No fencing of any kind.  
Personnel---No market cleaner. The municipal treasurer is responsible for the cleaning.

SUBJECT: REPORT ON DAILY ACTIVITIES

- May 27- Regular Infantry Drill in the morning. After the drill pre-  
ceded by (5) men of my detachment went to Dita with some civilians to  
Araba (about northeast of our barracks), who were massacred by the Japs at  
civilians killed right on the spot. The five men who were assigned here  
the past week, returned to the Gen. Mq. Continued night guards and  
Patrols. No particular incident occurred till morning.
- May 27- Regular Infantry Drills after breakfast. Six (6) men from  
Balagtacin came for same purpose. After the drill exercises, a lect-  
ure was given to all men by the instructor. Four points were empha-  
zed; 1. Patrolling and Scouting, 2. Military Courtesy, 3. Military  
Hygiene and Sanitation and 4. Manipulation and care of the arms.  
Night guards as usual, no patrol during the night on account of the  
rain. Enemy activity observed, but too far to be given special attention
- May 28- Regular infantry drill in the morning. Special incident worth-  
while reporting- Sgt. Vidal Torres, of my platoon, asked for permission  
asked for permission to visit his orchard at Balagbag. He encountered  
three Japs. about 3:00 P.M. Result of the encounter as reported to the  
Mq. revealed one or two Japs wounded as indicated by blood stains scat-  
tered around. P.M. Drill in the afternoon and continued night guards  
Enemy activity observed but too far to cause much concern. No particular  
incident occurred during the night.
- May 30- Daily drill exercised. Regular night guards posted on different out  
posts. Night patrols observed near Bigain Hill. No incident occurred.
- May 31- All enlisted men went to the Gen. Mq. for arms inspection. A.M.  
Col. Pasia and myself went to Mataas na Kibay, 12:00 noon, returned same  
afternoon, slept at Mq. stayed till noon next day. PM. Usual night guards  
with patrols. No particular incident.
- June 1- Patrol to Bigain Hill A.M. Started 7:00 A.M. returned 12:00 Noon.  
Lt. Luis Usali in charge with ten (10) men. He went to Pinagtungulan  
same day. Usual night guards, no incident.
- June 2- Morning drill 6:00 A.M. - 9:00 A.M. Night guards continued  
No sign of enemy activity.
- June 3- No drill exercised today. Continued night guards. Enemy activity  
observed again with their usual flares and occasional shots. A few shots  
were fired against them, did not answer our challenges.
- June 4- Patrol to Macolet, northeast side. Started 8:00 A.M. and returned 1:  
1:30 P.M. Eight men accompanied civilians from Lubac to help locate remains  
of two civilians massacred by the enemy. Result: Said remains located.  
Continued patrolling the area further up the mountain. No traces of enemy  
presence in the vicinity. P.M. Continued night guards, my detachment  
strengthened by four more soldiers from Ditu. Night patrols reported no  
major enemy activity during the night.

REPORT ON DAILY ACTIVITIES Con't.

June 5- Patrol down the Lake side north side. Ten soldiers under my command accompanied a group of civilians, to Anonang by the lake side for the purpose of gathering bananas. Six men were assigned as advanced patrol to assure the safe passing of the civilians. No traces of enemy presence were observed the whole way. Advanced unit discovered among the houses at the foot of Mukel Hill traces of enemy having lived there the past week. We continued our patrol farther west living behind two men to stand guard on the civilians. Traces of enemy having lived by the lake side were noted as shown by the fact, that young coconut trees were cut as well as banana plants presumably used as food. They must have left the place two or three days ago. We reached as far as Lagas and from there we started up climbing the steep way up. Again traces of enemy presence were noted as indicated by their men footprints around the houses up. We searched every house but found no Japs. We followed the footprints up leading to another house, and there we discovered two big pots filled with cooked camoteng kahoy. Investigation revealed the enemy to number around six because of six buckets scattered around. The Japs might have fled to the thick forests upon discovering our presence. It was already getting dark so we gave up the search and continued our way up. We reached our camp at 6:00 P.M.

June 6- No patrol during the day to give my men rest. Continued the job of night guards.

June 7- No particular activity worth mentioning. Continued night guard and patrolling. No enemy activity worth mentioning.

June 8- Early today my detachment was ordered to proceed to Dita to act as guard while a honorable service was being conducted by the town priest in honor of approximately 100 civilians massacred by the Japs. The remains were buried that day with military honors. Some day my men and some from the Cia. Mg. were posted on different outposts along the National Highway from Dita to Cuenca to assure the safe passing of Lt. Gen. Joseph Stilwell, Commander in Chief of the Allied Armies in Asia who was supposed to pass that way. Guards stayed the whole day but the Gen. was delayed at Bataas at Kahoy, on inspection. P.M. Enemy activity observed during the night, but no particular incident happened.

