1. Per broadcasts of KGEL, KGEY and VLC-2, 3 and 4 July 44, Philippine Independence requirement of Congress is that no PUPPET or COLLABORATOR shall HOLD ANY POSITION IN THE GOVERNMENT TO BE ESTABLISHED NOR SHALL THEY BE ENTITLED TO RELIEF OR REHABILITATION.

2. Above significant declaration should encourage all of us. Our privations and sacrifices will not be in vain and we must the Puppets, and Collaborators, because they shall not be entitled to any government position or even relief or rehabilitation. Spies and informers will receive their just "deserts" from USPIR.

3. All Officers of this command specially Intelligence Officers should keep close tabs on persons who accept and discharge functions under the Puppet Government, or collaborate with the enemy as enemy in one way or another and for any length of time from 21 May 42. 

Subject: A Message

To I : The Officers and Men  
2nd Division

At this stage of our existence, I would like to convey this Message to all of YOU, Men of this Command, to remind you of your Sacred Duty to your Country and your Obligations to your fellowmen in the generations to come. I enjoin everyone not to forget the Ideals that prompted us to organize and resist. These ideals embodied in that sacred word, Freedom, should never be cast aside just because of the honeyed utterances of the enemy's glib-tongued propagandists or by the temporary manifestation of the enemy's supposed Might.

The Test of Man is not when he has everything at his bidding. It is at such time when that Man is confronted with the most perplexing problems and subjected to untold sufferings. This holds true with an organization. Our Organization, the problems we have, coupled with miseries and privations, are but a part of the Acid Test we all must undergo.

The Heroes of the Past and of the Recent Past did not attain their glories without painful sacrifice. Glory without struggles and sacrifices is not known to exist in this world. The Chinese people are a shining example of these Struggles and Sacrifices. They have been in this situation for the last seven years. Why? Because they have Ideals to attain and there was never a word of complaint nor a sign of indifference even with the untold sufferings.

We have picked up the struggle where our Heroes of Bataan and Corregidor had left it. Shall we fail them? By all means and at any cost, NO! And should we fail those who have given up their lives, they will rise from their graves to curse us; and to future generations, we shall be a Mockery.

The enemy is employing all conceivable means to make us surrender. He threatens us, coerces us; he captures our families and tries to attract us with the Japanese Yen. Falling in all these, he makes and exhibit of his Supposed Might. It is true we cannot kick him decisively now, but as long as the Men of this Division breathe the Free Air of the mountain side, the Resistance Must Go On and Our Organization must be Preserved.

All our days will not be like these. The Future is bright. I enjoin all Officers and Men to hold and be prepared at all times. We may have to tighten our belts and have sleepless nights, but the Fight Must Go On!

General MacArthur promised to return. He will return. He is coming nearer and nearer. Have Patience and have Faith, and above all have Courage.

TO BE READ BY ALL OFFICERS AND MEN  
P-1-p-6

TO THE PEOPLE OF THE WORLD:

Often and often now have I in my heart dreamt that I and, with no, my official staff will soon surrender to the enemy; that, thru the intervention of some prominent men, I have made arrangements in order that my personal safety and that of my family be fully guaranteed. This is the time to personally will advise the soldiers as follows: when I decide to leave our Camp it is after matured deliberation and with a full recognition of the risk and dangers attendant to it. Even on ordinary matters I rarely change my decisions -- on matter so far-reaching as this I do not change them. More than a year has passed since then and on no instance has it occurred to me to reverse my stand not to fear the decision that I have taken. I will not shrink from the mercy of the enemy or from my prophecies. Unless then the enemy has no more pillars, burnt and destroy all of them, he has no foothold in his own thoughts. Because of my action, I have not had a son born in which I can call my own least the one in the little house where I have my quarters. Since that, however, many thousand civilians have come their untimely graves that enemy craft and treachery. Their death must be avenged, no better at that point. This can only be done by holding high the torch which I have given to us from their dying hands. Let me thru snowy action end my earthly life by brother, Joe Mongolian, who is a my active collaborator in my association and maintenance of the Civil Government, also. I should be recreant to the memory of my brother and to those other millions who, like him, have died in the war. I now turn my back and seek the help and protection of the enemy from his strength. My brother sent to me a message: "You must carry on until victory is won." In answer I say: "I will, I must, carry on."

