SUBJECT: REPORT.

TO : SACRIFICING OFFICER, Marabute Regiment -

1. In compliance with instructions of the Executive Officer to report on Jap activity during and after the battle, the following is a summary of Jap activity:

JAP STATION, SURROUND, AND ACTIVITIES:

1. Marabute Town:

- a. strength - About 300 Jap soldiers
- b. Arms and Ammunition:
 - (3) col. 50 Machine Gun
 - (1) col. 50 "
 - (5) col. 50 "
 - (1) 47 mm. cannon
 - One hundred seventy (170) rifles
 - Undetermined number of ammunition

2. Marabute Island:

- a. strength - About 300 Jap soldiers
- b. Arms and Ammunition:
 - Forty (40) rifles
 - One (1) 47 mm. cannon

3. Barrio Natunggan, Barrio Island:

- a. strength - About 300 Jap soldiers
- b. Arms and Ammunition: - Not yet ascertained

JAP ACTIVITIES:

- 23 Nov. 1944; 4:50 PM - Three (3) Japanese paratroopers were seen flying at a very low altitude over Marabute Island. Direction West to East.
- 23 Nov. 1944; 11:00 PM - One (1) Jap launch was seen leaving Marabute town landing (The launch could not be ascertained) the launch was abandoned. Destination unknown.
- 7:00 PM - Two (2) Jap bombers flew over Marabute town, flying at a very low altitude. Direction East to West to West.
- 8:00 AM - One (1) grenade explosion was heard from the town of Marabute.
- 10:00 AM - One (1) Jap plane flew over Barrio Natunggan, Barrio Island, flying at a very low altitude. Direction South to North.
- 24 Nov. 1944; 12:00 Midnight - Jap ship (USS Yorktown) passed Marabute anchorage between Marabute and Marabute provinces. The ship headed south to Marabute.
- 8:30 AM - Eleven (11) Jap planes landed Marabute town. During the landing the Japs fired at the plane with 37 mm. cannon.
- 8:00 AM - Four (4) Japanese transports passed Marabute pt. C. They landed and finally anchored at Barrio Natunggan at 9:00 AM. The transports came from north.

- 24 Nov. 1944; 8:00 AM - A Jap plane was seen flying over at a very low altitude over Marabute pt. Marabute town.
- 26 Nov. 1944; 9:00 AM - Two (2) Japanese planes were seen flying around Marabute. Finally they landed on the private landing field. The planes upon landing were immediately covered with

- 26 Nov. '44; 11:00 AM - Three (3) Jap bombers flew over Lieueser pt., Makate Point at a low altitude. Direction Southeast to northwest.
- 11:00 AM - Three (3) Jap planes coming from the direction of Ticao Island dropped four (4) bombs in Barrio Dean, Makate.
- 2:00 AM - Three (3) armed Jap soldiers landed at sitio petateosa, San Jacinto, Ticao Island. When the soldiers saw the lone guard they threw their guns and ammunition and ran away. Three (3) US rifles and 374 rounds of ammunition and a bayonet were taken from the Jap soldiers surrendered, and are now in the custody of a Sergeant by the name of Agallit.

INCIDENTS:

- 24 Nov. '44; 9:30 AM - Sixteen (16) Allied planes raided Makate Point. Eight (8) light bombs were dropped, three (3) bombs fell into the sea. Two (2) bombs were dropped in Barrio Tigbao destroying one (1) Jap plane and bomb dropped at Dingo st. The rest of the bombs were dropped in the mangroves situated in the northern part of Makate. A Jap Launch which took refuge in Barrio Sagardi was sunk by // bombs. Six (6) planes that left Makate and machine-gunned the Centre. The raid lasted for thirty-five (35) minutes.
- 1:30 AM - seven (7) American planes appeared over the town of Cotaciffan and sighted four (4) Jap ships anchored at Barrio pition, Cotaciffan. The ships were 8000, three (3) were sunk while the other managed to escape. There are no navy survivors in Barrio pition, P. Sagardi or L. L. L. However Japanese soldiers estimated to be not less than 10000 were // and // by the plane. The Japs are still in the barrios above-mentioned.
- 25 Nov. '44; 9:15 AM - Eight (8) US planes from the East raided Makate for fifteen (15) minutes. Eight (8) bombs were dropped. Two (2) of which fell into the sea.
- 26 Nov. '44; 10:00 AM - Three (3) US planes dropped three (3) bombs on the sea near Barrio Makate, Makate. The objectives were the submarine.
- 24 Nov. '44; - In the afternoon of this day 4 American plane bomb were struffed the five (5) Motor boat anchored at Jattelle Island, resulting in four (4) Jap casualties, none of the motor boats were sunk.
- 26 Nov. '44; A small unit of our soldiers encountered a number of Japs who were running along the shore of Makate Barrio of Cotaciffan. Seven (7) Japs were killed. These Japs are part of the Japs survivors, from three (3) Jap ships that were sunk by Allied planes in said Barrio.
- 28 Nov. '44; The three (3) Jap aviators who landed in Barrio Tigbao when their plane crashed was encountered at Barrio Simaleigan, Milagro by the Army composed of six (6) soldiers. Two aviator was killed and one ~~was~~ One (1) aviator is still at large.

JAP PLANES CRASHED:

- 18 Nov. '44; One (1) Jap bomber crashed near the shore of El West, Suris Is.
- 25 Nov. '44; One (1) Jap plane made a forced landing in Barrio Tigbao, Milagro. The three (3) Japs from the plane paddled to one shore to Tigbao. The Jap aviator shot to death the Barrio lieutenant of Tigbao.
- 25 Nov. '44 6:30 PM - One (1) Jap plane crashed in Barrio Tigbao, Cotaciffan. The aviator was killed and the three aviators were burned to death. One (1) Machine gun, 30 cal. and one (1) pistol cal. 38 were captured.
- 26 Nov. '44; 7:00 AM - The propeller and other parts of the plane which crashed near the shore of Makate, Makate, Dingo st. were recovered.

BOAT ACTIVITIES (Additional Report):

- 29 Nov. '44; four (4) Japanese Transports anchored at Makate Harbor, (Palanghato) heavily surveilled.

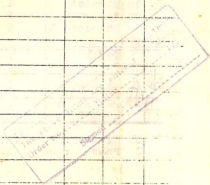
