17-23 Lambayagan, Sibulan, Antique-camp and outpost duties

MARCH '44

- 1 Lambayagan, Sibulan, Antique-sections assembled at CO HQ security area ready for movement and to receive new arms and ammunitions.
- 2 Langka, San Joaquin, Iloilo-company assigned to San Joaquin sector. Left Lambayagan at 7:00 AM; arrived Langka 11:00 AM. Distance covered by march 8 kms. Sections distributed to cover approaches to security area, reconsimering parties under CO and XX. O left for the poblacion and vicinity, same returned at night.
- 4 Company prepared for the raid on the enemy garrison. At 5:00 PM company moved for the attack.
- 5 Company in attack led by the CO assisted by the px. O and all Junior Officers. Engagement began at 6:00 AM and lasted at 4:00 PM when company withdrew. 70 Japs 2 BU killed and 4 wounded while one killed and one wounded on our part. This was the fiercest enemy encounter the company had.
- 6 Company returned to CO. security area. sections moved to their designated areas.
- 7-12 Usual camp and outpost duties
- 13 A sqd of E-1 under Sgt. Millondage ambushed enemy at Apdo, Antique killing four and wounding two.  
At the same day a patrol under Lt. Tiquillo ambushed enemy at Sisaragan bridge inflicting 3 casualties on the enemy.
- 14-20 Usual camp and outpost duties.
- 21 2 sections under the CO moved for reinforcement to Sibulan sector and to ambush enemy. Sections returned at night without effecting any ambuscade.
- 23-24 Usual camp and outpost duties.
- 25-26 3/4 of the force under the CO moved to Bayawan for ambuscade. Enemy numbering 100 was encountered by the force inflicting 18 casualties of the enemy while two on our side were reported killed.
- 27 On the same date Lt. Tiquillo ambushed enemy at Matalag killing five.
- 28 At 6:00 AM around 200 Japs attacked CO. HQ. A three hour engagement ensued with 12 enemy killed. Troop with drew and the enemy burned the CO. HQ. At the same time E-2 under Lt. Macuja engaged enemy at Room for the whole day. Enemy casualty was reported to five.
- 29-31 Igillico, San Joaquin-because of the penetration CO took this place as security-area. sections returned to respective areas.

FOR NOVEMBER

16	Japs penetrated Sectors II and III. Lt. RAMA, Sector Leader of Sector II having received the "Lie Low" order, did not give any resistance but withdrew with his men for the Security Area. Lt. MUNERA of Sector III was not able to receive the order on time. At noon he ambushed a group of 60 of the enemy armed with MGs, 20s, and rifles who were hunting among the houses in Barrio Ibitan (Sibaleo). Casualties were not known.
17	Sectors I and II arrived from the field. Section II reported they were fired upon by Japs numbering 70 at Igellico (San Joaquin) as they passed that barrio for the Security Area. The two sections returned without a single loss of life.
18	Section III arrived. A noon firing was heard at Langao (San Joaquin). Reports were received later that the Japs who fired on the men of Section II at Igellico had moved down the Isarawagan River and were fired upon by a platoon of BDRR "H". This firing was made to slacken the advance of the enemy while the rest of the company (2) withdrew for safety. Meanwhile the 2nd Hqs and the 3rd and 4th Platoons of the unit (our unit) withdrew for the mountains of Langao. The 3rd Rgt and the 1st and 2nd Platoons remained in their respective bivouacs for there was less danger here of being located by the enemy.
19	Before sunrise the Japs began burning Barrio Rabeng which is just above Langao and about 1-1/2 hrs SW of the 3rd and 4th Platoons' bivouac. Smoke was seen rising from the barrio while occasionally shots from the enemy's rifles were heard the whole day.
20	Early in the morning reports were received that the enemy had left Barrio Rabeng and went in the direction where the 1st Hqs and the 3rd and 4th Platoons of our unit withdrew, passing through Tibuban where the two platoons were bivouaced. Luckily the enemy did not see the huts for it was dark when they passed. A patrol was sent to Tibuban to verify the destruction wrought by the enemy. It was found that many houses and rice stacks were burned, cattle, pigs, and chickens carried away, and several persons including two members of Lt. Col. GRANDJEAN's family were killed.
21	Japs proceeded to the coast of San Joaquin where they behaved properly. There they no longer burned houses nor killed people they saw.
22	Reports were received that the enemy had gone away. With danger from them gone, all the Platoons returned to their former bivouacs to resume garrison duties.
22-3	Usual garrison duties.

 4 : 4:00 AM firing was heard in the different Jap posts assigned to the unit. All the combat sections had launched their attack. The fight lasted till daybreak. None of the sections was able to capture the posts assigned due to the fact that the enemy was warned by their electrical devices and because the enemy fire was superior. All sections withdrew to their assembly areas with instructions to resume further operations (ambuscades) against the enemy.  
 5-13 : Situation unchanged.  
 13 : Sounds of an encounter was heard in the direction of ROME "E's" sector. Reports were received later that a platoon of ROME "E" had ambushed a big number of the enemy inflicting several casualties on them. At night reports were also received that the enemy would penetrate our sector. Preparations were made to give them a reception.  
 14 : A little past 8:00 AM enemy came, not knowing that a section was ready for them. As they were between 70-80 yards away they were fired upon. There were three successive ambushes. As a result 20 of the 130-140 Japs and WDCs were slain. None was slain on our side.  
 15 : All clear.
