





SUBJECT : REPORT ON ENEMY SITUATION

TO : THE DISTRICT COMMANDER, 93RD DIV., IN THE FIELD

1. There has been no much of enemy activities this week. One thing is noticeable - the employing of many Filipino laborers to hurry on the work at the Calsesa landing field, and also the construction of a small wharf thereat.

2. Japanese in Dulag carry on their usual patrols to nearby barrios. Since the landing in Tacloban and Pinesopon, and another arrivals in Tacloban on the 19th of this month, there was but little increase of their force in Dulag.

3. Parao and sailboat owners are now careful in crossing the sea between Leyte and Samar as in Tacloban the Japs placed one speed boat which according to reliable information was once owned by the Bureau of Customs. It is now being used to patrol along the coast.

4. There is an everyday passage of airplanes in Abuyog, from Cebu to Surigao and back. People here are afraid that the poblacion is already 90% evacuated. I ordered the burning of about two hundred thousand kilos of copra deposited by the merchants in their bodegas. Some first class abaca were evacuated to the interiors.

5. I ordered immediate shipments of corn to the southern towns, and suspend the haulings of foodstuffs to the poblacion. There is but little corn for export in Abuyog as the harvest in August are about to exhaust. Corn for export will be had again sometime in the latter part of the month of November, the last harvest for the year.

SUBJECT: Report on Casualties

In the Field

1. The Japanese Forces in Leyte have apparently changed policy from that of attraction to that of indiscriminate destruction of the lives of Filipinos, civilians and military men alike.

2. During the month of September alone the Japanese beheaded or slaughtered on the side-railings (barandillas) of Calogocog bridge, Tanauan, seventeen civilians, at San Joaquin Bridge, Palo, twenty-six civilians, along the route followed by a Japanese patrol thru Bo. Daro, Jaro, seven civilians, and at Bo. Sta. Ana, La Paz, thirteen civilians. These thirteen civilians from Sta. Ana were tied to the posts of a house which was later set on fire. One of them escaped from the burning house to tell the story, but the following day succumbed just the same due to burnt lungs. Just last week, two EM belonging to "K" Co., 3rd Bn., and one EM-operative of the same battalion were apprehended by Filipino JO's accompanying the Japanese on patrol near Bo. Guinarona, Dagami. According to latest information, more or less reliable, the last three boys likewise have been beheaded at Burauen.

3. The Filipinos who were thus killed practically were not investigated, although they met death on the presumption by the enemy that they were soldiers of our organization.

a. There are around 750 Japanese in Carigara and 200 in Pinamoposan.

b. Patrol activities are increasing, day and night.

c. Major Mariano B. Refols, 3rd Lt. Juan Batula, Sgt. ~~Iluminado~~ Cataba surrendered to the enemy.

d. Mr. Lino Pore, Municipal Treasurer of Carigara was caught in his hiding place and scheduled to be killed last Friday unless his son who is in the Intelligence Section will surrender to the Japanese.

e. 1st Lt. Higinio Cabiling fled with 7 rifles and probably joined the command of Lt. Blas Miranda.

TO : District Commander, 9th MD.
In The Field

1. At 8:00 O'clock in the morning of 19 Oct. '43, two (2) motor boats loaded with some 200 Japanese soldiers arrived Tacloban and with them were boxes of ammunitions. Strange as it may seem the soldiers now occupying the former Camp Bampas are all Filipino soldiers of the Japanese.
2. The town of Basey, Samar, is not occupied by the Japs, contrary to the information received from one Francisco Realino as has already been reported to you on 18 October, 1943. Neither Salazar and company went to Balangiga, Samar.
3. The truth is that the Japs merely passed along the coasts of Basey from Tacloban towards Borongan and Allen where they actually landed.
4. In Allen these Japs are building a barrack which according to information received from our operatives, measure 50 by 60 meters.
5. The Japs are now employing Filipinos numbering from 200 to 300 to work at the Kata-esen Landing Field. They are now constructing a wharf thereat.
6. On the 14th of Oct., 6 boats loaded with Japs soldiers arrived Tacloban. Two of these were big ones and the rest were small motor boats. Unloaded from these boats were 8 75 mm. guns and 6 small guns.
7. There is to arrived in the nearest future a General for these new arrivals who are now occupying the big private house of Tacloban.
8. One half of these soldiers were distributed along the towns of the Tacloban-Carigara Road. The next to arrive will be distributed to towns along the Abuyog-Tacloban Road.
9. There will be actual re-occupations of the towns in the West like Baybay, Maasin, and Malitbog. These new soldiers according to their propaganda are intended for their much publicized "Mopping Operations."
10. The Poblacion of Abuyog is drained of almost 2/3 of its population to the interior preparatory to the coming of the enemies. However, inspite of all these, we, the soldiers are trying our best to maintain the morale of the people. We are expecting the enemy to come at anytime and we are prepared in line with practical plans to suit the situation. We take care of ourselves.
11. Inclose herewith is a copy of the Japanese propaganda of the Independence of the Philippines By Salazar.