From a more practical standpoint I say: when in the year 1942 I decided to throw in my lot with that of our soldiers now fighting with the Allied nations, the enemy, especially Japan, was having the upper hand. There was a bright nothing but victory after victory, success after success of the Hitler Army and Nazi America was then under fire its last hour and it then appeared as if the dawn would never come. Now, however, the tide has not only turned, evidences of Allied victory are every hour. Italy has not only surrendered to the Allies, she is no actively fighting on our side and against her formerly ally, Germany. Germany's dream of world conquest and domination is not completely vanished, however, it is not now speak of victory but only of "defence of the Reich"; her forces have been driven from practically all of Eastern soil. No city of importance in all Germany has escaped Allied heavy bombing. With Berlin exclusively bearing the title of "THE MOST HELLISH CITY ON EARTH". At least one-half of all buildings in that City have been razed to the ground. The invasion campaign is virtually over and what remains of the German forces in the Atlantic will suffer disease, starvation and death. The same fate awaits Japan in that there will be no Britain and the New Zealand. Furthermore, the home port of the Japanese Navy, not only has been bombed twice the air bases also shelled by American aircraft. The Gilbert Islands have been taken; the Marshall Islands, a heavy blow again Japan in the form of a colony, has not only been seized, it has subsequently destroyed and occupied. Japan, one of the Carolines and Truk, the great Harbor of Japan in the Pacific, have been captured by an strong force of American Naval units. The fall of the Carolines appears to be a matter of time and after this will the Government of the Philippines should come as soon follows the night. With all these evidences of Allied force and success, it shall not only be impractical but downright foolishness for me and for the nation, for anyone now collaborating with us, to lose faith and courage and to surrender to the invader.

1. It has been noted by this Section that a lot of changes have taken place in enemy garrisons re strength, armaments, and defensive installations. Reports come in continuously but does not include those changes.

2. In view of the foregoing direct your S-2s to submit immediately to this Headquarters the following:

a. A Five-Month Comparative Graph of Enemy Strength in your respective sub-sectors covering the period from April to August, 1943. A detailed explanation should accompany the aforementioned graph stating therein among others the component of the enemy strength (either Jap soldiers or JCS) and their distributions. Enforcements and withdrawals should be so stated. States if possible.

b. List of Armaments in the Enemy Garrisons as of 31 August 43. Care should be taken in reporting the number, type, and calibre used re field artillery guns, machine guns, and rifles. Such terms as "Baby Canon" and "Heavy or Light" machine gun in so far as it pertains to field artillery and machine gun respectively should be avoided. An American who had been with Col. Yamaguchi's troops here disclosed the fact that the enemy is using four (4) 75 mm field artillery guns, two of which are English made while the other two are Japanese made; two (2) 41 mm field guns mounted on wheels; a number of 81 mm and 41 mm trench mortars; 27 cal. machine rifles; a large

number of 27 cal. rifles; and one (1) 30 cal. Browning Automatic rifle. The 25 cal. rifles oftenly reported, are short rifles with permanently attached bayonets used by the cavalry. This are 27 cal. rifles. Col. Yamaguchi's troops here are occupation troops which came from Saigon and Singapore, hence, they do not have the American-made arms taken from Bata-an.

SUBJECT: Instructions on Procurement and  
Accounting of Supplies

TO : All Sector and Sub-Sector Commanders

1. In amplification to the administrative details of Field Order No. 3, HQ., 72nd Division, dated 31 May '45, the following instructions, pertinent to the procurement and accounting of supplies are hereby published for the information, guidance, and compliance of all concerned:

2. Functions of the DQM Agents - The District Commander has appointed Agents for the District Quartermaster in all the areas covered by the units of this Division. These agents are the representatives of the District Quartermaster and as such, will function as Procurement Agents for the 7th Military District. They are the only Army personnel authorized to procure or requisition receipt any supplies from the Civil Government. All other personnel, heretofore connected with the supplies agencies of the Army, are hereafter no longer authorized to procure supplies, unless duly appointed as Agent of the District Quartermaster or when procuring supplies on cash basis.