June 10- Another patrol was sent to Manbog. In the morning and returned 12:00 noon without encounter any enemy. Another unit was sent to Dayagan by the lake side under the command of Sgt. V. Torres. They reported to have encountered four Japs, killed two and wounded the other two. One Jap. rifle was seized, a patrol bag and a sack filled with bananas and camoteng kahoy was captured. Four rounds of ammunition were also confiscated.

June 11- Another patrol unit was sent to same place to verify above report. Enemy presence in the vicinity again observed. We arrived at 11 P.M. 3:00 P.M.

Subject: Report of Activities

To : Major Alexander, 188th. Inf. 11th. Airborne Division  
Matanzas Kahoy, Batangas

Sir:

1. For three successive nights, June 22, 23 & 24 Japs presence at barrio Dita, about 500 meters to the west of barrio Ibabao and ~~at sitio~~ and ~~at sitio~~ Patol, also about half a kilometer to the northeast of poblacion, Cuenca were observed.

2. The detachment under Sgt. V. Torres took charge of the situation and after a brief exchange of shots, the Japs retreated to the mountains. There was no casualty on both sides.

3. In the case of Ibabao the Japs planned a two point penetration into the said barrio, one from the northeast and the other from the southwest. They were also repulsed by the detachment of this unit stationed at Ibabao under the command of Lt. V. Aguila. In the engagement on the night of June 24 a Jeep with American soldiers that was going west probably to Teak was forced to return. There was no casualty on both sides.

4. The remnants of Japanese in the Macolot Area made three attempts to penetrate the poblacion from the northeast corner of the town on the night of June 22, 23 & 24 but the night patrol of this unit posted at the entrance to the town from this direction spied them and they immediately opened fire. Exchange of shots lasted for over an hour in each case. The Japs were forced to retreat. There was no casualty on both sides.

5. At about 4:00 o'clock in the morning of June 26 an unknown number of Japs again came down from the mountains and stole three cows which were left by their respective owners at sitio Patol, about a kilometer to the northeast of the poblacion. Report of this incident was received at the Hq. of this unit early in the morning of the same day and immediately a group of 20 men was sent to pursue the enemy. The guerrillas climbed the Mountain heights and upon reaching the summit (at

highest point) the leader, Lt. Briones, divided the men into two groups of ten each. One group under him and the other under Cpl. Atienza. Cpl. Atienza occupied the left flank and Lt. Briones the right flank. After thus arranging their respective men they began combing the area. They have not gone far in their search for the enemy when Cpl. Atienza saw two Japs sitting under a big tree. Signaling his men

to be very quiet to avoid detection they were able to come close to the Japs. Cpl. Atienza fired at once and one of ~~the~~ the Japs was hit and fell on the ground. The other ran away and was pursued. They fired at the fleeing Japs but because of the thickness of the forest he was able to escape. Traces of blood however,

could be seen on trail taken by him. A dog tag and pocket cover containing bits of papers with Japanese character was found in the body. The left hand was cut and presented to the Hq..

Lt. Briones and his men have not also gone far when he heard some people conversing. Listening intently to determine the direction from which the sound comes and to assure himself whether they were Japs, he was amply rewarded because

after a few minutes he was convinced that the people conversing were really Japs and that they were only a few yards from his position. Creeping through the thick forest they advanced and looking through the bushes, Lt. Briones saw ahead of him at a distance of about 50 yards more or less three Japs. ~~Two of~~ two of whom were conversing and the other one was singing. He gave the signal to fire. Two Japs fled, the other one entered the cave and threw stones at the guerrillas,

Sir:

1. On April 1, 1945 five men of this unit under the command of Major Jose Mendoza encountered eight (8) Japs between the barrios of Pila, Bawan and Munlawen, Alitagtag, and they killed one Jap and seriously wounded three (3) others. The wounded Japs were carried by their comrades. No casualty on the side of the guerrillas.
2. On April 2, 1945 the same group of this Unit encountered fifteen (15) Japs in the same place referred to in No. 1, above, killing three Japs and wounding five (5) others. There was no casualty on the side of the guerrillas. Booty consisted of: two rifles, one in good condition and the other entirely broken; (2) one Jap flag; (1) one officer's saber which was shattered to pieces by bullets from a garand; and (4) four trench mortar snells.