2. At about 3:30 in the afternoon of 9th March 1945, a volunteer guard apprised us of the presence of a lone Jap in sitio Nagub-an, Bo. Union, about 900 yards and laying NW of the said barrio. The Combat Patrol, 2nd Platoon, under Cpl. del Mar was dispatched posthaste to the place where the Jap was reported to be. The report was that the Jap was unarmed and saved for a bayonet. Reaching the place, the Jap was seen at the mouth of a cave, apparently resting and without thought for danger. Before one could count three, he was fired upon by Pvt. Policarpo Cruzada, killing him instantly with a TSMG.

The Jap had eaten nothing the last one or two days as from his bullet opened stomach could be seen young coconut's meat coming out. He had also beside him, newly opened, the left-overs of young coconuts which he had opened with his bayonet.





On the morning of 26th. February 1945, I was driving with Pfc Richard S. Hoover, ASN 18136915, toward the town of Consuelo, Pacijan Island with four (4) of my men.

About one mile from town we were stopped by a messenger from this town and were told that there were three (3) Japs present. I ordered Pfc Hoover to drive immediately to Consuelo. There we were met by a large group of civilians and a Mr Gilberto Macapobie, leader of the Volunteer Guards of that city. I asked Mr Macapobie where the Japs were and if any civilians were present in the immediate vicinity. I then was told, that all civilians had been ordered out of that area one half hour prior to my arrival at Consuelo and that there were none in that area. I took my men and Pfc Hoover and moved in the direction of where we were told the Japs were located. I found, engaged and killed two (2) Japs. While searching their bodies for information, I was told that a third Jap was in a hut about seventy-five (75) yards away. I then took my men and move toward the hut. At a distance of about twenty-five (25) yards I heard noises coming from inside of the hut. My men opened fire, then I heard a faint cry and we proceeded to the hut to investigate and found Mrs Dolores Mijaras and her daughter lying on the floor. The child was dead from a wound in the head and the mother was wounded in the left hip and left arm. We placed Mrs Mijaras in the jeep and returned to Poro for Medical treatment.

At the time of the accident I believed the area in that vicinity to be clear of civilians. I had been assured of this by Mr Gilberto Macapobie. Before any fire was delivered, I had asked him if the area had been cleared of civilians and he told me that it was and that no-one was in that area.

I solemnly swear that the above statements are true and correct.

On the morning of 26th February, 1945, at 1030, Capt Jose I. Ilustre, CO, 3d Bn 94th (F) Inf. and three (3) enlisted men with Pfc Richard S. Hoover 18136915 driver, Hq Co, 3d Bn 182d Inf. were on the way to Consuelo, Pacijan Island, when they were stopped by a messenger, who reported that three (3) Japs were in the town of Consuelo.

Capt Jose I. Ilustre immediately proceeded to the town of Consuelo, where he was met by Mr. Gilberto Macapagal, leader of that town's Volunteer Guards. After having been informed that natives in the immediate vicinity had been ordered to leave the area and had ample time to comply with that order, Capt Ilustre went directly to the location where Japs were known to be. Upon finding two (2) Japs, Capt Ilustre and reconnaissance party engaged them. After killing these Japs he searched the bodies and haversacks. During the process of searching their possessions, a civilian reported to Capt Ilustre that a third Jap was in a hut approximately seventy-five (75) yds away. Capt Ilustre and his men went forward and as they were approaching the hut, they heard voices coming from within the hut. His men opened fired after which they heard a faint cry and then went forward again to investigate. Inside the hut, they found Mrs Dolores Mijaras and her eight (8) month old daughter, the child was dead from a wound in the head and Mrs Mijaras was wounded in the left hip and left arm. Capt Ilustre with the aid of his men placed Mrs Mijaras in his vehicle and took her to Paro for medical treatment.

The findings of my investigation are as follows:

1. The wounds of Mrs Dolores Mijaras and the death of her daughter were accidental and not the fault of Capt Ilustre or his men.
2. That Mrs Mijaras had been warned and had ample time to leave her home and join the civilians in town.
3. After fire had been delivered on Japs, Mrs Mijaras still had time to leave for a safe place, but did not do so.

The attached statements will verify my findings.

Consuelo, Pacijan Island.
TO : CO, Task Force, Major James W. Harris.

On the morning of 26 February, 1945, it was reported to me that there were three Japs just outside of the city of Consuelo, of which I am the leader of the Volunteer Guards. I sent a few of my men to watch the Japs so they would not be able to escape, I then ordered all the civilians out of the area where the Japs were in. Nextly I dispatched a runner to notify the Task Force of our findings.

I then checked the civilians to see if they were all out of the area. Upon completion I found that Mrs Dolores Mijaras and her daughter were not there and sent her neighbor Mr Ulrericco Mesias to tell her to leave.

