339— I think that it is important to clear up a thot which may be misunderstood. When I said that the monied men were the ones who attained intellectual and moral improve-

ment, I did not mean to say that it was necessary to be rich to be intellectual and moral, but to have a certain degree of material welfare. Nor do I mean that now the poor cannot attain such improvement, that they are incapable of possessing the moral and intellectual qualities

of the rich. I do mean to say that the progress, which today was within the reach of the poor and of all members of society, was first achieved by those who enjoyed that

material ease to which I have referred. Carriages, tramways, the telephone, the telegraph, artificial light, glassware, porcelain, clothes are all today within the reach of every-

one. In the beginning, after their invention, they were used only by the wealthy on account of their excessive initial cost. Ideas have followed an equal development. Self-respect mistreated, vanity wounded, natural pride offended,

first impelled the wealthy to make personal protests of an egoistic character, and these protests led to self-assertions of a general character,—first, for the individual, then for his race, for his countrymen. As the individual was discontented and had economic independence, his education made him understand the justice of his aspirations for liberty and the inj<sup>n</sup>ce of his oppression.

418 - The German Empire is considered the foremost military nation today; but before it was military, it was, as it still is, highly industrial, - and thanks to its scientific civilization, it obtained its military supremacy. Its military force was created to defend and increase its economic life. Its soldiers and sailors are for the protection of the nation and of its interest in Europe, as well as for the protection of the commercial expansion in the world whose markets are invaded by the products of its industry, marked in the language of commerce par excellence, "Made in Germany." With great reason Herbert Spencer says:

"What makes the relations of cause and effect existing between the industrial order and free institutions more comprehensible is the fact that the countries, where the greatest changes have been brought about in the sense of political liberty, have been industrial countries. Wherever industrial activity and structure are developed, the right of free private examination in religious matters is established little by little at the same time as political rights are established."

Economic development is based on the development of manual labor and of intellectual labor of a productive character. All sociologists and moralists are agreed in recognizing labor as the source of progress and, therefore,

He affirms that ~~the~~ the struggles of the future will take place in the industrial and mercantile arena, and that the less civilized nations will be fatally subservient to the superior peoples, and will see themselves condemned to the most humble and least remunerative industrial labors: in short, that the people of the most inventive genius will be the most powerful.

In olden times, kings and warriors conducted conquests; and for their own interest, subjugated people. Today nations, the peoples themselves, are interested in conquests, or at least in contact with other peoples, guided by economic needs.

The enormous production of machine-manufacturing and applied chemistry pushes on nations of productive activity in the search for new markets for their articles; and wars of expansion and conquest no longer depend on the ambition of a sovereign, but on the necessity felt by the people, the crowds, to convert the whole world into the theater of their industrial and commercial activity.

How to know these conditions, is to be condemned to perpetual inferiority and permanent bondage.