3. Requisitioning of Supplies - (a) Supply Officers of the Sub-Sectors will prepare their requisition for supplies, based upon the actual needs and allowances of their units, and will forward same to the DQM agents in their immediate area, furnishing copies of their requisition to the Sector Supply Officer, Div. S-4, Division Quartermaster and District Quartermaster for their record and reference. Requisition papers will, therefore, be prepared in six (6) copies, four (4) of which will be forwarded to the Sector S-4 for distribution to the offices concerned and one (1) copy will be forwarded to the DQM Agent for his immediate action.

(b) Requisitions will be based upon a correct and accurate estimate of the supplies needed by the units for the next three, six, or 12 months, depending upon the availability of supplies in the area. Allowances for dependents and casual visitors will be included in the estimate.

(c) Sector S-4, Div. S-4, and Division Quartermaster will, upon receipt of the requisition, check up the estimate made by the Sub-Sector S-4s and record them for future reference.

4. Procurement of Supplies - The DQM Agents, upon receipt of the requisition of the Battalion S-4, will procure the supplies from the Civil Government through the Deputy Governor. After having procured the supplies, they will notify the Battalion S-4 and indicate to them the location of the supplies. Then the Battalion S-4 can send his men or hauling party, with the letter of authority of the DQM agent, to get the supplies.

5. Hauling of Supplies - The hauling of supplies will be the responsibility of the Sub-Sector Supply Officer. Civilian laborers will be paid from funds allotted for operations at the rate of P0.20 per kilometer per one cavan of palay or 50 kilos of supplies.

6. Receipt for Supplies Procured - (a) DQM Agents will require the Battalion Supply Officers to sign receipts for all the supplies they procure. The Battalion Supply Officer will furnish copies of the receipt to the Sector S-4, Div. S-4, Division Quartermaster and District Quartermaster and will therefore forward four (4) copies to the Sector S-4 for distribution to the offices concerned and one (1) copy for his record.

**(b)** Sector and Div. G-4 and Division Quartermaster Officers will supply copies of the requisites issued by the Division Quartermaster to the Sector and Division Quartermasters and classify them into expendable and non-expendable supplies. Unit Supply Officers will be held accountable for non-expendable supplies only. Battalion Supply Officers will submit monthly reports on expenditure of expendable supplies to the Sector B-4, Div. G-4, Division Quartermaster District Commander. Expendable supplies will be dropped from the accountability of the Battalion Supply Officers as soon as their report on expenditures are received by the Division Quartermaster.

7. The foregoing instructions will govern the procurement and accounting of supplies in this Division only in cases where the supplies have to be requisitioned on credit basis. In cases where the supplies are to be purchased in cash, the Battalion Supply Officer may purchase the supplies direct from the vendors or civilians. All purchases will be supported by a General Voucher, a copy of which will be furnished to the S-4, Div. G-4, and Div. Quartermaster for their record and reference.

## Remarks:

The marked depletion of enemy garrison strength was significantly due to the simultaneous evacuation of troops from La Castellana, Pentevedra, Hinajeron, Kabankalan and Sub-garrisons Central Palma and San Isidro, and lately Hinamayon. It could not be doubted that the greater portion of the troops that abandoned the southern garrisons have gone to the North from Binalbagan where truck movements to and from Bacelod have been observed. No longer in this Sector, La Garreta Area's importance shown by outnumbering total enemy strength this Sector, with total estimated strength of 990 including 44 JGs. This could be explained by the fact that Aguisian Landing Field ceases to be of value to the enemy. Changes of enemy's number may depend on how things will go on in Binalbagan, it being the remaining center directly responsible for maintaining its island-most garrison, Isabela. No indications as yet pointing to evacuation. Any big Allied move in this island will no doubt decide this any time from now.