Within a half hour, Capt Jose I. Ilustre arrived with four (4) men. He asked me if the civilians were out of the area, to which I replaid "yes", and then guided him to the area where the Japs had last been seen. Capt Ilustre and his party found two (2) Japs and killed them in the following action. He then searched the bodies and possessions of the two Japs, when a civilian reported to him that a third Jap was in a hut about seventy-five (75) yards away. Capt Ilustre then took his men and went forward. When he got within twenty-five (25) yards of the hut he heard a noise coming from inside of the hut, which I believed at that time to be a Jap. Capt Ilustre and his men then opened fire. I then heard a faint cry come from inside the house, Capt Ilustre his men and I went forward to investigate, upon arriving at the house, we found Mrs Dolores Mijaras and her eight (8) month old daughter lying on the floor. The child had died of a wound in the head and the mother was wounded in the left hip and left arm. Capt Ilustre took the mother and placed her in the jeep and took her to the city of Pore for medical treatment.

I firmly believe that the wounds of Mrs Dolores Mijaras and the death of her daughter were accidental and not the fault of any of the military personnel concerned. Mrs Mijaras had ample and warning to leave the area.

2. At about dinner time, 4th March 1945, Lt. G. Cruz, JO, "K" Company and Platoon Leader, 1st Platoon, was informed by civilians of the presence of a lone Japanese soldier in sitio Locbon, San Francisco. He had mercilessly fired at cvs driving practically every one he saw from his home.

Leading the 1st Squad of the 1st Platoon, they hastened to the place where the Jap was last seen. When they reached the place, the Jap had just left for the thick brushes, 200 yards from the house where he (the Jap) had just slept. Dividing the squad into two groups, they tried to comb the brushes. The Jap got wind of the presence of the soldiers and resorted to a small cleared patch near the thick brushes. He assumed prone position and was prepared to fire. The boys proved quicker on the trigger than the Jap and before he could fire he had already received no less than twenty wounds from his ankle to his head. The rifle he was holding was also badly hit. He had 75 rds of ammunitions when killed.

When approached the dead enemy had three sets of civilian clothes and in a pair of white tennis shoes and a buri hat. He carried a bundle containing "poto" made from cassava, a block of soya paste and tobacco leaves also stolen. He did not have any papers.

2. At about 1 PM of 6th March 1945, Sgt. Baga of the 1st Platoon was informed by a civilian of the presence of two Japs in sitio Baasbaas, 1500 yards East of Barrio Union. Taking ^{2nd} squad along with him Sgt. Baga hastened to the place where the Japs were reported seen.

After a careful reconnoissance of the place where the Japs were believed to be, Sgt. Baga saw them entrenched in a place near the shore. Deploying his men at strategic positions Sgt. Baga opened fire exactly at 3:30 PM. Firing at random continued until 5 PM. There being no fire retaliation, Sgt. Baga and his men rushed up the place and found 2 Japs, stone dead, hit at different parts of their bodies. The enemies had no arms, thin, baggard and apparently weak because of lack of food. They were dressed in their uniforms but all tattered and torn.

2. The morning following the killing of the two Japs at sitio Baasbaas, a patrol was sent out to scour the vicinity for possible appearance of more enemies. The civilians were asked and not one saw one. The patrol went home for dinner. Just when dinner was about finished, we were informed again of the appearance of the enemies at about the same place. Garnering with the least delay the Combat Patrol of the 2nd Platoon, we proceeded to the place where the Japs were reported seen. Simultaneously the Combat Patrol of 1st Platoon, under Lts. J. T. Kangleon and Cruz also arrived, they having been also informed of the presence of the enemies. The place was looked into very carefully and after much efforts, 3 Japs were discovered emplaced behind very thick brushes near the shore while one was inside a cave, from whose appearance the place looked impregnable.

The plan of attack was laid at 2:15 PM and at exactly 2:35 PM firing began. A grenade was thrown into the thick brushes with the hope that the enemies can be forced out a little way of their emplacement. This was followed by BAR, TSMG and carbine firing. The enemies retaliated by firing at us tremendously but with no effect, all, they having not located our positions. 6 grenades were thrown into the impregnable cave. Fortunately, a shrapnel wounded the arm of the Jap making him unfit for firing anymore. Seeing his predicament the Jap jumped into the sea where he was easily killed. The other emplacement when rushed into, showed 3 Japs dead, all mortally wounded.

In their emplacements we found 4 rifles, 112 rds of ans. (cal.25) 3 bayonets, canteens, ammunitions pouches, belts and habersacks. The dead Japs were buried near the place where they were killed.

The morning following the killing of the 4 Japs, we were informed by the civilians that another Jap was found dead, 30 yards from the scene of the encounter. He had also a couple of bullet wounds. This raised the total to 5.

1. On the night of 24 March, 1945, "L" Co., 3rd Bn., 94th Infantry, was assigned to guard the cave of Tangob, where the Japs took refuge. One squad of the 1st Platoon was assigned to watch the mouth of the said cave, with instructions to shoot any moving object that seems suspicious in character from within the cave. The rest of the Company were instructed to take charge of the perimeter defense of the cave.

