Soldiers:- Enemy's threats for "mountain campaign", coupled by the prevalent perplexity in our economic structure, have in no way shaken the firm and alleviated morals of the enlisted personnel. From all tangible indications, the soldiers, amidst tempting circumstances and all other vicissitudes of life, still assume the high hopes of our final victory. On the other hand, our recent operations with the enemy, which have in large measure given us the potentialities of satisfactory combat results, have determined our men to forge ahead. Among many other reasons which are instrumental to the small igration of our soldiers' morale are due; Axis reverses in the combat world, and also the material acquisition of the new brand of arms and ammunition, becomes the probable credulity for more successful operations. Consequently, the combat spirit of the fighting units are heightened with burning desire. Generally, the soldiers' morale of this command is apparently

high. Civilians: - The exemplary conduct of our men against overwhelming odds in the face of adversities evidently points out a melliflous admiration of the civilian populace. Much more the economic hardships which gravely aggravated the temporary confusion of everybody are now restored as a result of the extensive food production campaign. As a consequence, harvest is now fast approxching. Henceforth, there is a restitution of the past joys in our economic sphere. However, altho present indications do not show favorable action for adequate supply of corn, maximum efforts are still exerted to meet present demands and exigencies. Civilians' morale remainsvery satisfactory, and pro-

In some places of this area, there are groups of guards detailed to keep away night marauders. "Tagbos" and all sorts of prohibited gatherings are strictly campaigned by the Army. MPs are sent out to every conglomerated place to maintain peace and order, and to arrest miscreants. Above all what is more interesting is that civilians are becoming more cooperative and understanding of the privations and miseries that our soldiers have. In Sagay, civic-spirited citizens have begun organizing the women's Auxiliary Service with the main objective to remedy help the deplorable state of the

soldiers. Escalante area soon will put up same organization. With the mutual and subtle cooperation of these civic installations, clothings, and all sorts of benefaction to soldiers will be attended to.
