



or employee, in order to be entitled to vacation leave with full pay, should render at least one year of continuous, faithful and satisfactory service in the same municipality where he intends to enjoy the privilege, because service in another municipality can not be considered in the computation of the length of service.

The vacation leave of municipal employees is not governed by the same regulations. There is no general law on the subject that is applicable to all the municipalities. The question of whether or not municipal employees should be granted the privilege is left entirely in the hands of the respective municipal councils. The matter is purely a local concern regarding which, the municipalities are absolutely independent from one another. The rule governing Civil Service employee cannot be applied to municipal employees, because the vacation leave of the former is governed by one and the same law, which is applicable to all positions embraced in the Philippine Civil Service.

We know very well that for purposes of the leave privileges, a municipal employee that is transferred to a position embraced in the Philippine Civil Service is not given