2. At 2230, one Jap attempted to sneak out from the cave. When the enemy was about to clear out from the cave, by utilizing the branch of a tree near the mouth of the cave, the guards fired with the Tommy, BARS and M-1, thus hitting the enemy. The dead Jap falls to the fire underneath. One Jap Rifle was captured, with 5 ammunitions loaded in the magazine. One more Jap Rifle, which was owned by the VG, that was shot inside the cave, was recovered.



1. At 0700, 2nd Platoon, under Lt. Merka, left bivouac area at Tangob, cave No.1 to pursue the enemies reported to be in the ridges of upper Pagsa, Magdago-ok and Kalayugan. With the support of the Machine Gun, Caliber 50, and with coordinated movements of one Platoon of "I" Company and the 1st Platoon of our Company. Lt. Merka's Platoon rushed up to assault the enemies who were located to be under the nipa-hut with banana grooves in the peak of the ridges.

2. The enemy answered fires in the first assault but was made to silence, until the whole Platoon was able to reach the nipa-hut. One enemy was found dead, and definitely seriously wounded two others were able to escape. The house was burned after some enemy supplies were captured. (See attached encounter report) The two fleeing Japs were pursued but could not be overtaken.







Subject: Report on Investigation

To : The Adjutant General, 92nd Division, PA

1. The Volunteer Guards of Barrios, Gacat, Kilim and Otod, Baybay were already warned last 19 April '45, that if they continue to fire their rifles without reasons of such (presence of the enemies), their rifles will be confiscated and drastic measures will be taken against these persons caught. This was done in compliance to the message No. 107 from the Regimental Commander, 94th Inf., 92nd Div., PA (true copy attached).

2. An incident happened at sitio Candadam, Bo. Gacat, Baybay where a woman (Anastacia Vega) was killed on the morning of 17 April '45 due to wanton firing of Volunteer Guards and owners of rifles. This case however was taken up by the Chief of Police, Baybay. This company cooperated with the town authorities by sending a squad of men with the Chief of Police to confiscate all rifles from Bo. Gacat, Baybay. These rifles are now in the hands of the Chief of Police, Baybay. Attached hereto are papers furnished to this company by the Chief of Police, re-this case.

3. The undersigned patrolled back to the Barrio of Otod, Baybay, upon receipt of the 3rd Indorsement from Hq, 94th Inf. Regt., dated 30 April '45 of a communication from the Adjutant General, 92nd Division, PA, dated 16 April '45. The following are the results of investigation:

(a) Findings:- There were still some firing of rifles though not as intensive as before they were warned. It was found out further that, 60% of the rifles of the section from Bo. Caridad to the town of Baybay has not been registered yet. Some are newly acquired and some were not able to register their guns due to the stopping of registration on the 15th of April '45. The undersigned did not confiscate any unregistered rifle, 'cause had he done so the rest of the rifles not registered would have been kept and hidden from the authorities.

(b) Recommendations:-

(1) That the registration of rifles be continued or extended, to make easier for the authorities to confiscate the rifles in the future.

(2) That a more vigorous campaign be made to have all rifles registered. And if possible to assign some responsible town officials, better still some Army personnel, to go from barrio to barrio to register the arms of the people of their barrios.

(3) That while registration is going on the rifle owners be sent to some ARMY camps where they are given instructions regarding their arms or be made to sign promissary papers not to use their guns other than specific instruction found in their papers.





When the fight was completely over twenty-seven more good Japs were counted dead.

A word or two must be said of the behaviour and conduct of the men. Our men were calm and cool and collected. Their superb conduct and admirable behaviour ~~effective~~ under fire come only from a superior morale inspired by a well-founded confidence in their able commanders and officers, thorough experience in jungle warfare tactics and technique, and admitted superiority of weapons and equipments.

Two days after we arrived at Valencia ~~at Valencia~~ the Battalion was inspected by Maj.Gen. Arnold of the Americal Division. He was impressed by the orderly set-up of the bivouac area though we had only ponchos. About 5 miles from Valencia, we were met by the Assistant Division Commander, Americal Division, who commented and commended the behaviour of the men in the march.

The trophies of the encounter, the sabers, were given to the American officers, one of the recipients being the Division Commander himself. The maps and other documents were turned over to the G-2, Americal Division for analysis and appraisal.

At 6:30 A.M., 5 May '45, Lt. Navarro with 12 E/M of Hq & Hq Co this battalion went to patrol Payao area. Its motive was to check and harass enemy stragglers thereat.

The patrol moved to the area of operations from its established position, with all possible cautiousness. Then at 10:00 A.M., the patrol spotted an isolated house inhabited by the enemy. The enemy, unaware of death creeping close to him, was doing business inside, as evidenced by the rising smoke from the kitchen. The house was situated in an isolated area in which approach without detection from every route seemed impossible, as it was located in the middle of a wide rice paddy, thus affording a wide commanding ground.

For more than 3 minutes, the patrol was halted over a crest, overlooking the house, 2000 yards below. Scouts were sent to our right and left flanks to find routes of approach, that which conceal our movements to the enemy's view, but all came back with no reports. The situation was an open & country to our front. So Lt. Navarro's decision was to creep closer and assault the house, taking use of all possible means of cover and concealment. Sgt. Montaos with 3 men to the right flank. Cpl. Panamutang with the same strength to the left flank, The remaining strength constituted the center point under charged of Cpl. Fuentes.

