

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1 Some practical observations may be mentioned  
2 with regard to making allowances for the above center  
3 defects, as follows:

4 1- More liberal allowance should be made in the  
5 case of center holes than if the rotten center is still  
6 solid since in the former there must be left some material  
7 for the carriage dogs to hold on.

8 2- It has been observed that in some species the  
9 boards cut from the portion immediately adjoining the  
10 center rot are absolutely sound and, in such case, it  
11 is often possible to reduce the size of the square in-  
12 closing the center rot as it is seen at the end of the  
13 log so as to be nearly the same as the diameter of the  
14 defect.

15 3- If the rotten wood in the log is not separated  
16 from the sound wood by a distinct line, care must be  
17 taken in determining the square that will inclose it so  
18 that the full defective portion is taken out from the  
19 scale of the log.

20 4- If the rot is irregular, the allowance to be  
21 given is generally relatively much bigger than its  
22 actual size as it appears at the end of the log.

23 5- Brash center may affect the surrounding wood  
24 only in a light way. Lumber cut from such portion of  
25 the log would ordinarily come up to the grade of mer-  
26 chantable. Therefore, in enclosing this defect in a  
27 square, the slightly affected part around the edges  
28 may be excluded.

29 6- In judging center rots that do not go thru the  
30 whole length of the log, the scaler will of course  
31 have to estimate the portion of the length affected.  
32 The end of a rot inside a log is often indicated by a  
33 swelling and scalers should look for this, or similar  
34 signs, in scaling defective logs so that they may have  
35 as definite a basis for their estimate as possible. In  
36 this connection, the fact must not be overlooked that  
37 the central core - from end to end - of Philippine timber,  
38 is brashy, contains heart checks, or otherwise unmer-  
39 chantable. In other words, although only one end of a  
40 log is defective because of the presence of center rot,  
41 it does not necessarily mean that the other end of the  
42 central core is sound. With few exceptions, it is in-

stricture must have begun to form before this time and is continuing now. In the first case, after removal of the tube four weeks after the accident, he began to complain again of difficulty of swallowing after two or three days and we have to reinsert it. In other words, we really do not know how long to leave that tube there. That may be determined by observation of many cases and by experimental study on the duration of the formation of the cicatrix. For the present, we believe that the tube should remain in the esophagus at least a month to be moved once in a while. When cicatricial stricture is formed the treatment becomes difficult. In fact, one of the reasons why we have thought of this presentation is our failure to benefit those cases. In the first place, like in this second patient the dilatation of the stricture will have to be done continuously for at least six months or more, once a week, patiently and gradually. To illustrate this point Dr. Alcantara told me to show the picture of a Chinese patient who swallowed nitric acid about 4 or 5 months ago. We have not put any feeding tube to prevent cicatricial stricture and after two months the patient could swallow only liquids. Esophagoscopic dilatation per oral was quite difficult and dangerous. So Dr. Alcantara suggested gastrostomy. Then retrograde dilatation, that is dilatation from below thru the stomach was done. I think Dr. Alcantara has tried it several times, but the patient got tired and he transferred to another hospital. You will see in the picture that he is having that gastrostomy tube and that string that he has swallowed. We failed in this case and probably we might be a failure in these other two patients. That is why our main aim in presenting these cases prophylaxis of this cicatricial stricture. We are only starting to study and to follow up these cases and we are asking the cooperation of the internist who administers to those patients the first aid treatment, to refer them as soon as possible so that we might attempt to insert the tube and let it stay there to prevent subsequent stricture. We might report on this study later.

CHAIRMAN: There is another case, a Chinese boy who remained for three months in the ward in that condition, and he was of the habit of stealing food and became fat.

DR. QUINTOS: The esophagus in that case was almost like a funnel and below was cordlike. The cause seemed to be gonococcal, like malformation.

DR. STRANSKY: It has been the habit in Austria and Hungary twenty to thirty years ago to keep potassium hydroxide in open glasses and children drank this potassium hydroxide and they suffered burns of the esophagus and we had the chance to observe cases of burning of the esophagus. I can remember two very important cases. In one case an immediate tube has been applied after burning and it was impossible to reach the stomach. Later on we passed tube to the stomach and the patient developed mediastinitis, and the patient died. The tube perforated the esophagus and found the way in the inferior parts back to the esophagus. Therefore, early treatment is not good. The second case has been very important because it is a long story. The child had burning of the esophagus. The child has not been treated the first day. The child developed severe pains spontaneously. It was an abdominal pain with the diagnosis of appendicitis. He was appendicectomized but no appendicitis. After several days the pains came again and the child died. Post-mortem findings: Child had softening of the esophagus. On account of the softening there has been mediastinitis. There has been softening of the wall of the aorta aneurysm and bleeding from the aorta into the thoracic cavity. The child died on account of the bleeding into the thoracic cavity. This is important to show that the softening can be very marked not only in the esophagus but even the aorta can be attacked by this burning. So it is not good to treat the case early on account of the burning by potassium hydroxide it is better to wait for one or two weeks before treatment.

