1. To avoid overlapping of powers the following orders are published:

(a) All problems and troubles that may come up within the squad should be settled by the squad leader or referred to the next higher command. This holds true with the platoons, companies and battalions.

2. Police Force should be under the direct control of the Provost Marshal of the unit or sector. Patrols and Police Force should cooperate accordingly and should not compete in trying cases. As much as possible investigation involving petty troubles between civilians should be given to the Mayor or the Justice of the Peace for trial.

3. Civil cases involving soldiers and civilians should be tried by the unit commander to which the soldier belongs.

4. Civil cases involving civilians or civilians wherein public properties and Funds are involved should be investigated by this office and officer duly authorized to do so.

5. As much as possible land troubles should be turned over to the civil authorities unless circumstance warrant that it should be tried by military authorities.

1. To avoid overlapping of powers the following orders are published:

- (a) All problems and troubles that may come up within the area should be settled by the squad leader or referred to the next higher command. This holds true with the district, company and battalions.
- 2. Police force should be under the direct control of the Provost Marshal of the unit or sector. Patrols and police force should cooperate accordingly and should not compete in any way. As soon as possible investigation involving petty troubles between civilians should be given to the Mayor or the Justice of the Peace for trial.
- 3. Civil cases involving soldiers and civilians should be tried by the unit commander to which the soldier belongs.
- 4. Civil cases involving civilians or civilians wherein public properties and funds are involved should be investigated by this office and officer duly authorized to do so.
- 5. As much as possible legal troubles should be turned over to the civil authorities unless circumstances warrant that it should be tried by military authorities.