All, at once, at the given signal, and so sudden for the enemy to make his decision, the boys assaulted delivering a volume of fire which the 3 Japs was unfortunately to evade death. At the summary there were 3 Japs killed and 2 were able to escape.

Found in the Japs position were a wrist watch, Japanese genuine money worth 2500 yen, and a pair of leather shoes. The patrol after burning the house with its 3 Japs occupants proceeded to Libagon to burn another 4 houses which have been occupied by the enemy.





"B" Co. upon reaching the vicinity of Bayansaco and Libas, the leader of the patrol saw through his field glass 12 Japs more or less in his estimation. The head of the patrol ordered his men to deploy and move quietly in the way that the enemy may not know or notice their approach. When they got near the place where the Japs were, they fired at them, killing 7 out of the 12 Japs. After securing the dead Japs, they began the search of the Japs that escaped to the nearby woods and bushes, but found them no more. Just on the vicinity of the encounter after 30 minutes, the "A" Co. encountered enemies killing 2 of them. "C" Co., did not encounter Japs in the area they patrolled.



However, fresh traces of enemy presence were noted. Lots of food supplies were found there. The officer in charge not contented of his unsuccessful mission proceeded to the barrio of Bagakay situated at the foot of Bugabuga mountains. On their way to Bagakay, they saw Japs in groups of two and three, but they were too far from them that they were not able to fire at them. On arriving Bagakay, the advance party saw eight Japs in a nearby house and several others in another. They then started firing and to the great surprise of enemy, they were not able to return the fire at all. They stopped firing for nothing more could be seen. They found six (6) Japs killed and captured the following:

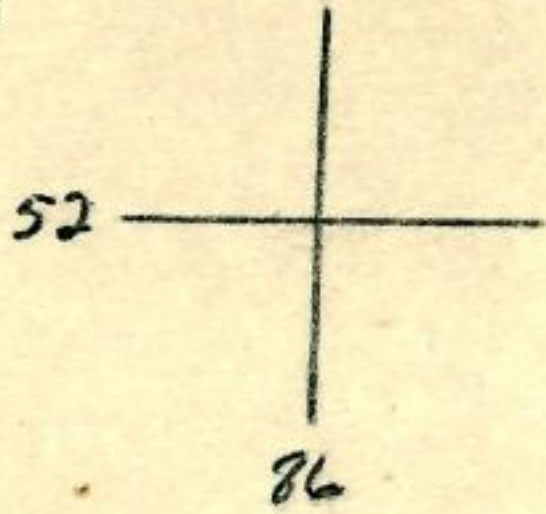

Nine officers and 169 EM, 1st Bn., left the old CP at Jaro at 0800, 13 Feb. 45, following the route from Bo. Daro, Jaro to Valencia, as per orders rec'd. At dusk we camped at Palaspasan, then left said place for Cantilong arriving thereat at 1130 after leaving Palaspasan at 0650.
We camped at Cantilong. At 1130, enemy was observed advancing towards the perimeter on the side of "C" Co. area. "C" Co. opened fire which lasted about an hour. At 0400, enemy was observed again, now advancing in two directions: one towards the area covered by "C" Co. and another towards that of "B" Co. Both companies opened fire on the enemy lasting for over an hour. Eighteen Japs were counted dead on the morning following.
About a kilometer from the place of encounter afore-mentioned, our scouts reported the presence of the enemy 500 yds. away from our main body. Presumably it was an outpost. "A" Co. attacked the outpost. "B" Co. deployed to the right, "C" Co. to the left, mopping-up the area as they advanced. The Jap outpost was located below the hill and along a brook and by the side of the trail leading to Dolores. The enemy was completely taken by surprise that they could hardly return our fire. They managed, however, to fire some three mortar shots and five hand grenades for an answer. The actual fight was over in an hour but mopping up operations lasted about 2 hrs.

Technique: Incision - right pararectal, cutting thru skin, subcutaneous tissue, anterior rectus sheath, (pushing rectus muscle medially), and posterior rectus sheath. Peritoneum was slit open between clamps, and incision enlarged with scissors. The large bowel was located and after a long search, the appendix was found to be located retrocecal and adherent, with fibrinous deposit at the tip. The distal half of the appendix was swollen and the blood vessels were congested. Adhesions were cut between clamps and ligated; the meso-appendix was also clamped and cut and ligated and the appendix delivered to the surface of the abdominal incision. The base was crushed and ligated, a clamp was applied about 1/4 inch above the ligature and the appendix cut below the clamp. Stump was carbolyzed and alcoholized and dropped into the abdominal cavity. No purse string suture was applied and the stump was not invaginated. The abdominal wound was closed in layers.

At a distance of 300 yards from the report area 1 Jap straggler was on foot at the top of the hill. 3 Japs were moving toward a group of 10 safes under shelter.

