THE TWO SINGLE-SESSION PROGRAM

NOTE.--All titles listed below are those of newly adopted textbooks. In classes using only the old texts, reference should be made to the titles of the corresponding newly adopted textbooks.

READING

To be able to read the three basic readers. ¹

MUSIC

1. To be able to learn by rote and sing beautifully the 26 songs on pages XV, XVI, XVIII, XX, XXI, XXXI, XXXV, XLII, XLIV, 11, 13, 15, 20, 21, 25, 26, 27, 34, 37, 44, 48 of The Progressive Music Series, Book One, and from pages 129, 130, 131, 136, and 140 of The Progressive Music Series, Teachers' Manual, Vol. I. (One song every other day.)
2. To be able to understand the meaning of the text of the songs listed above, thus helping the pupils to gain a practical understanding of comprehensive singing, which leads to correct interpretation and appreciation of the songs they sing. This procedure will add words to the pupils' vocabularies.
3. To be able to sing with good tone quality, not with forced or squeezing sounds, but with soft, light voices and with distinct pronunciation of the words, and in the standard pitch.

(Beginning the sixth month)

4. To be able to sing familiar songs with the neutral syllable loo, in order to develop the pure musical aspect of the songs through the feeling of melody, of phrases as distinct divisions of a song, and of rhythm. (One song a day.)
5. To be able to recognize a phrase when repeated in the same song. This work may be introduced once a week.
