(1) Impress always to the civilians the existence of the Army, its mission and relation with them. Let them realize that the Army is constantly around to watch them, impress to them that they are not at liberty to do whatever they please. (2) Staging little action once in a while to check small enemy patrols going to interior barrios. Also make little scenes to cigilians inside enemy garrifons by sniping RONDAS and H.G. cooperating with the enemy. (5) Intensive campaign against 5th columns and spies. Stage an objective and actual demonstration of how a 5th columnist or spy will die or punished if so proven.