The soldiers who were occupied position on the top of the hill fired at the distance of 300 yards to prevent the enemy from getting the safes. The top of the enemy were at that same time killed. The rest ran away.

All men went back safe.

There was no V/S. with the patrol to act as guides. At around 7:30 AM, the patrol arrived at Iligay where there were 6 Japs under ~~xxxxx~~ tents. In the vicinity of the said tents were Nips estimated 30 in number. There were fox holes around the bivouac area of the enemy. Lt. Solomon ordered at once the boys to deploy occupying the ridge. The firing was started at same time, and 3 Japs were seen shot to death. Those wounded were unverified.

The fight lasted for two hours. At about 10:30 AM the boys expended almost all of their ammunitions and the order to withdraw was sounded. The boys went back to their bivouac area safely.


On Feb. 9, '45 3rd platoon of this unit since 5 am went on patrol to Salbogoc, Villaba. The platoon of 7 Japs. armed w/ rifles. However upon arrival at the said place the Japs fired first. A group of Jap stragglers were seen by the boys cooking meals beside a big house which was found burning. After the Japs opened fire at the friendly troops the enemy ran to the nearby talahite w/ their beddings, and cooking equipments. A hurried mopping up operation was immediately made by the patrol and 3 Japs w/ 1 saber was shot to death. One enemy was wearing American uniform. After this encounter the patrol bounded back to the bivouac area. At about 2500 yards from the scene of shooting one big house was observed to be occupied by the enemy of 15 to 20 in number, practically weaponless. The patrol marched in approach formation to the suspected house and at the distance of 300 yards from the house occupied by the enemy the boys began firing. Five were seen jump out of the house. After 20 minutes firing, cease firing was ordered by Sgt. Roselló and advised the men not to advance for the last traces of enemy were on the top of a hill. The boys went home and off. at bivouac area at about 7:30 PM. all safe.



NARRATIVE REPORT

On May 15 '45, a patrol of one platoon led by Lt. Baltazar Macas was sent out to Bo. Rizal for reconnaissance and combat. The patrol left the bivouac area at 0700 and arrived at Tambis 10:00. Upon reaching Tambis the men were in advance guard formation. Little by little we advanced occupying the hills as Volunteer Guards were acting as guides. At a distance of 400 yards we changed our formation into deployed skirmish position. At a distance of 200 yards from the enemy position, the left flank was open fired at by enemy Machine Rifle. We held the ground and took advantage of the natural cover. The men were ordered to observe enemy location. After almost 30 minutes waiting, two Nips were fired at and were clearly seen killed by our fire. An hour later, Pvt. B. Garbo, with his BAR at the center of our formation, fired at three (3) Nips who were verified as immediately killed to the ground. The wounded were unverified.

At 12:00 AM our VG guide was hit by enemy fire on his left check passing thru the rear of the neck. We rendered first aid to the patient and withdrew.

On May 14, 1945, 3rd platoon of this unit went on patrol to Caduhaan, Palenpon where a number of Japs have been observed by this unit during its previous patrol. Upon arrival thereat, the Japs were found in the same vicinity scattered in four groups. Each group was in one house preparing their meals. Our reconnaissance patrol was divided into three (3) groups ready for the attack. One group of the enemy which acted as outpost on the top of a hill was first fired by one group of the patrol, then followed by the boys assigned to attack the rest of the enemy groups. At around 3:00 PM we found 32 dead bodies of Japs E/M scattered on the ground. 2 dead bodies of enemy officers were found in the nearby forest.

The patrol went home safely in the afternoon to Co. Timabilan, Palenpon, Leyte.

At 8:30 AM, Monday, 16 April '45, the second platoon of "B" Co., one platoon of "A" Co., and "D" Co. of the 1st Bn., 96th Infantry, coordinated to attack enemy position at Campokpok, San Isidro. The second platoon of this unit led by Lt. R. Salomon was designated to attack the left flank. The "D" Co. was at the center, and one platoon of "A" Co. was assigned to attack the right flank to make a three point attack. The firing began from the "D" Co. Then, I commanded my boys to fire the opposite ridge direct to our front. After five minutes of firing enemy fire stopped. So, we harassed the second ridge. We found out that the Japs did not occupy their foxholes, and they were behind the last ridge overlooking Campokpok. As we advanced to the last ridge we made a volley fire to all bushes on the slopes. The Japs answered our firing, but the first squad under Pvt. S. Lauss was able to check up 4 Japs hiding under the bushes. As the second squad advanced to the houses, they noticed that there were Japs inside. So, we rushed into the houses and found out two Japs killed. We awaited at the edge of the valley observing the advance of the American Troops.

NARRATIVE REPORT

At 8:30 PM on April 11, 1945, Lt. R. Salomon led the second platoon on patrol to Cagnocot valley. Upon reaching the hill of Cagnocot the patrol sighted a group of Japs cooking their food under the bushes. Lt. Salomon divided immediately the boys into two groups. The first group was under Lt. Salomon and the 2nd group was under Pvt. Pascual Aling. The second group on the left flank advanced to encircle the enemy. The enemy, upon knowing that they have no more way of escape, first fired at us. Then the order to commence firing was given. After fifteen minutes firing, we advanced to gain ground. The second group advanced and harrassed for "Recco".