DR. WILLHEIM: To the remarks of Dr. Stransky I have to add that poisonings with hydroxides are to be considered completely otherwise than such with acids. The hydroxides have the quality to soften, even to dissolve

CHAIRMAN: Let us pass to the next case of intraabdominal tumor involving either the liver or the pancreas.

DR. SILVA: We are presenting to you this patient as a case of intra-abdominal newgrowth involving either the liver or the pancreas. The data, as published last week, are as follows: Male, 75 years old, admitted for the first time on June 16, 1940, complaining of jaundice, pruritus, pain over the right hypochondrium, and general body weakness. This illness supposedly started about 2 months before admission as loss of appetite and occasional nausea. At about the same time, he felt dull pain over the right hypochondrium radiating to the back and right shoulder, occurring occasionally. Pain was never severe nor was it ever colicky in character. A week after the onset, he noticed yellowish discoloration of the sclera, which gradually became more intense and was followed by yellowish discoloration of the skin. Together with this, he felt marked itching over the whole body. He denies having had clay-colored stools but his urine has always been highly colored. He has gradually become weak and rapidly lost weight since the onset of the illness. About a week before admission, he developed edema of the lower extremities which remained persistent up to admission. He never had jaundice or dysenteric attacks before. Physical examination: the patient is fairly developed, but poorly nourished. Eyes - markedly icteric sclerae. Heart - no apparent enlargement by percussion; heart sounds are weak and distant but regular. Lungs are normal. Abdomen - distinctly bulging at the epigastrium; there is an indefinite, hard mass approximately 3 or 4 inches in width, the borders of which can not be definitely outlined. There are evidences of the presence of slight fluid. Some superficial veins are distended and visible. Integument - with yellowish discoloration. Laboratory examinations: Blood slight anemia, with 3,600,000 RBC, normal leukocyte and differential count. Urine, as examined by the Central Laboratory, showed the following characteristics: dark brown, turbid, with moderate albumin, no sugar, heavy bile with traces of urobilin and urobilinogen. This was repeated by the same laboratory with practically the same findings, with urobilin, positive and urobilinogen, trace. Feces examination done by the Central Laboratory showed ankylostoma 1+, bile and urobilin, negative. The following day it was repeated and the feces was clay-colored, with ankylostoma 1+, and negative for bile and urobilin. Van den Bergh reaction, immediate direct (strongly, markedly positive), icterus index, 136.7, serum bilirubin, 9.18 mg. This was reported several days ago on June 28 and the result was: Van den Bergh reaction, biphasic, icterus index, 60 and bilirubin, 6.75 mg. Glucose tolerance test: fasting sugar, 79 mg; first hour, 129; second hour, 109; and third hour, 106. Blood diastase done in the medical laboratory, 8 units, central laboratory, 32 units; urinary diastase done by the medical laboratory showed 16 units, by the central laboratory, 150 units. Prothrombin time 10 minutes. Takata test was negative. Blood Wassermann, negative. We performed duodenal drainage and we were not able to get any trace of bile in the fluid that was obtained. X-ray of the gall bladder and liver showed no radio-opaque stone. X-ray of the gastrointestinal tract showed: No evidence of six-hour residue. Stomach shows certain hypertonicity. There seems to be liver enlargement. Arthritis deformans of the lumbar vertebrae. X-ray of the lungs showed prominence of the right hilus with occasional calcified spots. Because of the findings of marked anorexia, marked and progressive jaundice, the presence of an indefinite hard mass over the epigastrium, and the age of the patient, there seems to be no doubt as to the presence of malignancy in the abdomen. What we are in doubt about is the possible location of this malignancy. We have two strong considerations, either malignancy of the liver or malignancy of the pancreas. We considered malignancy of the pancreas because of the progressive jaundice, the presence of acholic stools which was observed in the ward, and the somewhat deep-seated position of the mass. This mass can be palpated only by ballottement. However, the presence of ascites and the absence of the horse-shoe shaped deformity in the x-ray of the stomach seems not to favor malignancy of the pancreas. We considered malignancy of the liver because of the presence of this mass and the progressive jaundice. But the presence of the acholic stools seems not to be in favor of malignancy of the liver. We are not very definite about the site of this malignancy, that is why we are presenting this case for discussion. As treatment, this patient is receiving cardiac stimulants, like strychnine because of the myocardial drangue. Appetite is very poor. In fact, he is not complaining of any marked symptoms other than anorexia.
