

3. Activities

a. Antonio Jucon was sent out by the kempie to procure informations at Baic - Tanjay area. Rode in a banca posing as a fisherman. Headed for Santander (Cebu) and bought eggs, corn, etc and brought it to Baic, anchoring at Montenegro's wharf. He has a USFIP friend at Cambulao and a sister at Pokong Dasu. On returning he passed Santander and bought "Cemals", "Lucky Strikes", and foodstuffs and brought it to Dumaguete. Made several trips to these areas. Informations procured - presence of Americans in Tanjay, landing of American planes at Manipis and also the moving out of USFIPs to Negros Occidental.

b. Alipio ? was sent out by the kempie passing Calo. Intercepted by USFIPs at Araquitán and informed them that he came from Calo. Later landed at Tamisu. On the way back he passed Santander. Informations procured - exact location of installations at Tanjay cadre.

c. Capatas in the landing Field, now residing in Tanjay, was sent out by the kempie to Tanjay area. Informations procured - exact locations of radio stations.

d. Tony Jubela is a nephew of Major Flores and usually spies on civilians collaborating with USFIPs.

e. William Raymond is now living with Lajato. Fond of blackmails and usually indicates installation to the kempie, in the mountains. Furnished maps about these areas.

f. Agapito Longa who was recently married to a Diago girl, is an informer. He was the one who reported Miciano to the kempie as a spy of USFIPs.

g. Joao Arrieta (the slim one) is an informer of the kempie.

h. Narciso Infante was formerly a councilor of Dumaguete and sent out by the kempie to the mountains to locate exact location of USFIP's camps.

i. Mafcelino Catan was formerly living in Candaway. He used to sent runners to the Japs incase USFIPs are around.

j. Manuel Fernandez was formerly a policeman. Sent out by kempies to nab suspicious persons.

k. ? Oracoy was formerly a road maintenance capataz. He is also an informer.

l. Maria Davis Amigo is an agent of Lt Meri. She is always seen going to Meri's house. Conducted many rackets and usually solicits contributions which never reached the USFIPs.

m. Vicente Bayona was formerly a noted whit slave procurer. He is an informer of both the kempie and the libetal.

n. Maura Catan is a member of Lajato's ring. She was sent out to the mountains of Dumaguete to locate USFIP's installations.

o. "Tinay" Melon vda de Diaz is an informer. She usually points out USFIPs and locate installations.

p. Fifiere brothers are informers of Lajato. They are usually seen spying on people.

q. Sgt Fausto Avila is an informer and usually the one who nabbed suspicious persons.

r. A lame man also goes around Dumaguete to look for suspicious persons.

s. A Chinese also an informer, usually spy on civilians.

t. A man with red spots on the right face also informs Lajato about USFIPs.

u. Wife of Sgt Fausto Avila is always sent out on mission to locate USFIP's installations.

v. Teodorico Lajato is the fellow now incharge of demolition of houses in Dumaguete. He usually report both to the kempie and the kobetai.

w. Restituto Villaegas was the fellow who reported about the presence of faked money.

4. Compensation

Agents are not paid regularly but are given rations as a sort of a reward.

5. Puppets

Gov Villaneuva has lost his power and glory. The Japs have lost their confidence in him. He was reported by Restituto Villegas to the kempie that he has yet plenty of foodstuffs and does not share it with the civilians.

Soledad and Lajato are the big shots in this area now. Both of them are also informers.

Raymoundo Villaneuva is the present president of the Kalibapi and recently contributed ₱20,000.00 to the war efforts of Japan.

Cesar Singco is the cry of the poor civilians in Dumaguete. He is the procurement agent of the Japs and usually gets anything by force.