The encounter resulted to the death of 1 officer and 14 s/m of the enemy. Five Japs were able to escape.

Lt. B. Macas with 50 EM patrolled with the objective to retake the position abandoned by Lt. Tracura, the last ridge overlooking Campokpok. The men were divided into three groups. The group leaders were given mission to attack & occupy. Sgt. Bonita, I. was to attack and occupy the ridge overlooking Cabahug's house. Sgt. E. Rondina's group was to attack and occupy the valley. Lt. Macas' group was to attack and occupy the two ridges formerly occupied by Lt. Tracura. The groups moved out at zero hour. Lt. B. Macas' group succeeded in occupying the first ridge. Then an order to advance by infiltration to the last ridge was given. The last ridge was reoccupied where 6 Nips in foxholes were killed. Sgt. Bonita's group killed 5 Nips. Pvt. L. Danieles advanced deeply at the extreme left stepping the foxholes of 6 Nips. Pvt. L. Danieles was fired on the head causing his death. In the slope of the extreme left the Japs determined to advance. All men were short of ammunition. In spite of our best effort to stop the Nips the enemy advanced. All of us were pins to the ground and shortage of ammunition failed us to get the dead body of Pvt. L. Danieles including his TSMG Ser. No. 56147.

NARRATIVE REPORT

On April 1, 1945, B Co. less third platoon led by the undersigned patrolled to Bo. Cagnocot, Villaba. The patrol left station at 0500 and arrived Cagnocot at 0900. On top of the ridge approximately 200 yards from our observation post, overlooking Cagnocot valley, enemy was spotted 30 in number. On the right ridge of the valley spotted 7 Nips going downward. Other Nips occupied the houses. After observing enemy position and movements Lt. B. Macas made the plan of action. The men were divided into three groups. Pvt. Labarda attacked and occupied enemy position of the left ridge of the valley. Sgt. Bonita attacked and occupied enemy position on the right flank of the valley. Lt. B. Macas attacked and occupied the valley. After giving the detail orders to group leaders, we started the operation. The operation lasted for three hours and occupied the barrio of Cagnocot. 2 Nip officers were killed w/45 EM, and 2 sabers, 12 Nips' rifles, & clothing equipments were captured.

However, the encounter resulted to 1 casualty on our side plus 2 garbines ser. Nos. 2980216 & 2104479 damaged. Pvt. Bermijo was hit on his abdomen and on his right arm.

NARRATIVE REPORT

First platoon of this outfit stationed at Guindoahan, Leyte on March 21 '45 was on combat patrol to cover the area of responsibility from Guindoahan, Cahigan, and Calbugos. From Guindoahan at 0050 the patrol started, led by Lt. B. Macas to a distance of 12 miles. Arrived at Calbugos, Villaba 1130. On the top of the ridge 1 Nip was sighted crossing the general line of our approach. Lt. B. Macas had planned to push forward to the enemy by following the ridge. The first Nip sighted then was left alone in our left flank. The men were ordered to advance at a distance of 400 yds. of the first observed position. The men took advantage of the concealment of the cogon grass and talahibs. Lt. Macas was with the scouts. Pvt. Lucica reported that at a distance of 200 yds on the right flank a Nip was sighted going inside of the house. The advance guards reported the presence of Nips under the house and under abaca plants on the slope of the hill. Everybody waited for the order to fire. When firing started from the left flank all guns sounded until after 30 minutes when there was silence. The men were asking to advance to verify the dead Japs. Four of the men went up to the house and found 1 Nip dead with two sacks of corn. Eight dead Nips were under the building. Under the abaca plantation, 17 Nips were found dead. On the opposite side of the slope were 2 dead Japs. Two of the three EM who went to the house were hit by enemy machine rifle resulting to two wounded soldiers on our side. Our wounded were taken to the rear of our position while firing at suspected places continued until shortage of ammunition forced us to withdraw.

On March 22, 1945, the 2nd platoon of this command patrolled to Tagnocot, Villaba under the leadership of Actg. platoon sergeant P. Labarda.

Upon almost reaching the said place, the platoon splitted into three groups to establish three points of attack. Knowing that all houses, bushes, and hills were occupied, each group was designated its

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particular area to locate enemy positions with the idea to drive the enemy to the center of the whole platoon. However, enemy concentration was located after few minutes of continuous search. At about 15 yards from the enemy firing started. The Japs were found unaware of the friendly troops' approach. Some of the Nips jumped out of the windows for protection, but most met their death.

The platoon leader shouted for everybody to "Recopo" and half of the group rushed to the target area where 18 ~~E/M~~ and two (2) officers were found dead. The other half of our side stood as guards. The encounter lasted for four hours.