## II. RESUME' OF ENEMY ACTIVITIES:

## A. GROUND -

Not much for this period. Since their abandonment of their northern and southern garrisons, the enemy was observed to be quiet but evidently on the defensive. Their movements are mostly done during the night in which case, Aguisian Landing Field is guarded every night by

1. In view of the circumstances of the undelivered-on-the-moved divisional divisional division of the present Let. In., 76th Inf to 2nd In., 76th Inf, forwarded for our study and consideration of the Divisional Commander before any order or decision is made effecting the said plan:

(a) That in the ~~existing~~ plans of this sector for future major offensive operations, the present units of the 76th Inf [composed of units of sub-sectors 1st, 2nd and 3rd] are to perform themselves role of defending Zambo City and Airport and adjacent garrisons, with the attached 2nd In., 76th Inf [sub-sector 1st] attacking Fabian Garrison and Alayod, and the attached 2nd In., 76th Inf [sub-sector 2nd] attacking Lily and Latoy-Latoy Airport. All Battalion Commanders are already well acquainted with this plan and of their respective missions; and in fact useful orders have already been issued for coordinated action. This plan is based on the assumption that there will be a consolidated attack by all other units over the Island. However, if the present Let. In., 76th Inf [sub-sector 3rd] will be transferred into the 2nd Inf, 76th Inf, the whole plan of this operation will be upset or disrupted because in the event that the expected major offensive will be conducted the said unit will be under the command and administration of the CO, 76th Inf and thus despite this sector of one Battalion will should play a role in the assault of Zambo City.

(b) That the transformation of the present Let. In., 76th Inf [sub-sector 3rd] into the 2nd In., 76th Inf will destroy the efficient teamwork already established among the present units (sub-sectors 1st, 2nd and 3rd) of the 76th Inf. 1. Since the 20th of last month, palay harvest in Talisay-Silay area was begun, principally in Mass. Nagas, Panagses, San Rafael, de Agua, and adjacent haciendas. This new harvest which should be a bounty to friendly troops in that area, on the contrary, is adding strength to the enemy. As has been seen in practically all these haciendas, palay harvests are guarded by the enemy soldiers; then after the harvest, all palay harvested are brought to the enemy garrisons, in this case, San Juan, Nagas or Sagrada Corazon de Jesus, where these harvested palay are shared to tenants, harvesters, and landowners. In all these cases, almost half of the total harvested palay are bought by the Nips from either the tenants or landowners, and the civil government which is supposed to get its 20% share of the total harvest could not even get a single grain because of the complete control of the enemy over the harvest.

In San Juan, Nagas, and Sagrada Corazon de Jesus, the Nips have constructed enormous bodegas primarily to house all the palay they could purchase or confiscate during these harvests.

2. Constant and incessant patrols of the enemy traversing from Bare-Bare and San Juan garrisons reinforced from Sagrada Corazon de Jesus and Nagas plus the absence of friendly troops in this area even only to harass these patrols, place the harvest in the areas bordering the patrol routes entirely at the hands of the enemy. If this situation continues, all haciendas within 15 kilometers radius from the towns would be completely controlled by the enemy leaving only about one-third of the total area wherein friendly troops could acquire palay.

3. With the construction of several bodegas by the enemy in the above-mentioned garrisons, possibility is extreme that the enemy will exert utmost efforts to grab all palay they could lay their hands on, unless something is done to thwart access of the enemy patrols to these areas. Presently Combat Company of SS "G" is way south of its area, with Companies of SS "H" grouping in Victorias-Caravia Area, thus leaving Talisay and Silay Area bare of armed troops.



Code re the use of "Toltogan" is hereby made to wit:

1.- That if the enemy is approaching, beating of "Toltogan" will be rapid and long as possible so as to enable the adjacent post to hear and to relay the same to other adjacent post. In cases where the enemy is very near the striking of "Toltogan" would be strong and slow.

2.- Once the "Toltogan" is sounded every outpost guard would be on the alert and the moment he hears the sound of the toltogan whether the enemy is approaching or not he must notify the adjacent post by means of following the code to be used. The toltogan will not be used in cases of false alarm and that anybody, civilians or Army Man found guilty will be dealt with drastically.