NARRATIVE REPORT

The 2nd platoon left station (Garagara) at 1:30 PM for a patrol to Tagnocot, Villaba. Upon reaching the place, we sighted Japs cooking dinner approximately fifteen (15) in number in our right flank and another in our left flank - a group of almost the same number was also cooking under thick bushes. I divided the platoon into two groups: one group was ordered to attack those of the right flank and the other group under me was to harass the camouflaged Japs in the left flank. Being interested to kill all the Japs, I held one BAR and ordered to commence firing. The enemy answered, but after few minutes enemy fire ceased. I shouted them to surrender and the civilians who were prisoners of the enemy answered, "We are civilians." There were

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six (6) of the enemy reported dead and the civilians who escaped were taken to the station.

The other squad under Platoon leader F. Labarda succeeded in burning the house occupied by the enemy. The whole patrol was not able to advance for the loot due to shortage of ammunition.

In the early morning of 9 March '45, a VC of Wague, Leyte, Leyte, reported the presence of Jap stragglers in the forest of the said place. At once, Lt. A. Solomon ordered, to proceed to the reported area, the 1st and 2nd platoons of this outfit. The platoons were splitted into three points of attack and proceeded in approach formation. The occupied area was quite near to the bivouac area of this unit. After 15 minutes, the men on the left flank saw the Japs in the forest and they ordered to surrender. However, two of the Japs tried to resist and 5 fled. The two Japs that resisted were instantly killed. Three of the 5 Japs were found after few minutes of continuous search in the forest. one of them can speak Visayan Cebuano. Lt. A. Solomon ordered him to call on the two. The Jap hollered at the companions still hiding for quite awhile. About 15 minutes later, they came out one by one with raised hands.

NARRATIVE REPORT

In the early morning of 9 March '45, a VC of Wague, Leyte, Leyte, reported the presence of Jap stragglers in the forest of the said place. At once, Lt. R. Solomon ordered, to proceed to the reported area, the 1st and 2nd platoons of this outfit. The platoons were splitted into three points of attack and proceeded in approach formation. The occupied area was quite near to the bivouac area of this unit. After 15 minutes, the men on the left flank saw the japs in the forest and they ordered to surrender. However, two of the japs tried to resist and 5 fled. The two japs that resisted were instantly killed. Three of the 5 japs were found after few minutes of continuous search in the forest, one of them can speak Visayan Cebuano. Lt. R. Solomon ordered him to call on the two. The Jap hollered at the companions still hiding for quite awhile. About 15 minutes later, they came out one by one with raised hands.

In the early morning of Friday, Feb. 9, '45, Lt. Solomon received an information of Japs stragglers with a bunch of bananas resting on a trail within the distance of 65 yards from our bivouac area. Lt. Solomon ordered at once Sq. Ldr. Pvt. Labarda w/1 man to snipe the Japs. Pvt. Labarda followed up the trail that leads to a deep bush. On the trail there were footprints of the enemy. Pvt. Labarda immediately sent a messenger to Lt. Solomon informing him of the suspected area. Lt. Solomon ordered all his men to follow up to where Pvt. Labarda was. The boys at once started firing at the thick bushes. Five Japs came out of enemy stragglers. The 7 stragglers were killed by heavy cut fire and all were shot to death. The wounded were unverified. Two grenades were thrown to the bushes suspected as occupied by enemy.





NARRATIVE REPORT

A patrol of 20 EM of this unit arrived at Bo. Lonoy, Ormoc, Leyte at 01100. Just after dinner the patrol was informed of Jap stragglers within the distance of only 1 kilometer from the provincial road. However, the Americans who informed the said patrol were too curious to find out how Filipino soldiers fight. Patrol leader, Pvt. P. Labarda, ordered his men to proceed to the reported area in approach formation. Every soldier's eyes kept on watching. At about 2:00 PM the patrol discovered the occupied spot where 17 Jap stragglers were seen under shelter. Some were digging up camote roots and others were sleeping. Hurrily, the boys followed the order to occupy positions on the top of a hill facing the enemy below. When the order to fire was shouted all guns fired at same time and 13 Japs were counted dead. However, the fight lasted for about more than an hour and at about 3:00 PM VCs. reported of 1 Jap officer dead.



NARRATIVE REPORT $\frac{1}{2}$

In the early morning of January 9, 1945, VGS. reported at Botason the presence of Japs strugglers at Maranglog, Villa-ba, Leyte. Lt. B. Macas W/3rd platoon of this outfit, decided to patrol the said place. At about 10:30 enemy position at Maranglog was located.

The platoon splitted into squads to establish 3 point attack. Pvts. P. Jayme & F. Espinoza sniped to verify the enemy number. However, Pvt. Espinoza & Pvt. Jayme were first seen by 1 Japanese struggler on the top of the hill. The said enemy threw fresh camotes and cartridges at Pvt. Espinoza who was hit on the breast. Pvt. Espinoza shouted his squad leader, Pvt. Labarda, to advance, & He at once withdraw few paces to disassemble his rifle as it did not fire. All squads advanced to the top of the hill with great volume of fire. The whole platoon advanced W/Lt. B. Macas who led the attack.

The enemy was estimated to be 50 in number of which were reported by the VGS as killed. The wounded were not verified. The fight ended at about 12:00 AM
